## HOUSE BILL NO. 144

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 43-1-23, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE THE DIRECTOR OF THE FRAUD INVESTIGATION UNIT OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES AND EACH INVESTIGATOR OF THE UNIT TO BE A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER, PART-TIME LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER OR LAW ENFORCEMENT TRAINEE; TO EXPAND THE DUTIES OF THE UNIT TO INCLUDE INVESTIGATIONS TO AID THE DEPARTMENT IN THE PREVENTION OF FRAUD OR ABUSE OF ANY PROGRAM OF THE DEPARTMENT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- 9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 10 **SECTION 1.** Section 43-1-23, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 11 amended as follows:
- 12 43-1-23. (1) There is created within the State Department
- 13 of Human Services a separate administrative unit to be known as
- 14 the "Fraud Investigation Unit." The Fraud Investigation Unit
- 15 shall be headed by a director appointed by the Executive Director
- 16 of the department. The Director of the Fraud Investigation Unit
- 17 and each investigator of the unit shall be a \* \* \* law enforcement
- 18 officer, part-time law enforcement officer or law enforcement
- 19 trainee as defined in Section 45-6-3 who is knowledgeable in the
- 20 programs administered by the department. The Fraud Investigation
- 21 Unit shall be responsible for:

22	(a)	Conducting	investigations	for th	ne purpose	e of	aiding
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- 23 the department in the prevention, detection of and verification of
- 24 the perpetration of fraud or abuse of any program by any client,
- 25 any vendor of services with whom the department has contracted,
- 26 any nonfederal entity with which the department has entered into
- 27 an agreement, or any employee of the department, and for the
- 28 aiding of the department in the recoupment of any funds owed to
- 29 the department as a result of fraud or abuse;
- 30 (b) The notification and forwarding of any information
- 31 relevant to possible criminal violations to the appropriate
- 32 prosecuting authority and assisting in the prosecution of any case
- 33 referred to a prosecutor, if requested; and
- 34 (c) Such other duties as prescribed in regulations of
- 35 the department.
- 36 (2) The Fraud Investigation Unit is authorized to employ
- 37 such other investigative, technical, secretarial and support staff
- 38 as may be necessary.
- 39 (3) In order to carry out the responsibilities of the Fraud
- 40 Investigation Unit, the investigators may request and receive
- 41 assistance from all state and local agencies, boards, commissions,
- 42 and bureaus including, without limitation, the \* \* \* Department of
- 43 Revenue, the Department of Public Safety, and all public and
- 44 private agencies maintaining data banks, criminal or other records
- 45 that would enable the investigators to make verification of fraud
- 46 or abuse in violation of state or federal statutes. All records

- 47 and information shall be confidential and shall be available only
- 48 to the Fraud Investigation Unit, district or county attorneys, the
- 49 Attorney General, and courts having jurisdiction in criminal
- 50 proceedings.
- 51 (4) The department is authorized to enter into contracts
- 52 with other agencies administering aid or benefits or services
- 53 under any state or federally funded assistance program which need
- 54 the assistance of the department's Fraud Investigation Unit.
- 55 (5) To accomplish the objectives and to carry out the duties
- 56 prescribed in this section, the executive director, or his
- 57 designee, in addition to the powers conferred by this section, may
- 58 issue subpoenas with the approval of, and returnable to, a judge
- 59 of the circuit, county or chancery court, in termtime or in
- 60 vacation, to examine the records, documents or other evidence of
- 61 persons, firms, corporations or any other entities insofar as such
- 62 records, documents or other evidence relate to dealings material
- 63 to an investigation.
- 64 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 65 and after July 1, 2021.
