## HOUSE BILL NO. 301

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 41-59-35, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972,
  TO AUTHORIZE AN EMT, EMT-A, EMR OR PARAMEDIC TO DENY TRANSPORT TO
  SOMEONE WITHOUT A LIFE-THREATENING EMERGENCY IF THERE IS A
  LIFE-THREATENING EMERGENCY THAT THE EMT, EMT-A, EMR OR PARAMEDIC
  NEEDS TO ATTEND TO AT THAT TIME; TO DIRECT THE STATE BOARD OF
  HEALTH TO ADOPT RULES AND REGULATIONS NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT THIS
- 6 HEALTH TO ADOPT RULES AND REGULATIONS NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT THIS 7 PROVISION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 9 **SECTION 1.** Section 41-59-35, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 10 amended as follows:
- 11 41-59-35. (1) An emergency medical technician certificate
- 12 so issued shall be valid for a period not exceeding two (2) years
- 13 from the date of issuance and may be renewed upon payment of a
- 14 renewal fee to be fixed by the board, which shall be paid to the
- 15 board, provided that the holder meets the qualifications set forth
- 16 in this Chapter 59 and Chapter 60 and rules and regulations
- 17 promulgated by the board. Any increase in the fee charged by the
- 18 board under this subsection shall be in accordance with the
- 19 provisions of Section 41-3-65.

20	(2) The board is authorized to suspend or revoke a
21	certificate so issued at any time it is determined that the holder
2.2	no longer meets the prescribed qualifications.

- 23 It shall be unlawful for any person, corporation or (3) 24 association to, in any manner, represent himself, herself or 25 itself as an Emergency Medical Technician-Basic, Emergency Medical Technician-Advanced, Emergency Medical Technician-Paramedic, 26 27 Emergency Medical Technician-Paramedic Critical Care, or Emergency 28 Medical Services Driver, or use in connection with his or its name 29 the words or letters of EMT, emt, paramedic, critical care 30 paramedic, or any other letters, words, abbreviations or insignia 31 which would indicate or imply that he, she or it is an Emergency 32 Medical Technician-Basic, Emergency Medical Technician-Advanced, Emergency Medical Technician-Paramedic, Emergency Medical 33 Technician-Paramedic Critical Care, or Emergency Medical Services 34 35 Driver, unless certified in accordance with Chapters 59 and 60 of 36 this title and in accordance with the rules and regulations promulgated by the board; or a person who has a privilege to 37 38 practice under the Emergency Medical Services Personnel Licensure 39 Interstate Compact. It shall be unlawful to employ an uncertified 40 Emergency Medical Technician-Basic, Emergency Medical
- Technician-Advanced, Emergency Medical Technician-Paramedic, or 41
- Emergency Medical Technician-Paramedic Critical Care to provide 42
- basic or advanced life-support services. 43

- 44 (4) An EMT, EMT-A, EMR, or Paramedic may transport a police
- 45 dog injured in the line of duty to a veterinary clinic, hospital
- 46 emergency department or similar facility if there are no persons
- 47 requiring medical attention or transport at that time. For the
- 48 purposes of this subsection, "police dog" means a dog owned or
- 49 used by a law enforcement department or agency in the course of
- 50 the department or agency's work, including a search and rescue
- 51 dog, service dog, accelerant detection canine, or other dog that
- 52 is in use by a county, municipal, or state law enforcement agency.
- 53 (5) An EMT, EMT-A, EMR or Paramedic may deny transport to
- 54 someone without a life-threatening emergency if there is a
- 55 life-threatening emergency that the EMT, EMT-A, EMR or Paramedic
- 56 needs to attend to at that time. The State Board of Health shall
- 57 adopt rules and regulations necessary to implement this subsection
- 58 (5).
- 59 ( \* \* \*6) Any Emergency Medical Technician-Basic, Emergency
- 60 Medical Technician-Advanced, Emergency Medical
- 61 Technician-Paramedic, Emergency Medical Technician-Paramedic
- 62 Critical Care, or Emergency Medical Services Driver who violates
- 63 or fails to comply with these statutes or the rules and
- 64 regulations promulgated by the board under these statutes shall be
- 65 subject, after due notice and hearing, to an administrative fine
- 66 not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00).
- 67 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 68 and after July 1, 2021.
