Tabled AMENDMENT NO 1 PROPOSED TO

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

2.4 SECTION 1. (1)There is established the Commission to 25 Redesign the Mississippi State Flag (commission) for the sole 2.6 purpose of developing, designing and reporting to the Governor and 27 the Legislature three (3) recommendations for the new design for 28 the official Mississippi State Flag not later than January 1, 29 The three (3) new designs for the Mississippi State Flag recommended by the commission shall be placed on the ballot in a 30 statewide special election as provided for in Section 2 of this 31

- 32 act. The new designs for the Mississippi State Flag recommended
- 33 by the commission shall not include the design of the Confederate
- 34 Battle Flag, but shall include the words "In God We Trust." The
- 35 commission is charged with a sensitive and responsible task that
- 36 it shall conduct in an objective manner. The new design for the
- 37 Mississippi State Flag shall honor the past while embracing the
- 38 promise of the future.
- 39 (2) The Commission to Redesign the Mississippi State Flag
- 40 shall consist of seventeen (17) members, to be appointed as
- 41 follows:
- 42 (a) Three (3) members of the Mississippi House of
- 43 Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House;
- (b) Three (3) members of the Mississippi Senate
- 45 appointed by the Lieutenant Governor;
- 46 (c) Eleven (11) members appointed by the Governor, to
- 47 include:
- 48 (i) Two (2) university or college students;
- 49 (ii) A Mississippi public schoolteacher and a
- 50 Mississippi public university instructor;
- 51 (iii) A representative from the Mississippi NAACP;
- 52 (iv) A representative from the Mississippi Arts
- 53 Commission;
- 54 (v) A representative of the League of Women Voters
- 55 of Mississippi;



- 56 (vi) One (1) representative from the Board of
- 57 Trustees of the Mississippi Department of Archives and History;
- (vii) A representative from business and industry;
- 59 and
- (viii) Two (2) members from the state at large.
- All appointments to the commission shall be made not later
- 62 than July 15, 2020. The chair of the commission shall be chosen
- 63 by majority vote of the members of the commission. The commission
- 64 shall meet as soon as practicable after the appointments have been
- 65 made upon the call of the chairman, and shall organize for
- 66 business. A quorum of the membership of the commission shall be
- 67 required for the adoption of any reports and recommendations. The
- 68 Mississippi Department of Archives and History shall provide
- 69 meeting space and clerical support for the operation of the
- 70 commission.
- 71 (3) The commission shall have the following functions and
- 72 duties:
- 73 (a) To hold regular, public meetings when and where it
- 74 sees fit;
- 75 (b) To receive written, public comment, in a manner
- 76 that it sees fit, and to hold public hearings, under the terms and
- 77 conditions that it sees fit;
- 78 (c) To collect, examine and consider all information
- 79 that it determines may be helpful in making a recommendation for
- 80 the new design for the Mississippi State Flag;

- 81 (d) To consult with experts, social science experts,
- 82 representatives of organizations and associations, and others, as
- 83 it sees fit, whose knowledge or expertise may assist the
- 84 commission in making its recommendation;
- 85 (e) To make any inquiries and conduct any business that
- 86 may assist the commission in developing the new designs for the
- 87 Mississippi State Flag; however, the new design for the
- 88 Mississippi State Flag recommended by the commission shall not
- 89 include the design of the Confederate Battle Flag, but shall
- 90 include the words "In God We Trust";
- 91 (f) Keep minutes of its meetings, and make those
- 92 minutes available to the public; and
- 93 (q) To make a written recommendation for the new
- 94 designs for the official Mississippi State Flag, which shall be
- 95 presented to the Governor and the Legislature not later than
- 96 January 1, 2021.
- 97 (4) Members of the commission shall receive no compensation
- 98 for their service on the commission, but may receive reimbursement
- 99 for mileage and actual expenses as provided in Section 25-3-41, to
- 100 the extent that funds are available for that purpose.
- 101 **SECTION 2.** (1) There shall be a statewide special election
- 102 for the purpose of determining whether to retain the present state
- 103 flag or which of the three (3) new designs for the Mississippi
- 104 State Flag recommended by the commission shall be the design for
- 105 the official Mississippi State Flag. The special election shall

106	be held on Tuesday, April 6, 2021, concurrent with municipal
107	primary elections in Mississippi and shall be conducted in the
108	same manner as general elections are held. The question put
109	before the voters at the special election shall read on the
110	ballots as follows:
111	PROPOSITION A
112	"PLEASE VOTE 'YES' OR 'NO'
113	The current Mississippi flag shall be removed as the official
114	State Flag.
115	'YES':"
116	PROPOSITION B
117	"ONLY IF YOU VOTE 'YES' ON PROPOSITION A, PLEASE VOTE 'YES' OR
118	'NO' ON WHICH OF THE FOLLOWING DESIGNS SHALL BE THE OFFICIAL
119	MISSISSIPPI STATE FLAG:
120	DESIGN NO. 1: 'YES': 'NO':
121	DESIGN NO. 2: 'YES': 'NO':
122	DESIGN NO. 3: 'YES':"
123	THE BALLOT SHALL INCLUDE A PICTURE OF EACH DESIGN RECOMMENDED
124	BY THE COMMISSION IN COLOR WHICH SHALL BE PRINTED NEXT TO EACH
125	DESIGN NUMBER. THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS MAY INDICATE THEIR
126	PREFERENCE ON THE LINE FOLLOWING THE ANSWER THAT THEY PREFER.
127	If a majority of the qualified electors voting on Proposition
128	"A" in the special election vote "Yes" as certified by the
129	Secretary of State, then the Legislature shall enact into law the
130	new design receiving the largest number of votes on Proposition

