HOUSE BILL NO. 319 (As Passed the House)

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 45-9-101, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972,
TO WAIVE THE RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT FOR SPOUSES OF ACTIVE MILITARY
PERSONNEL FOR GUN PERMITS; TO AMEND SECTION 63-11-25, MISSISSIPPI
CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE THAT THE PETITION TO REVIEW A FORFEITURE,
SUSPENSION OR DENIAL OF THE ISSUANCE OF A DRIVER'S LICENSE BE
SERVED UPON THE COMMISSIONER OF PUBLIC SAFETY; AND FOR RELATED
PURPOSES.

- 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 9 **SECTION 1.** Section 45-9-101, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 10 amended as follows:
- 11 45-9-101. (1) (a) Except as otherwise provided, the
- 12 Department of Public Safety is authorized to issue licenses to
- 13 carry stun guns, concealed pistols or revolvers to persons
- 14 qualified as provided in this section. Such licenses shall be
- 15 valid throughout the state for a period of five (5) years from the
- 16 date of issuance. Any person possessing a valid license issued
- 17 pursuant to this section may carry a stun gun, concealed pistol or
- 18 concealed revolver.
- 19 (b) The licensee must carry the license, together with
- 20 valid identification, at all times in which the licensee is

- 21 carrying a stun gun, concealed pistol or revolver and must display
- 22 both the license and proper identification upon demand by a law
- 23 enforcement officer. A violation of the provisions of this
- 24 paragraph (b) shall constitute a noncriminal violation with a
- 25 penalty of Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) and shall be enforceable
- 26 by summons.
- 27 (2) The Department of Public Safety shall issue a license if
- 28 the applicant:
- 29 (a) Is a resident of the state. However, this
- 30 residency requirement may be waived if the applicant possesses a
- 31 valid permit from another state, is active military personnel
- 32 stationed in Mississippi, is the spouse of active military
- 33 personnel stationed in Mississippi, or is a retired law
- 34 enforcement officer establishing residency in the state;
- 35 (b) (i) Is twenty-one (21) years of age or older; or
- 36 (ii) Is at least eighteen (18) years of age but
- 37 not yet twenty-one (21) years of age and the applicant:
- 1. Is a member or veteran of the United
- 39 States Armed Forces, including National Guard or Reserve; and
- 40 2. Holds a valid Mississippi driver's license
- 41 or identification card issued by the Department of Public Safety;
- 42 (c) Does not suffer from a physical infirmity which
- 43 prevents the safe handling of a stun gun, pistol or revolver;

- 44 (d) Is not ineligible to possess a firearm by virtue of
- 45 having been convicted of a felony in a court of this state, of any

- other state, or of the United States without having been pardoned or without having been expunged for same;
- (e) Does not chronically or habitually abuse controlled
- 49 substances to the extent that his normal faculties are impaired.
- 50 It shall be presumed that an applicant chronically and habitually
- 51 uses controlled substances to the extent that his faculties are
- 52 impaired if the applicant has been voluntarily or involuntarily
- 53 committed to a treatment facility for the abuse of a controlled
- 54 substance or been found guilty of a crime under the provisions of
- 55 the Uniform Controlled Substances Law or similar laws of any other
- 56 state or the United States relating to controlled substances
- 57 within a three-year period immediately preceding the date on which
- 58 the application is submitted;
- 59 (f) Does not chronically and habitually use alcoholic
- 60 beverages to the extent that his normal faculties are impaired.
- 61 It shall be presumed that an applicant chronically and habitually
- 62 uses alcoholic beverages to the extent that his normal faculties
- 63 are impaired if the applicant has been voluntarily or
- 64 involuntarily committed as an alcoholic to a treatment facility or
- 65 has been convicted of two (2) or more offenses related to the use
- 66 of alcohol under the laws of this state or similar laws of any
- 67 other state or the United States within the three-year period
- 68 immediately preceding the date on which the application is
- 69 submitted;

