## Adopted COMMITTEE AMENDMENT NO 1 PROPOSED TO

## Senate Bill No. 2978

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

- 5 **SECTION 1.** The following sum of money, or so much thereof as

17	SECTION 2. The following sum of money, or so much thereof as
18	may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of the proceeds from
19	any federal, student fees or other special source funds not
20	otherwise appropriated, to the Board of Trustees of State
21	Institutions of Higher Learning for the purpose of support of
22	education and general operations of Alcorn State University, Delta
23	State University, Jackson State University, Mississippi State
24	University, Mississippi University for Women, Mississippi Valley
25	State University, University of Mississippi, and University of
26	Southern Mississippi, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020,
27	and ending June 30, 2021\$ 943,438,557.00.
28	SECTION 3. The following sums, or so much thereof as may be
29	necessary, are hereby appropriated out of any money in the Ayers
30	Endowment Interest Fund, State Treasury Fund No. 3325800000, for
31	the purposes as set out by the courts in the Ayers Case for the
32	fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020, and ending June 30, 2021:
33	Alcorn State University\$ 254,700.00
34	Jackson State University\$ 390,600.00
35	Mississippi Valley State University\$ 254,700.00
36	SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
37	Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning shall
38	allocate funds to the off-campus centers based on a minimum rate
39	of sixty-five percent (65%) of the on-campus cost of a full-time

- 40 equivalent student. The on-campus distribution is to be
- 41 determined without regard to the costs incurred by any one or more
- 42 of them in the operation of off-campus degree-completing centers'
- 43 classes. Off-campus centers which are operated jointly by two (2)
- 44 or more institutions, the amount allocated to such centers shall
- 45 be prorated among the institutions jointly operating such centers
- 46 based on the full-time equivalent enrollment of such centers.
- The board of trustees shall insure that the off-campus
- 48 centers are not charged with any indirect or overhead cost
- 49 prorated from any on-campus activity. It is the intention of the
- 50 Legislature that the on-campus operations charge the off-campus
- 51 centers with only actual direct charges.
- 52 **SECTION 5.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this
- 53 act, the amount of One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars
- 54 (\$150,000.00) shall be used for the promotion and expenses of the
- 55 Mississippi Governor's School for the Gifted and Talented.
- 56 Provided, however, that the Board of Trustees of State

- 58 for faculty, course content and facilities selection on a
- 59 competitive basis from all Mississippi senior colleges and
- 60 universities. The Mississippi Governor's School for the Gifted
- 61 and Talented shall accept not less than one (1) high school
- 62 student nominee from each accredited high school in Mississippi.
- 63 The nominees, selected under criteria developed and adopted by the

238	the agency shall be required to provide meters to be in compliance

240	include single-family and multifamily residences but shall not
241	include any dormitory residences. Allowances for such utilities
242	shall be prohibited.
243	SECTION 29. Of the funds provided herein to the Board of

249	SECTION 30. Of the funds provided herein to the Board of

251	amount, or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be allocated
252	to fund the Washington Center for Internships and Academic
253	Seminars Mississippi Initiative Scholarship Program
254	\$ 75,000.00.
255	This program will provide opportunities for Mississippi's
256	university and college students to gain real-life experience
257	working in Washington, D.C. The funding will provide scholarships
258	at Alcorn State University, Delta State University, Jackson State
259	University, Mississippi State University, Mississippi University
260	for Women, Mississippi Valley State University, the University of

- 262 written report shall be submitted listing the scholarship

- 265 **SECTION 31.** None of the funds appropriated and/or authorized
- 266 for expenditure under this act shall be used for research in which
- 267 a human embryo is killed or destroyed.
- 268 **SECTION 32.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
- 269 of Section 1 of this act, an amount not more than One Hundred
- 270 Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$125,000.00) shall be allocated to
- 271 implement university system efficiencies, including, but not
- 272 limited to, academic, space, energy and any other system projects
- 273 or expenditures that would lead to improved efficiency. Such
- 274 funds may also be used to draw down other funds or as matching
- 275 funds.
- 276 **SECTION 33.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
- 277 of Section 1 of this act, Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00)
- 278 shall be used to defray the expenses of the Children's Center for
- 279 Communication and Development at the University of Southern
- 280 Mississippi.
- 281 **SECTION 34.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this
- 282 act, the amount of Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars
- 283 (\$250,000.00) is provided for defraying the expenses of the DuBard
- 284 School.

294	Research and Development opportunities in Science and Technology
295	initiatives.
296	SECTION 37. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this
297	act, Two Hundred Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$225,000.00) is
298	provided for the Delta State University Delta Music Institute.
299	SECTION 38. It is the intention of the Legislature that
300	Mississippi Valley State University is authorized to provide water
301	or sewer service to any existing, privately-owned structures that
302	presently take water or sewer service from Mississippi Valley
303	State University. Furthermore, Mississippi Valley State
304	University is authorized to charge a flat or metered rate for the
305	service provided. Mississippi Valley State University shall not
306	provide any water or sewer service to any new, privately-owned
307	structures.
308	SECTION 39. Of the funds herein appropriated, Seven Hundred



Thirty-Seven Thousand Dollars (\$737,000.00) shall be provided to

- 311 Thirty-seven Thousand Dollars (\$237,000.00) shall be provided in

- 315 **SECTION 40.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 316 funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with
- 317 Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency
- 318 shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their
- 319 appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally
- 320 or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for
- 321 actions contrary to this provision.
- 322 **SECTION 41.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
- 323 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
- 324 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
- 325 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
- 326 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
- 327 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
- 328 **SECTION 42.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 329 and after July 1, 2020, and shall stand repealed from and after
- 330 June 30, 2020.
