## Adopted COMMITTEE AMENDMENT NO 1 PROPOSED TO

## House Bill No. 1708

**BY: Committee** 

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State General
7	Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and maintenance
8	of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for the fiscal
9	year beginning July 1, 2020, and ending June 30, 2021
10	\$ 5,601,432.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in any special fund in
13	the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of Wildlife,
14	Fisheries and Parks which is comprised of special source funds

15	collected by or otherwise available to the department for the
16	support and maintenance of the department, including the Museum of
17	Natural Science and the Bureau of Parks and Recreation, for the
18	fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020, and ending June 30, 2021
19	\$ 63,410,106.00.
20	The following sum, which is included in the sum appropriated
21	above in this section, is appropriated out of the state excise
22	taxes upon gasoline, oil and other petroleum products to the
23	Fisheries and Wildlife Fund for the fiscal year beginning
24	July 1, 2020, and ending June 30, 2021\$ 5,750,000.00.
25	The Department of Revenue is directed to set aside the amount
26	of this appropriation or any part thereof at any time it sees fit,
27	out of any collections of taxes upon gasoline, oil and other
28	petroleum products, and to deduct the amounts so set aside from
29	such funds before making distribution thereof. However,
30	provisions shall first be made for the Highway Bonds Sinking Fund,
31	as required under the provisions of Chapter 130, Laws of 1938, and
32	any amendments thereto, and Section 27-5-101, Mississippi Code of
33	1972.
34	Any funds available in the Wildlife Heritage Fund may be
35	expended by the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks as
36	authorized by law. The department shall make a detailed report to
37	the Legislature regarding the spending of the Wildlife Heritage
38	funds by September 1 for the preceding fiscal year.

39	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
40	Section 2 to the Bureau of Wildlife and Fisheries, funds in the
41	amount of One Hundred Twenty-five Thousand Three Hundred
42	Thirty-five Dollars (\$125,335.00) shall be derived from the
43	Education Enhancement Fund deposited pursuant to Sections 27-65-75
44	and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the purpose of
45	defraying the expenses of Project WILD for Fiscal Year 2021.
46	SECTION 4. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
47	this act, the following positions are authorized:
48	AUTHORIZED POSITIONS:
49	Permanent: Full Time 486
50	Part Time 0
51	Time-Limited: Full Time 50
52	Part Time 0
53	With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
54	responsibility to make certain that funds required to be
55	appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2022 do not
56	exceed Fiscal Year 2021 funds appropriated for that purpose,
57	unless programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year
58	2021 budget by the Mississippi Legislature. Based on data
59	provided by the Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel
60	Board shall determine and publish the projected annual cost to
61	fully fund all appropriated positions in compliance with the
62	provisions of this act. It shall be the responsibility of the
63	agency head to ensure that no single personnel action increases

- 64 this projected annual cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2021
- 65 appropriations for "Personal Services" when annualized, with the
- 66 exception of escalated funds and the award of benchmarks. If, at
- 67 the time the agency takes any action to change "Personal
- 68 Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the agency
- 69 has taken an action which would cause the agency to exceed this
- 70 projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2021 "Personal Services"
- 71 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which
- 72 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation
- 73 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until
- 74 such time as the requirements of this provision are met.
- 75 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 76 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or
- 77 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
- 78 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
- 79 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
- 80 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
- 81 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
- 82 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
- 83 appropriated level.
- No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 85 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
- 86 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
- 87 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.



- None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
- 89 violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating
- 90 to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
- 91 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
- 92 **SECTION 5.** Each conservation officer and supervisor shall be
- 93 furnished an allowance for uniforms not to exceed Five Hundred
- 94 Fifty Dollars (\$550.00) per annum.
- 95 Provided further, when any personnel of the Bureau of
- 96 Wildlife and Fisheries are transferred from one (1) county to
- 97 another on a permanent assignment, the expense monies now paid on
- 98 out-of-county duty shall not be applicable.
- 99 **SECTION 6.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 100 Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall maintain
- 101 complete accounting and personnel records related to the
- 102 expenditure of all funds appropriated under this act and that such
- 103 records shall be in the same format and level of detail as
- 104 maintained for Fiscal Year 2020. It is further the intention of
- 105 the Legislature that the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year
- 106 2022 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee
- 107 in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level
- 108 of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2021 budget request
- 109 process.
- 110 **SECTION 7.** In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
- 111 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
- 112 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized

A reporting of the degree to which the performance targets 189 190 set above have been or are being achieved shall be provided in the 191 agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget 192 Committee for Fiscal Year 2022.

193 SECTION 8. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, the 194 following amount shall come from the Department of Wildlife, 195 Fisheries and Parks Special Pearl River Timber Fund No. 3465, for 196 the purpose of making improvements to the Pearl River Wildlife 197 Management Area....\$ 50,000.00.