- 70 (g) Desires a legal means to carry a stun gun,
- 71 concealed pistol or revolver to defend himself;
- 72 (h) Has not been adjudicated mentally incompetent, or
- 73 has waited five (5) years from the date of his restoration to
- 74 capacity by court order;
- 75 (i) Has not been voluntarily or involuntarily committed
- 76 to a mental institution or mental health treatment facility unless
- 77 he possesses a certificate from a psychiatrist licensed in this
- 78 state that he has not suffered from disability for a period of
- 79 five (5) years;
- 80 (j) Has not had adjudication of quilt withheld or
- 81 imposition of sentence suspended on any felony unless three (3)
- 82 years have elapsed since probation or any other conditions set by
- 83 the court have been fulfilled;
- 84 (k) Is not a fugitive from justice; and
- 85 (1) Is not disqualified to possess a weapon based on
- 86 federal law.
- 87 (3) The Department of Public Safety may deny a license if
- 88 the applicant has been found guilty of one or more crimes of
- 89 violence constituting a misdemeanor unless three (3) years have
- 90 elapsed since probation or any other conditions set by the court
- 91 have been fulfilled or expunction has occurred prior to the date
- 92 on which the application is submitted, or may revoke a license if
- 93 the licensee has been found quilty of one or more crimes of
- 94 violence within the preceding three (3) years. The department

- 95 shall, upon notification by a law enforcement agency or a court
- 96 and subsequent written verification, suspend a license or the
- 97 processing of an application for a license if the licensee or
- 98 applicant is arrested or formally charged with a crime which would
- 99 disqualify such person from having a license under this section,
- 100 until final disposition of the case. The provisions of subsection
- 101 (7) of this section shall apply to any suspension or revocation of
- 102 a license pursuant to the provisions of this section.
- 103 (4) The application shall be completed, under oath, on a
- 104 form promulgated by the Department of Public Safety and shall
- 105 include only:
- 106 (a) The name, address, place and date of birth, race,
- 107 sex and occupation of the applicant;
- 108 (b) The driver's license number or social security
- 109 number of applicant;
- 110 (c) Any previous address of the applicant for the two
- 111 (2) years preceding the date of the application;
- 112 (d) A statement that the applicant is in compliance
- 113 with criteria contained within subsections (2) and (3) of this
- 114 section;
- (e) A statement that the applicant has been furnished a
- 116 copy of this section and is knowledgeable of its provisions;
- (f) A conspicuous warning that the application is
- 118 executed under oath and that a knowingly false answer to any

119	question,	or	the	knowing	submission	of	any	false	document	by	the
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- 120 applicant, subjects the applicant to criminal prosecution; and
- 121 (g) A statement that the applicant desires a legal
- 122 means to carry a stun gun, concealed pistol or revolver to defend
- 123 himself.
- 124 (5) The applicant shall submit only the following to the
- 125 Department of Public Safety:
- 126 (a) A completed application as described in subsection
- 127 (4) of this section;
- 128 (b) A full-face photograph of the applicant taken
- 129 within the preceding thirty (30) days in which the head, including
- 130 hair, in a size as determined by the Department of Public Safety,
- 131 except that an applicant who is younger than twenty-one (21) years
- 132 of age must submit a photograph in profile of the applicant;
- 133 (c) A nonrefundable license fee of Eighty Dollars
- 134 (\$80.00). Costs for processing the set of fingerprints as
- 135 required in paragraph (d) of this subsection shall be borne by the
- 136 applicant. Honorably retired law enforcement officers, disabled
- 137 veterans and active duty members of the Armed Forces of the United
- 138 States shall be exempt from the payment of the license fee;
- 139 (d) A full set of fingerprints of the applicant
- 140 administered by the Department of Public Safety; and
- (e) A waiver authorizing the Department of Public
- 142 Safety access to any records concerning commitments of the
- 143 applicant to any of the treatment facilities or institutions

