House Amendments to Senate Bill No. 2938

TO THE SECRETARY OF THE SENATE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE HOUSE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

7	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be		
8	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any funds in the State		
9	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of

11	Agency in accordance with the provisions of Section 33-15-1 et

14	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be		
15	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the special		
16	fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi		
17	Emergency Management Agency which is comprised of special source		
18	funds collected by or otherwise available to the agency, for the		
19	support and maintenance of the agency for the fiscal year		
20	beginning July 1, 2020, and ending June 30, 2021

22	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2,		
23	the following positions are authorized:

29 With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's 30 responsibility to make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2022 do not 31 32 exceed Fiscal Year 2021 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 33 34 2021 budget by the Mississippi Legislature. Based on data 35 provided by the Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel 36 Board shall determine and publish the projected annual cost to 37 fully fund all appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this act. It shall be the responsibility of the 38 39 agency head to ensure that no single personnel action increases 40 this projected annual cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2021 appropriations for "Personal Services" when annualized, with the 41 42 exception of escalated funds and the award of benchmarks. If, at 43 the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal 44 Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency 45 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2021 "Personal Services" 46 47 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which 48 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation

49 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until 50 such time as the requirements of this provision are met.

51 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 52 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or 53 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 54 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. 55 The 56 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 57 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 58 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 59 appropriated level.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.

68 SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 69 Director of the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency may, upon 70 the request of a local public emergency management organization in 71 an area which has suffered a natural disaster, supply equipment to 72 rural water associations to enable their continued operation when 73 the local emergency management organization determines that such

74 private entities provide services essential to the welfare of the 75 community.

76 SECTION 5. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 77 Director of the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency shall 78 provide enhanced training to local governments, supervisors, 79 mayors, civil defense groups and municipal associations in 80 disaster management.

SECTION 6. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 81 82 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 83 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the Mississippi 84 Emergency Management Agency for the purpose of defraying certain 85 administrative expenses and the state share of the cost of 86 disaster assistance programs, including, but not being limited to, 87 public assistance programs, individual and family grant programs, and mitigation programs, for the fiscal year beginning 88 July 1, 2020, and ending June 30, 2021.....\$ 585,056.00. 89

90 SECTION 7. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 91 92 Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi Emergency Management 93 Agency Fund Nos. 3725, 3728, 372U, 3729, 37AH, and 58202 for the 94 purpose of defraying certain administrative expenses and the state 95 and federal share of the cost of disaster assistance programs, including, but not being limited to, public assistance programs, 96 97 individual and family grant programs, and mitigation programs, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020, and ending 98 99 June 30, 2021.....\$ 469,411,616.00.

100 SECTION 8. SECTION 9. None of the funds appropriated in Section 6 shall be used to establish a special reserve fund in the State Treasury for disaster relief except as provided for in Section 33-15-307, Mississippi Code of 1972.

139 SECTION 10. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 140 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2022 shall be submitted to 141 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of 142 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided 143 during the Fiscal Year 2021 budget request process.

SECTION 11. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted performance measures provided below:

173	SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that the			
174	Executive Director of the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency			
175	shall have authority to transfer not more than Five Hundred			
176	Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) from any general or special fund			
177	treasury fund and major object budget category to another special

178 or general fund treasury fund and major object budget category 179 accordingly under the control of the Mississippi Emergency 180 Management Agency. The purpose of this authority is to more 181 efficiently use available cash reserves. It is further the 182 intention of the Legislature that the Executive Director of the 183 Mississippi Emergency Management Agency shall submit written 184 justification for the transfer to the Legislative Budget Office 185 and the Department of Finance and Administration on or before the 186 fifteenth of the month prior to the effective date of the 187 transfer.

188 SECTION 13. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 189 Mississippi Emergency Management Agency shall submit a 190 notification and summary of all state support funding on all 191 disasters that require general funds or state support special 192 funds to the Legislative Budget Office.

193 SECTION 14. It is the intention of the Legislature that from 194 any funds appropriated in this act, the agency shall maintain a 195 minimum of nine (9) Area Coordinators to provide daily assistance 196 to local jurisdictions with emergency management activities as 197 well as to provide quicker response to incidents and/or disasters. 198 In addition, it is the intent of the Legislature that these Area 199 Coordinators shall reside in or within fifty (50) miles of their 200 assigned districts.

201 SECTION 15. It is the intention of the Legislature that 202 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the 203 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things

stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are made without competitive bids.

SECTION 16. The expenditure of the funds appropriated by this act shall be under the direction of the Governor and shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law.

216 SECTION 17. This act shall take effect and be in force from 217 and after July 1, 2020, and shall stand repealed from and after 218 June 30, 2020.