SECTION 9. Of the funds appropriated within this act, the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks may enter into cooperative agreements with the board of supervisors of any county or any group or combination of counties for the purpose of creating, improving or restoring parks, public game and fish habitat lying or to be situated wholly or partially within such county or in an adjoining county; and each county is empowered and authorized, in its discretion, to expend funds from the general county fund for such purposes from which fund they shall reimburse to the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks the actual cost of all surveying and engineering projects incurred by the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks incidental thereto. Such boards of supervisors are further authorized and empowered, in their discretion, to enter into agreements necessary to carry out the purposes of this act with any other county, the United

- 213 States Forest Service or any other agency if same should be
  214 necessary for the acquisition of land by lease or otherwise for
  215 such purposes.
- SECTION 10. It shall be unlawful for any officer, employee or other person whatsoever to use or permit or authorize the use of any automobile or any other motor vehicle owned by the State of Mississippi or any department, agency or institution thereof for any purpose other than upon the official business of the State of Mississippi or any agency, department or institution thereof.
- It is the intent of the Legislature that motor vehicles
  authorized to be owned and operated by this agency shall comply
  with Sections 25-1-77 through 25-1-93, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- SECTION 11. In order to be in compliance with Section
  63-1-201 et seq., funds are herein provided and may be expended by
  the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks to pay the costs
  of commercial driver's licenses for specific employees and/or to
  reimburse such costs for specific employees who, in the course of
  their duties and responsibilities, are required to hold a valid
  Mississippi Commercial Driver's License.
- SECTION 12. The Mississippi Department of Wildlife,

  Fisheries and Parks is authorized to provide financial support of

  One Hundred Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$175,000.00) and to

  enter into an agreement with the Mississippi Cooperative Extension

  Service for a project specialist and related supportive cost.

- SECTION 13. The department is authorized to spend up to
  sixty percent (60%) of revenue in the State Park Timber Endowment
  Fund, as needed, to operate and maintain the state parks.
- SECTION 14. It is the intention of the Legislature that 240 241 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the 242 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 243 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, 244 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind 245 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to 246 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are 247 made without competitive bids.
- SECTION 15. Of the funds appropriated herein, Two Hundred
  Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) may be provided to fund the Youth
  Participation Initiative for the purpose of educating children in
  the areas of hunting, fishing, conservation, and safety.
  - SECTION 16. The fund created pursuant to Section 49-5-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, and known as the "Fisheries and Wildlife Fund" shall be treated as a special trust fund. All funds derived from the sale of licenses, fees, fines and other revenues received by the department as provided by law, shall be deposited in the Fisheries and Wildlife Fund. In addition, revenue derived from the sale of timber on wildlife management areas, refuges and preserves shall be deposited into an account established for such revenues under the Fisheries and Wildlife Fund. The interest and any investment income earned on the fund shall be credited by the

- 262 State Treasurer to the Fisheries and Wildlife Fund and shall not
- 263 be paid into the General Fund. Any unexpended funds remaining in
- 264 the fund at the end of the fiscal year shall not lapse and shall
- 265 remain in the fund. Nothing in this section shall prevent the use
- 266 of said funds from maintenance and upgrade on wildlife management
- 267 areas and state parks.
- 268 **SECTION 17.** It is the intention of the Legislature that no
- 269 more than One Million Three Hundred Thousand Dollars
- 270 (\$1,300,000.00) be expended from the Motor Vehicle Fund for the
- 271 purchase of any type of motor vehicle.
- 272 **SECTION 18.** The executive director of the Department of
- 273 Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks is authorized to enter into an
- 274 agreement with public or private entity to manage any park or
- 275 parks within the state park system.
- 276 **SECTION 19.** It is the intent of the Legislature that no
- 277 state-owned wildlife management area be closed and that to the
- 278 greatest practicable extent, department land management decisions
- 279 and actions may not result in any net loss of any acreage
- 280 available for hunting opportunities that existed on July 1, 2006,
- 281 as provided in Section 49-5-99(4). It is the intention of the
- 282 Legislature that no state park be closed without legislative
- 283 approval.
- 284 **SECTION 20.** It is the intent of the Legislature that the
- 285 Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have
- 286 the authority to enter into multi-year contracts for the purpose

- of placing a sign on such state park property under the
  department's domain, in accordance with any applicable rules and
  regulations. All proceeds generated from these activities shall
  remain with the department and shall be deposited into the proper
  special fund.
- SECTION 21. It is the intent of the Legislature that from
  the funds available to the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and
  Parks, the department may purchase and pay premium(s) on property
  damage insurance on its motor vehicles, boats, trailers, real
  property improvements, buildings, furnishings, and such other
  assets as may be appropriate or practical, and/or as required by a
  granting entity.
- SECTION 22. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
  of Section 2, One Million Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars
  (\$1,750,000.00) shall be designated for the purpose of defraying
  the operational expenses of Special Projects. None of these funds
  shall be used for "Personal Services".
- SECTION 23. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
  Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have the
  authority to receive, budget and expend funds from the Gulf and
  Wildlife Protection Fund, not to exceed Fifty Thousand Dollars
  (\$50,000.00) for the purpose of preservation, protection,
  conservation, and acquisition of waters, land and wildlife of this
  state.

- 311 SECTION 24. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
  312 funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with
  313 Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency
  314 shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their
  315 appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally
  316 or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for
  317 actions contrary to this provision.
- 318 SECTION 25. The department is authorized to establish an 319 annual golf pass for Mississippi residents, as defined by Section 49-7-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, which will allow the holder of 320 321 such pass to play golf at any golf course operated by the 322 Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks, at 323 reduced rates. The department shall have the authority to 324 establish the fee for issuance of the annual golf pass. All funds generated from the sale of the Mississippi resident annual golf 325 326 pass shall be deposited into the Mississippi Park Fund established 327 by Section 55-3-41, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 328 **SECTION 26.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, it is
  329 the intention of the Legislature that Fifty-eight Thousand Five
  330 Hundred Ninety-three Dollars (\$58,593.00) may be allocated for the
  331 Hunter Education program supported from the General Fund court
  332 assessments.
- 333 **SECTION 27.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
  334 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
  335 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon

336	warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
337	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
338	proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law
339	SECTION 28. This act shall take effect and be in force from
340	and after July 1, 2020, and shall stand repealed June 30, 2020.
