Senate Amendments to House Bill No. 1716

TO THE CLERK OF THE HOUSE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE SENATE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State General
7	Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and maintenance
8	of the State Forestry Commission for the fiscal year beginning
9	July 1, 2020, and ending June 30, 2021
10	\$ 13,545,519.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the special fund in
13	the State Treasury to the credit of the State Forestry Commission
14	which is comprised of special source funds collected by or
15	otherwise available to the commission, for the support and
16	maintenance of the commission for the fiscal year beginning
17	July 1, 2020, and ending June 30, 2021
18	\$ 12,501,500.00.
19	Of the funds specified in this section, Two Hundred Fifty
20	Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) shall be deposited in a fund
21	created in the State Treasury called the "Forest Improvement

- 22 Revolving Fund." Money in this fund shall be used by the State
- 23 Forestry Commission to assist in the reforestation and growth
- 24 improvement of the forests, woodlands, and publicly owned lands of
- 25 the state, including sixteenth section lands, Camp Shelby,
- 26 Columbia Training School and colleges and universities.
- 27 Landowners who contract with the commission for such work shall
- 28 pay to the commission its actual cost for conducting such work.
- 29 Money received for this work by the commission shall be paid into
- 30 the State Treasury, and the State Treasurer shall deposit such
- 31 money in the "Forest Improvement Revolving Fund."
- 32 **SECTION 3.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
- 33 this act, the following positions are authorized:

- Time-Limited: Full Time.....
- Part Time.......
- 39 With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
- 40 responsibility to make certain that funds required to be
- 41 appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2022 do not
- 42 exceed Fiscal Year 2021 funds appropriated for that purpose,
- 43 unless programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year
- 44 2021 budget by the Mississippi Legislature. Based on data
- 45 provided by the Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel
- 46 Board shall determine and publish the projected annual cost to
- 47 fully fund all appropriated positions in compliance with the

- 48 provisions of this act. It shall be the responsibility of the
- 49 agency head to ensure that no single personnel action increases
- 50 this projected annual cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2021
- 51 appropriations for "Personal Services" when annualized, with the
- 52 exception of escalated funds and the award of benchmarks. If, at
- 53 the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal
- 54 Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency
- 55 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this
- 56 projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2021 "Personal Services"
- 57 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which
- 58 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation
- 59 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until
- 60 such time as the requirements of this provision are met.
- Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 62 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or
- 63 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
- 64 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
- 65 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
- 66 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
- 67 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
- 68 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
- 69 appropriated level.
- 70 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 71 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
- 72 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
- 73 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

74	None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
75	violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating
76	to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
77	interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
78	SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
79	State Forestry Commission shall maintain complete accounting and
80	personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds
81	appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the
82	same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year
83	2020. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the
84	agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2022 shall be submitted to
85	the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of
86	detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided
87	during the Fiscal Year 2021 budget request process.
88	SECTION 5. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
89	Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
90	the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
91	in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
92	intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,
93	this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted
94	performance measures provided below:

There is created in the State Treasury a fund 114 designated as the Volunteer Fire Department Equipment Conversion 115 Revolving Fund to be used by the State Forestry Commission to 116 assist in the conversion of vehicles acquired by the State Forestry Commission through the Federal Excess Personal Property 117 118 Program or by volunteer fire departments through other means to 119 adapt them for use in the suppression of wildland fires. 120 assistance shall be in the form of fabrication of water tanks or 121 other accessories necessary for the operation of fire suppression 122 units, installation of piping and valves, painting or other 123 similar or associated component work necessary to place fire 124 suppression equipment into service. It is not for general vehicle 125 maintenance or repair.

126 The Volunteer Fire Department Equipment Conversion Revolving Fund shall be funded by monies received from charges for work and 127 128 services performed for volunteer fire departments by the State 129 Forestry Commission. Monies collected from such charges shall be 130 deposited into the Volunteer Fire Department Equipment Conversion 131 Revolving Fund. The State Treasurer shall make disbursements 132 therefrom for payment of materials, supplies and labor upon requisition of the Forestry Commission and upon the issuance of 133 134 warrants therefor by the Department of Finance and Administration.

The amount of monies deposited into the Volunteer Fire

Department Equipment Conversion Fund through this work shall not exceed Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00). Funds in excess of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) shall be placed in the State Forestry Commission's regular appropriated special funds. Monies in this revolving fund are to be considered special funds and shall be carried forward from one fiscal year to the next.

SECTION 7. There is created in the State Treasury a fund

designated as the Camden State Forest Revolving Fund to be used by
the State Forestry Commission to direct forest management
activities on the Camden State Forest in Madison County,
Mississippi. The forest management activities will include, but
not be limited to, maintenance of property, timber sale activities
and regeneration work.

The Camden State Forest Revolving Fund shall be funded by monies received from timber sales, leases, and any other source.

- 152 the Camden State Forest Revolving Fund. The State Treasurer shall
- 153 make disbursements therefrom for payments of materials, supplies
- 154 and labor upon requisition of the State Forestry Commission and
- 155 upon the issuance of warrants therefor by the Department of
- 156 Finance and Administration.
- 157 It is the intention of the Legislature that any revolving
- 158 funds in excess of the budgeted amount needed for the necessary
- 159 operation and maintenance of all properties under the direct
- 160 supervision and management of the State Forestry Commission shall
- 161 remain in the Camden State Forest Revolving Fund for use in future
- 162 years.
- SECTION 8. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, it is the
- 164 intention of the Legislature that Two Hundred Thousand Dollars
- 165 (\$200,000.00) shall be transferred to the Department of
- 166 Agriculture and Commerce for the Beaver Control or Eradication
- 167 Program during the Fiscal Year 2021.
- 168 **SECTION 9.** Any funds in the Salary, Wages and Fringe
- 169 Benefits major object of expenditure may be used to purchase
- 170 accumulated compensatory time within the funds available.
- 171 **SECTION 10.** It is the intention of the Legislature that
- 172 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
- 173 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
- 174 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
- 175 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
- 176 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to

- 177 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
 178 made without competitive bids.
- SECTION 11. Any person who was an employee of the Forestry

 Commission who was laid off during Fiscal Year 2006 shall be given
- 181 first priority in any new employment by the commission.
- 182 **SECTION 12.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 183 funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with
- 184 Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency
- 185 shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their
- 186 appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally
- 187 or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for
- 188 actions contrary to this provision.
- 189 **SECTION 13.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
- 190 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
- 191 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
- 192 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
- 193 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
- 194 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
- 195 **SECTION 14.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 196 and after July 1, 2020, and shall stand repealed June 30, 2020.
