HOUSE BILL NO. 186

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 75-24-15, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972,
 TO PROVIDE THAT ANY CLAIM OR ACTION UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE
 CONSUMER PROTECTION LAWS FILED ON BEHALF OF A VETERAN FOR A FEE
 MUST INCLUDE CERTAIN ACKNOWLEDGMENTS THAT THE MISSISSIPPI STATE
 VETERANS AFFAIRS BOARD OFFERS THE SAME SERVICE FREE OF CHARGE; AND
 FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 8 **SECTION 1.** Section 75-24-15, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 9 amended as follows:
- 10 75-24-15. (1) In addition to all other statutory and common
- 11 law rights, remedies and defenses, any person who purchases or
- 12 leases goods or services primarily for personal, family or
- 13 household purposes and thereby suffers any ascertainable loss of
- 14 money or property, real or personal, as a result of the use or
- 15 employment by the seller, lessor, manufacturer or producer of a
- 16 method, act or practice prohibited by Section 75-24-5 may bring an
- 17 action at law in the court having jurisdiction in the county in
- 18 which the seller, lessor, manufacturer or producer resides, or has
- 19 his principal place of business or, where the act or practice

20 prohibited by Section 75-24-5 allegedly occurred, to recover such

- 21 loss of money or damages for the loss of such property, or may
- 22 assert, by way of setoff or counterclaim, the fact of such loss in
- 23 a proceeding against him for the recovery of the purchase price or
- 24 rental, or any portion thereof, of the goods or services.
- 25 (2) In any private action brought under this chapter, the
- 26 plaintiff must have first made a reasonable attempt to resolve any
- 27 claim through an informal dispute settlement program approved by
- 28 the Attorney General.
- 29 (3) In any action or counterclaim under this section of this
- 30 chapter, a prevailing defendant may recover in addition to any
- 31 other relief that may be provided in this section costs and a
- 32 reasonable attorney's fee, if in the opinion of the court, said
- 33 action or counterclaim was frivolous or filed for the purpose of
- 34 harassment or delay.
- 35 (4) Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to permit any
- 36 class action or suit, but every private action must be maintained
- 37 in the name of and for the sole use and benefit of the individual
- 38 person.
- 39 (5) Any claim under this section filed on behalf of a
- 40 veteran that charges the veteran a fee for the service shall
- 41 include a form signed by the veteran acknowledging that the State
- 42 of Mississippi through the Mississippi State Veterans Affairs
- 43 Board offers the same or similar service free of charge. The
- 44 veteran must sign this form stating that he/she has read and
- 45 understands it.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from

47 and after July 1, 2021.
