Senate Amendments to House Bill No. 1701

TO THE CLERK OF THE HOUSE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE SENATE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State General
7	Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and maintenance
8	of the Mississippi Library Commission and for carrying out the
9	provisions of Section 39-3-107, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the
LO	fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020, and ending June 30, 2021

L2	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
L3	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the special fund in
L 4	the State Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi Library
L 5	Commission which is comprised of special source funds collected by
L 6	or otherwise available to the commission, for the purpose of
L 7	defraying the expenses of the commission for the fiscal year
L 8	beginning July 1, 2020, and ending June 30, 2021
L 9	\$ 2,796,092.00.
20	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
21	this act, the following positions are authorized:

22 AUTHORIZED POSITIONS: 23 Full Time..... 47 Permanent: 24 Part Time..... 0 25 Time-Limited: Full Time..... 26 Part Time..... 27 With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds required to be 28 appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2022 do not 29 30 exceed Fiscal Year 2021 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 31 32 2021 budget by the Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel 33 34 Board shall determine and publish the projected annual cost to 35 fully fund all appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this act. It shall be the responsibility of the 36 37 agency head to ensure that no single personnel action increases 38 this projected annual cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2021 appropriations for "Personal Services" when annualized, with the 39 40 exception of escalated funds and the award of benchmarks. 41 the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal 42 Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency 43 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2021 "Personal Services" 44 45 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation 46

- 47 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until
- 48 such time as the requirements of this provision are met.
- Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 50 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or
- 51 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
- 52 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
- 53 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
- 54 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
- 55 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
- 56 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
- 57 appropriated level.
- No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 59 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
- 60 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
- 61 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
- 63 violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating
- 64 to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
- 65 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
- Funds to be distributed to eligible public library systems
- 67 under the Personnel Incentive Grants Program shall be paid
- 68 quarterly in advance on or before September 30, December 31, March
- 69 31 and June 30.
- 70 **SECTION 4.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 71 Mississippi Library Commission shall maintain complete accounting
- 72 and personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds

73	appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the
74	same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year
75	2020. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the
76	agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2022 shall be submitted to
77	the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of
78	detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided
79	during the Fiscal Year 2021 budget request process.
80	SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
81	Section 2, Four Hundred Ninety-three Thousand Eight Hundred
82	Forty-seven Dollars (\$493,847.00) shall be derived from the
83	Education Enhancement Fund deposited pursuant to Sections 27-65-75
84	and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972.
85	SECTION 6. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
86	Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
87	the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
88	in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
89	intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,
90	this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted
91	performance measures provided below:

- 127 **SECTION 9.** It is the intention of the Legislature that
- 128 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
- 129 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
- 130 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
- 131 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
- 132 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
- 133 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
- 134 made without competitive bids.
- 135 **SECTION 10.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 136 funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with
- 137 Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency
- 138 shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their
- 139 appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally
- 140 or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for
- 141 actions contrary to this provision.
- 142 **SECTION 11.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
- 143 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
- 144 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
- 145 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
- 146 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
- 147 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
- 148 **SECTION 12.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 149 and after July 1, 2020, and shall stand repealed June 30, 2020.