- "B" as the official Mississippi State Flag during the next regular session of the Legislature after the election. If a majority of the qualified electors voting on Proposition "A" in the special election vote "No" as certified by the Secretary of State, then the official state flag in present law described in Section 3-3-16, Mississippi Code of 1972, shall continue to be the state flag of Mississippi.
- The statewide special election for voting on the design 138 (2) 139 for the official Mississippi State Flag shall be administered by means of ballots containing a uniform representation of the new 140 141 designs for the official Mississippi State Flag recommended by the 142 commission, which shall be provided by the Secretary of State to 143 the election commissioners of each county. The Secretary of State shall determine whether, in each county, it would be more 144 145 efficient to administer the election by paper ballots, voting 146 machines, electronic voting systems, optical mark reading 147 equipment or other mechanized equipment. The method used in each county shall be as uniform as practicable when compared to any 148 149 other county in which the same method is used. In any event, the 150 Secretary of State shall include a color picture or drawing of the 151 new designs for the Mississippi State Flag on all ballots provided 152 for in this section. The Secretary of State is authorized to 153 enter into any necessary contracts for providing the required 154 color picture or drawing of the new designs for the official 155 Mississippi State Flag on all ballots in all counties of this

- 156 The costs incurred in providing the ballots that are 157 required to include a color picture or drawing of the new design 158 for the official Mississippi State Flag shall be borne by the 159 State of Mississippi, and the Legislature shall appropriate the 160 funds necessary for this purpose. The Secretary of State shall 161 determine whether, in each county, it would be more efficient to 162 administer the election by paper ballots or voting machines, and 163 shall determine if the question put before the voters shall be 164 included on the ballot for municipal primary elections, in order to save costs. All other costs associated with the holding of the 165 166 statewide special election shall be borne by each individual 167 county.
- 168 The county election commissioners shall transmit to the 169 Secretary of State, in the same manner as the vote for state 170 officers is transmitted, a statement of the total number of votes 171 cast for Proposition "A" and Proposition "B" in the statewide 172 special election for voting on the design for the official Mississippi State Flag. The Secretary of State shall tabulate 173 174 those returns and certify the results to the Governor and to each 175 house of the Legislature.
- SECTION 3. Section 23-15-351, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:
- 23-15-351. It shall be the duty of the chair of the election commission of each county to have printed all necessary ballots for use in elections, except ballots in municipal elections which

181	shall be printed as herein provided by the authorities of the
182	respective municipalities; and the election commissioner shall
183	cause the official ballot to be printed by a printer sworn to keep
184	the ballots secret under the penalties prescribed by law. The
185	printer shall deliver to the election commissioners for holding
186	elections, a certificate of the number of ballots printed for each
187	precinct, and shall not print any additional ballots, except on
188	instruction of proper election commissioners; and failure to
189	observe either of these requirements shall be a misdemeanor.
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In the case of a statewide special election on the design for
the official Mississippi State Flag provided for in Section 2 of
this act, the provisions of this article regarding the printing
and distribution of the official ballots shall be governed by the
provisions of Section 2(3) of this act.

195 **SECTION 4.** Section 23-15-355, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 196 amended as follows:

23-15-355. Ballots in all elections shall be printed and distributed at public expense and shall be known as "official ballots." The expense of printing the ballots shall be paid out of the county treasury, except that in municipal elections such expenses shall be paid by the respective cities, towns and villages.

In the case of a statewide special election on the design for
the official Mississippi State Flag provided for in Section 2 of
this act, the provisions of this section regarding payment of the



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- 206 expenses of printing the official ballots shall be governed by the
- 207 provisions of Section 2(3) of this act.
- 208 **SECTION 5.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 209 and after its passage.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE COMMISSION TO REDESIGN THE MISSISSIPPI STATE FLAG; TO PRESCRIBE THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE COMMISSION AND TO PROVIDE FOR ITS ORGANIZATION AND MEETINGS; TO 4 PROVIDE THAT THE COMMISSION SHALL ADOPT THREE NEW DESIGNS FOR THE 5 MISSISSIPPI STATE FLAG WHICH SHALL NOT INCLUDE THE DESIGN OF THE CONFEDERATE BATTLE FLAG, BUT SHALL INCLUDE THE WORDS "IN GOD WE TRUST"; TO PROVIDE THAT THE COMMISSION SHALL MAKE ITS 8 RECOMMENDATION FOR THE NEW DESIGN FOR THE MISSISSIPPI STATE FLAG 9 BY JANUARY 1, 2021; TO PROVIDE THAT THE NEW DESIGNS FOR THE 10 MISSISSIPPI STATE FLAG RECOMMENDED BY THE COMMISSION SHALL BE PLACED ON THE BALLOT IN A SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON APRIL 6, 11 12 2021; TO PRESCRIBE THE PROPOSITIONS TO BE PLACED ON THE BALLOT; TO 13 PROVIDE THAT IF A MAJORITY OF THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS VOTE FOR A 14 NEW DESIGN, THEN THE LEGISLATURE SHALL ENACT INTO LAW THE NEW 15 DESIGN RECEIVING THE MOST VOTES AS THE OFFICIAL MISSISSIPPI STATE 16 FLAG; TO REQUIRE THAT THE SPECIAL ELECTION BE ADMINISTERED BY 17 MEANS OF BALLOTS CONTAINING A COLOR PICTURE OR DRAWING OF THE NEW 18 DESIGNS FOR THE MISSISSIPPI STATE FLAG; TO REQUIRE THE SECRETARY 19 OF STATE TO PROVIDE THOSE BALLOTS TO THE ELECTION COMMISSIONERS OF 20 EACH COUNTY; TO AMEND SECTIONS 23-15-351 AND 23-15-355, 21 MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CONFORM TO THE PRECEDING PROVISIONS; 22 AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