- referred to in subsection (2) and permitting access to all the applicant's criminal records.
- 146 (6) (a) The Department of Public Safety, upon receipt of
 147 the items listed in subsection (5) of this section, shall forward
 148 the full set of fingerprints of the applicant to the appropriate
 149 agencies for state and federal processing.
- 150 The Department of Public Safety shall forward a 151 copy of the applicant's application to the sheriff of the 152 applicant's county of residence and, if applicable, the police 153 chief of the applicant's municipality of residence. The sheriff 154 of the applicant's county of residence and, if applicable, the 155 police chief of the applicant's municipality of residence may, at 156 his discretion, participate in the process by submitting a 157 voluntary report to the Department of Public Safety containing any readily discoverable prior information that he feels may be 158 159 pertinent to the licensing of any applicant. The reporting shall 160 be made within thirty (30) days after the date he receives the copy of the application. Upon receipt of a response from a 161 162 sheriff or police chief, such sheriff or police chief shall be 163 reimbursed at a rate set by the department.
- 164 (c) The Department of Public Safety shall, within

 165 forty-five (45) days after the date of receipt of the items listed

 166 in subsection (5) of this section:
- 167 (i) Issue the license;

168	(ii) Deny the application based solely on the
169	ground that the applicant fails to qualify under the criteria
170	listed in subsections (2) and (3) of this section. If the
171	Department of Public Safety denies the application, it shall
172	notify the applicant in writing, stating the ground for denial,
173	and the denial shall be subject to the appeal process set forth in
174	subsection (7); or
175	(iii) Notify the applicant that the department is

- (iii) Notify the applicant that the department is unable to make a determination regarding the issuance or denial of a license within the forty-five-day period prescribed by this subsection, and provide an estimate of the amount of time the department will need to make the determination.
- 180 In the event a legible set of fingerprints, as 181 determined by the Department of Public Safety and the Federal 182 Bureau of Investigation, cannot be obtained after a minimum of two 183 (2) attempts, the Department of Public Safety shall determine 184 eliqibility based upon a name check by the Mississippi Highway 185 Safety Patrol and a Federal Bureau of Investigation name check 186 conducted by the Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol at the request 187 of the Department of Public Safety.
- 188 (7) (a) If the Department of Public Safety denies the
 189 issuance of a license, or suspends or revokes a license, the party
 190 aggrieved may appeal such denial, suspension or revocation to the
 191 Commissioner of Public Safety, or his authorized agent, within
 192 thirty (30) days after the aggrieved party receives written notice

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of such denial, suspension or revocation. The Commissioner of
Public Safety, or his duly authorized agent, shall rule upon such
appeal within thirty (30) days after the appeal is filed and
failure to rule within this thirty-day period shall constitute
sustaining such denial, suspension or revocation. Such review
shall be conducted pursuant to such reasonable rules and
regulations as the Commissioner of Public Safety may adopt.

- (b) If the revocation, suspension or denial of issuance is sustained by the Commissioner of Public Safety, or his duly authorized agent pursuant to paragraph (a) of this subsection, the aggrieved party may file within ten (10) days after the rendition of such decision a petition in the circuit or county court of his residence for review of such decision. A hearing for review shall be held and shall proceed before the court without a jury upon the record made at the hearing before the Commissioner of Public Safety or his duly authorized agent. No such party shall be allowed to carry a stun gun, concealed pistol or revolver pursuant to the provisions of this section while any such appeal is pending.
- 212 (8) The Department of Public Safety shall maintain an
 213 automated listing of license holders and such information shall be
 214 available online, upon request, at all times, to all law
 215 enforcement agencies through the Mississippi Crime Information
 216 Center. However, the records of the department relating to
 217 applications for licenses to carry stun guns, concealed pistols or

