HOUSE BILL NO. 87 (As Sent to Governor)

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 43-1-23, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 REQUIRE THAT THE DIRECTOR AND INVESTIGATORS OF THE MISSISSIPPI 3 DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES FRAUD INVESTIGATION UNIT HAVE LAW ENFORCEMENT AUTHORITY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5
- SECTION 1. Section 43-1-23, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6
- 7 amended as follows:
- 8 43-1-23. (1) There is created within the State Department
- 9 of Human Services a separate administrative unit to be known as
- the "Fraud Investigation Unit." The Fraud Investigation Unit 10
- shall be headed by a director appointed by the Executive Director 11
- 12 of the department. The Director of the Fraud Investigation Unit,
- and each investigator within the unit shall be a * * * law 13
- 14 enforcement officer, part-time law enforcement officer, or law
- enforcement trainee as defined in Section 45-6-3(c) through (e), 15
- Mississippi Code of 1972, and knowledgeable in the programs 16
- 17 administered by the department. The Fraud Investigation Unit
- 18 shall be responsible for:

19	(a) Conducting investigations for the purpose of aiding
20	the department in the <u>prevention of</u> , detection of and verification
21	of the perpetration of fraud or abuse of any program by any
22	client, any vendor of services with whom the department has
23	contracted, with any nonfederal entity in which the department has
24	entered into an agreement with, or any employee of the department,
25	and for the aiding of the department in the recoupment of any
26	funds owed to the department as a result of fraud or abuse;
27	(b) The notification and forwarding of any information
28	relevant to possible criminal violations to the appropriate
29	prosecuting authority and assisting in the prosecution of any case
30	referred to a prosecutor, if requested; and
31	(c) Such other duties as prescribed in regulations of
32	the department, which shall include, but not be limited to,
33	reporting any suspected criminal violations discovered in the
34	course of an investigation by the Fraud Investigation Unit
35	involving statutes not within the programmatic purview of the
36	Department of Human Services such as human trafficking, domestic
37	violence, child abuse or other crimes against persons to the
38	Director of the Mississippi Bureau of Investigation.
39	Additionally, investigators of the Fraud Investigation Unit shall
40	cooperate in any investigation arising from a report to the
41	Mississippi Bureau of Investigation and in any task force which
42	currently exists or which may be created in the future by the
43	Mississippi Bureau of Investigation.

- The Fraud Investigation Unit shall not have state-wide 47 48 police power except as otherwise provided herein or in the event 49 the unit is granted and accepts additional authority as a contract agent of the Mississippi Bureau of Investigation pursuant to 50 51 Section 45-1-6, Mississippi Code of 1972. In order to carry out the responsibilities of the Fraud Investigation Unit, the 52 53 investigators may request and receive assistance from all state 54 and local agencies, boards, commissions, and bureaus, including, without limitation, the * * * Department of Revenue, the 55 56 Department of Public Safety, and all public and private agencies maintaining data banks, criminal or other records that would 57 58 enable the investigators to make verification of fraud or abuse in 59 violation of state or federal statutes. All records and 60 information shall be confidential and shall be available only to 61 the Fraud Investigation Unit, district or county attorneys, the 62 Attorney General, and courts having jurisdiction in criminal 63 proceedings.
- (4) The department is authorized to enter into contracts
 with other agencies administering aid or benefits or services
 under any state or federally funded assistance program which need
 the assistance of the department's Fraud Investigation Unit.

68	(5) To accomplish the objectives and to carry out the duties
69	prescribed in this section, the executive director, or his
70	designee, in addition to the powers conferred by this section, may
71	issue subpoenas with the approval of, and returnable to, a judge
72	of the circuit, county or chancery court, in termtime or in
73	vacation, to examine the records, documents or other evidence of
74	persons, firms, corporations or any other entities insofar as such
75	records, documents or other evidence relate to dealings material
76	to an investigation.

77 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 78 and after July 1, 2021.

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
