Senate Amendments to House Bill No. 1719

TO THE CLERK OF THE HOUSE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE SENATE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is authorized and approved for expenditure out of any
7	funds which are received by or otherwise become available to the
8	Pat Harrison Waterway District, for the purpose of defraying the
9	expenses of the district for the fiscal year beginning
10	July 1, 2020, and ending June 30, 2021
11	\$ 5,429,472.00.
12	SECTION 2. Of the funds approved for expenditure under the
13	provisions of Section 1, the following positions are authorized:
14	AUTHORIZED POSITIONS:
15	Permanent: Full Time 39
16	Part Time 20
17	Time-Limited: Full Time0
18	Part Time 0
19	With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
20	responsibility to make certain that funds required to be
21	appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2022 do not
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- 22 exceed Fiscal Year 2021 funds appropriated for that purpose,
- 23 unless programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year
- 24 2021 budget by the Mississippi Legislature. Based on data
- 25 provided by the Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel
- 26 Board shall determine and publish the projected annual cost to
- 27 fully fund all appropriated positions in compliance with the
- 28 provisions of this act. It shall be the responsibility of the
- 29 agency head to ensure that no single personnel action increases
- 30 this projected annual cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2021
- 31 appropriations for "Personal Services" when annualized, with the
- 32 exception of escalated funds and the award of benchmarks. If, at
- 33 the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal
- 34 Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency
- 35 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this
- 36 projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2021 "Personal Services"
- 37 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which
- 38 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation
- 39 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until
- 40 such time as the requirements of this provision are met.
- 41 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 42 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or
- 43 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
- 44 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
- 45 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
- 46 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
- 47 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions

- 48 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
- 49 appropriated level.
- No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 51 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
- 52 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
- 53 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
- 55 violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating
- 56 to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
- 57 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
- SECTION 3. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 59 Pat Harrison Waterway District shall maintain complete accounting
- 60 and personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds
- 61 appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the
- 62 same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year
- 63 2020. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the
- 64 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2022 shall be submitted to
- 65 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of
- 66 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided
- 67 during the Fiscal Year 2021 budget request process.
- 68 **SECTION 4.** It is the intention of the Legislature that
- 69 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
- 70 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
- 71 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
- 72 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
- 73 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to

- 74 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
- 75 made without competitive bids.
- 76 **SECTION 5.** The funds herein approved for expenditure, except
- 77 and less an amount approved by the State Fiscal Officer which
- 78 shall be sufficient to cover disbursements for current operations,
- 79 shall be deposited at interest with any official depository of the
- 80 state at a rate of interest numerically not less than one percent
- 81 (1%) below the bank discount rate on United States Treasury bills
- 82 of comparable maturity as determined by the State Treasurer.
- 83 **SECTION 6.** It is the intention of the Legislature that from
- 84 and after July 1, 2020, any county that is not a member of the Pat
- 85 Harrison Waterway District may elect to become a member of the
- 86 district by order of the board of supervisors of such county
- 87 spread upon its minutes and certified to the Pat Harrison Waterway
- 88 Commission.
- 89 **SECTION 7.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 90 funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with
- 91 Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency
- 92 shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their
- 93 appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally
- 94 or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for
- 95 actions contrary to this provision.
- 96 **SECTION 8.** The money herein approved for expenditure shall
- 97 be disbursed upon bank checks signed by the proper person, officer
- 98 or officers, in the manner provided by law.

99 **SECTION 9.** This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2020, and shall stand repealed June 30, 2020.