- 218 revolvers and records relating to license holders shall be exempt
- 219 from the provisions of the Mississippi Public Records Act of 1983,
- 220 and shall be released only upon order of a court having proper
- 221 jurisdiction over a petition for release of the record or records.
- 222 (9) Within thirty (30) days after the changing of a
- 223 permanent address, or within thirty (30) days after having a
- 224 license lost or destroyed, the licensee shall notify the
- 225 Department of Public Safety in writing of such change or loss.
- 226 Failure to notify the Department of Public Safety pursuant to the
- 227 provisions of this subsection shall constitute a noncriminal
- 228 violation with a penalty of Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) and shall
- 229 be enforceable by a summons.
- 230 (10) In the event that a stun gun, concealed pistol or
- 231 revolver license is lost or destroyed, the person to whom the
- 232 license was issued shall comply with the provisions of subsection
- 233 (9) of this section and may obtain a duplicate, or substitute
- 234 thereof, upon payment of Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00) to the
- 235 Department of Public Safety, and furnishing a notarized statement
- 236 to the department that such license has been lost or destroyed.
- 237 (11) A license issued under this section shall be revoked if
- 238 the licensee becomes ineligible under the criteria set forth in
- 239 subsection (2) of this section.
- 240 (12) (a) No less than ninety (90) days prior to the

- 241 expiration date of the license, the Department of Public Safety
- 242 shall mail to each licensee a written notice of the expiration and

243 a renewal form prescribed by the department. The licensee m	sibed by the department. The licensee must
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- 244 renew his license on or before the expiration date by filing with
- 245 the department the renewal form, \star * certification that the
- 246 licensee remains qualified pursuant to the criteria specified in
- 247 subsections (2) and (3) of this section, and a full set of
- 248 fingerprints administered by the Department of Public Safety or
- 249 the sheriff of the county of residence of the licensee.
- 250 The first renewal may be processed by mail and the subsequent
- 251 renewal must be made in person. Thereafter every other renewal
- 252 may be processed by mail to assure that the applicant must appear
- 253 in person every ten (10) years for the purpose of obtaining a new
- 254 photograph.
- 255 (i) Except as provided in this subsection, a
- 256 renewal fee of Forty Dollars (\$40.00) shall also be submitted
- 257 along with costs for processing the fingerprints;
- 258 (ii) Honorably retired law enforcement officers,
- 259 disabled veterans and active duty members of the Armed Forces of
- 260 the United States shall be exempt from the renewal fee; and
- 261 (iii) The renewal fee for a Mississippi resident
- 262 aged sixty-five (65) years of age or older shall be Twenty Dollars
- 263 (\$20.00).
- 264 (b) The Department of Public Safety shall forward the
- 265 full set of fingerprints of the applicant to the appropriate
- 266 agencies for state and federal processing. The license shall be

- renewed upon receipt of the completed renewal application and appropriate payment of fees.
- on or before its expiration date must renew his license by paying
 a late fee of Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00). No license shall be
 renewed six (6) months or more after its expiration date, and such
 license shall be deemed to be permanently expired. A person whose

A licensee who fails to file a renewal application

- 274 license has been permanently expired may reapply for licensure;
- 275 however, an application for licensure and fees pursuant to
- 276 subsection (5) of this section must be submitted, and a background
- 277 investigation shall be conducted pursuant to the provisions of
- 278 this section.

- 279 (13) No license issued pursuant to this section shall
- 280 authorize any person to carry a stun gun, concealed pistol or
- 281 revolver into any place of nuisance as defined in Section 95-3-1,
- 282 Mississippi Code of 1972; any police, sheriff or highway patrol
- 283 station; any detention facility, prison or jail; any courthouse;
- 284 any courtroom, except that nothing in this section shall preclude
- 285 a judge from carrying a concealed weapon or determining who will
- 286 carry a concealed weapon in his courtroom; any polling place; any
- 287 meeting place of the governing body of any governmental entity;
- 288 any meeting of the Legislature or a committee thereof; any school,
- 289 college or professional athletic event not related to firearms;
- 290 any portion of an establishment, licensed to dispense alcoholic
- 291 beverages for consumption on the premises, that is primarily

