House Amendments to Senate Bill No. 2977

TO THE SECRETARY OF THE SENATE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE HOUSE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

4	SECTION 1. The following sum of money, or so much thereof as
5	may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the
6	State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to defray the
7	expenses of the Mississippi Development Authority for the fiscal
8	year beginning July 1, 2020, and ending June 30, 2021
9	\$ 21,164,891.00.
10	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
11	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
12	Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi Development Authority or
13	the appropriate special fund for the purpose of defraying the
14	expenses incurred in the operation of the various divisions of the
15	authority for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020, and ending
16	June 30, 2021\$ 82,068,709.00.
17	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
18	this act, the following positions are authorized:

24	With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
25	responsibility to make certain that funds required to be
26	appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2022 do not
27	exceed Fiscal Year 2021 funds appropriated for that purpose,
28	unless programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year
29	2021 budget by the Mississippi Legislature. Based on data
30	provided by the Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel
31	Board shall determine and publish the projected annual cost to
32	fully fund all appropriated positions in compliance with the
33	provisions of this act. It shall be the responsibility of the
34	agency head to ensure that no single personnel action increases
35	this projected annual cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2021
36	appropriations for "Personal Services" when annualized, with the
37	exception of escalated funds and the award of benchmarks. If, at
38	the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal
39	Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency
40	has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this
41	projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2021 "Personal Services"
42	appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which
43	reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation
44	requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until
45	such time as the requirements of this provision are met.

46	Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with			
47	the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or			
48	allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State			
49	Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written			
50	approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The			
51	Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written			
52	approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions			
53	without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the			
54	appropriated level.			
55	No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be			
56	used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are			
57	being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this			
58	act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.			
59	None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in			
60	violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating			
61	to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as			
62	interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.			
63	SECTION 4. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance			
64	Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of			
65	the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized			
66	in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the

Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, the amount of Eight Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$800,000.00) shall be 115 116 provided from the Mississippi Department of Transportation to 117 defray the expenses of the Mississippi Development Authority in 118 operating the state welcome centers. 119 SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 120 Mississippi Development Authority shall maintain complete 121 accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all 122 funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be

in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal

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124 Year 2020. It is further the intention of the Legislature that 125 the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2022 shall be 126 submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format 127 and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail 128 provided during the Fiscal Year 2021 budget request process. 129 SECTION 7. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2, 130 the amount of Four Million Eight Hundred Seventy-six Thousand Two 131 Hundred Ninety-eight Dollars (\$4,876,298.00), or so much thereof 132 as may be necessary, is provided for the purpose of supporting 133 Mississippi Tourism Advertising and Promotion for Fiscal Year 134 2021, and shall not be expended for any type of cultural exchange 135 program. Of the funds appropriated herein and allocated within 136 this section, Two Hundred Ninety-nine Thousand Dollars 137 (\$299,000.00) is provided for Tourism Grant Development Awards. 138 SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that none 139 of the funds appropriated above shall be expended unless members 140 of the Mississippi House of Representatives and Mississippi Senate are notified at least five (5) days prior to a public ceremony 141 142 announcing the award of any grant in their district or any public 143 announcement or ceremony regarding the groundbreaking or opening 144 of a facility, roadway or bridge for which the Legislature has 145 made funds available. Any signage regarding any public event or 146 any new facility, roadway or bridge shall include the following

language: "Funds were made available for this project by the

Mississippi State Legislature."

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- 149 **SECTION 9.** It is the intention of the Legislature that
- 150 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
- 151 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
- 152 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
- 153 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
- 154 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
- 155 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
- 156 made without competitive bids.
- 157 **SECTION 10.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, One
- 158 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) is provided for the
- 159 Mississippi Delta National Heritage Areas.
- SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 161 Mississippi Development Authority shall submit a notification of
- 162 any General Fund Transfers out of the major category Subsidies
- 163 into any other major categories to the Legislative Budget Office.
- SECTION 12. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, Twenty
- 165 Thousand Twenty-five Dollars (\$20,025.00) shall be provided for
- 166 the support of the Mississippi River Parkway Commission.
- SECTION 13. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, Five
- 168 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) shall be transferred to
- 169 Innovate Mississippi.
- 170 **SECTION 14.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1,
- 171 Eighty-three Thousand Three Hundred Thirty-three Dollars
- 172 (\$83,333.00) is provided for the Energy High School Academy,
- 173 established by Senate Bill 2928, 2019 Regular Session.

SECTION 15. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
Mississippi Development Authority may provide operational support
to any park operated by the United States National Park Service in
Mississippi during the event of a government shutdown that
materially affects the operations of such park.

SECTION 16. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.

SECTION 17. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2020, and shall stand repealed from and after June 30, 2020.
