

House Amendments to Senate Bill No. 2926

TO THE SECRETARY OF THE SENATE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE HOUSE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

7 **SECTION 1.** The following sums of money, or so much thereof
8 as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated out of any money in
9 the State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the Board of
10 Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning for the purpose
11 of support of the Mississippi State Chemical Laboratory, Water
12 Resources Institute, Mississippi Law Research Institute, Jackson
13 State University Urban Research Center, Mississippi Mineral
14 Resources Research Institute, Research Institute of Pharmaceutical
15 Sciences, the Supercomputer, the Stennis Institute of Government,
16 Gulf Coast Research Laboratory, Polymer Institute, Small Business
17 Development Center, Stennis Center for Higher Learning, the
18 Commission for Volunteer Services, the State Court Education
19 Program, and the executive office of the board of trustees for the
20 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020, and ending June 30, 2021.....

22 **SECTION 2.** The following sums of money, or so much thereof
23 as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated out of the proceeds

24 from any federal, student fees or other special source funds not
25 otherwise appropriated, to the Board of Trustees of State
26 Institutions of Higher Learning for the purpose of support of
27 Mississippi State Chemical Laboratory, Water Resources Institute,
28 Mississippi Alcohol Safety Education Program, Stennis Institute of
29 Government, Mississippi Law Research Institute, Mississippi Small
30 Business Development Center, Mississippi Mineral Resources
31 Research Institute, Research Institute of Pharmaceutical Sciences,
32 the Supercomputer, Stennis Space Center's Center for Higher
33 Learning, Gulf Coast Research Laboratory, Polymer Institute,
34 Jackson State University Urban Research Center, the Commission for
35 Volunteer Services, and the executive office of the board of
36 trustees for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020, and ending
37 June 30, 2021.....\$ 45,368,767.00.

38 **SECTION 3.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
39 Sections 1 and 2 hereof, the following amounts, or so much thereof
40 as may be necessary, shall be expended by the Board of Trustees of
41 State Institutions of Higher Learning for the purposes hereinafter

99 Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of Section 1

100 and allocated to the Gulf Coast Research Laboratory, the Board of

101 Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning shall allocate

102 One Hundred Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$175,000.00) for Sea
103 Grants matching for the Fiscal Year 2021.

104 Provided further, it is the intention of the Legislature, in
105 the event budget reductions are imposed on the Gulf Coast Research
106 Laboratory by the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of
107 Higher Learning, as a result of the Governor ordering budget
108 reductions under the provisions of Section 27-104-13 or 31-17-123,
109 Mississippi Code of 1972, the same percent reduction will be
110 applied to those state funds identified in this section for Sea
111 Grant match.

112 It is the intent of the Legislature that no general funds
113 authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal
114 funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries
115 authorized under the provisions of this act and which are
116 withdrawn and no longer available.

117 After the Mississippi State Chemical Laboratory has provided
118 the maximum amount of services which may be provided free of
119 charge under the provisions of Section 57-21-11(c), Mississippi
120 Code of 1972, the laboratory shall not provide any additional
121 services from the funds appropriated under the provisions of
122 Sections 1 and 2 if any charges for such services previously
123 provided are more than ninety (90) days past due. After all such
124 delinquent charges have been paid by a client, the laboratory may
125 provide additional services to the client.

126 **SECTION 4.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 2 and
127 authorized for expenditure in Section 3(b), the following amounts

128 shall be derived from Education Enhancement Funds deposited
129 pursuant to Sections 27-65-75 and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of
130 1972:

137 **SECTION 5.** None of the funds appropriated by this act shall
138 be expended for any purpose that is not actually required or
139 necessary for performing any of the powers or duties of the Board
140 of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning, or any of
141 the powers or duties of any institution under the jurisdiction of
142 the board of trustees, that are authorized by the Mississippi
143 Constitution of 1890, state or federal law, or rules or
144 regulations that implement state or federal law.

145 **SECTION 6.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
146 budget requests of the individual institutes, laboratories and
147 programs consolidated in this bill for Fiscal Year 2022 shall be
148 submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format
149 and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail
150 provided during the Fiscal Year 2021 budget request process.

151 **SECTION 7.** The Board of Trustees of State Institutions of
152 Higher Learning shall report yearly to the Legislature any

153 institution not in compliance with Section 97-11-51, Mississippi
154 Code of 1972, which prohibits deficit spending.

155 **SECTION 8.** Any funds appropriated pursuant to this act and
156 paid as a fee to or deposited in a financial institution shall be
157 in compliance with Section 109 of the Constitution of the State of
158 Mississippi and Section 25-4-105, Mississippi Code of 1972.

159 **SECTION 9.** It is the intention of the Legislature that
160 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
161 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
162 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
163 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
164 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
165 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
166 made without competitive bids.

167 **SECTION 10.** None of the funds appropriated and/or authorized
168 for expenditure under this act shall be used for research in which
169 a human embryo is killed or destroyed.

170 **SECTION 11.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
171 funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with
172 Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency
173 shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their
174 appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally
175 or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for
176 actions contrary to this provision.

177 **SECTION 12.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
178 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the

179 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
180 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
181 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
182 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.

183 **SECTION 13.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
184 and after July 1, 2020, and shall stand repealed from and after
185 June 30, 2020.