292 devoted to dispensing alcoholic beverages; any portion of an establishment in which beer, light spirit product or light wine is 293 294 consumed on the premises, that is primarily devoted to such 295 purpose; any elementary or secondary school facility; any junior 296 college, community college, college or university facility unless 297 for the purpose of participating in any authorized 298 firearms-related activity; inside the passenger terminal of any airport, except that no person shall be prohibited from carrying 299 300 any legal firearm into the terminal if the firearm is encased for shipment, for purposes of checking such firearm as baggage to be 301 302 lawfully transported on any aircraft; any church or other place of 303 worship, except as provided in Section 45-9-171; or any place 304 where the carrying of firearms is prohibited by federal law. 305 addition to the places enumerated in this subsection, the carrying 306 of a stun gun, concealed pistol or revolver may be disallowed in 307 any place in the discretion of the person or entity exercising 308 control over the physical location of such place by the placing of a written notice clearly readable at a distance of not less than 309 310 ten (10) feet that the "carrying of a pistol or revolver is 311 prohibited." No license issued pursuant to this section shall 312 authorize the participants in a parade or demonstration for which 313 a permit is required to carry a stun gun, concealed pistol or 314 revolver.

315 (14) A law enforcement officer as defined in Section 45-6-3, 316 chiefs of police, sheriffs and persons licensed as professional

- 317 bondsmen pursuant to Chapter 39, Title 83, Mississippi Code of
- 318 1972, shall be exempt from the licensing requirements of this
- 319 section. The licensing requirements of this section do not apply
- 320 to the carrying by any person of a stun gun, pistol or revolver,
- 321 knife, or other deadly weapon that is not concealed as defined in
- 322 Section 97-37-1.
- 323 (15) Any person who knowingly submits a false answer to any
- 324 question on an application for a license issued pursuant to this
- 325 section, or who knowingly submits a false document when applying
- 326 for a license issued pursuant to this section, shall, upon
- 327 conviction, be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished as
- 328 provided in Section 99-19-31, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 329 (16) All fees collected by the Department of Public Safety
- 330 pursuant to this section shall be deposited into a special fund
- 331 hereby created in the State Treasury and shall be used for
- 332 implementation and administration of this section. After the
- 333 close of each fiscal year, the balance in this fund shall be
- 334 certified to the Legislature and then may be used by the
- 335 Department of Public Safety as directed by the Legislature.
- 336 (17) All funds received by a sheriff or police chief
- 337 pursuant to the provisions of this section shall be deposited into
- 338 the general fund of the county or municipality, as appropriate,
- 339 and shall be budgeted to the sheriff's office or police department
- 340 as appropriate.

341	(18) Nothing in	this	section	shall b	oe construed	to	require
342	or allow the registra	tion, o	document	ation c	or providing	of	serial
343	numbers with regard t	o anv :	stun qun	or fir	rearm.		

- Any person holding a valid unrevoked and unexpired 344 345 license to carry stun guns, concealed pistols or revolvers issued 346 in another state shall have such license recognized by this state 347 to carry stun guns, concealed pistols or revolvers. The Department of Public Safety is authorized to enter into a 348 349 reciprocal agreement with another state if that state requires a 350 written agreement in order to recognize licenses to carry stun 351 guns, concealed pistols or revolvers issued by this state.
- 352 (20) The provisions of this section shall be under the 353 supervision of the Commissioner of Public Safety. The 354 commissioner is authorized to promulgate reasonable rules and 355 regulations to carry out the provisions of this section.
 - (21) For the purposes of this section, the term "stun gun" means a portable device or weapon from which an electric current, impulse, wave or beam may be directed, which current, impulse, wave or beam is designed to incapacitate temporarily, injure, momentarily stun, knock out, cause mental disorientation or paralyze.
- 362 (22) (a) From and after January 1, 2016, the Commissioner 363 of Public Safety shall promulgate rules and regulations which 364 provide that licenses authorized by this section for honorably 365 retired law enforcement officers and honorably retired

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correctional officers from the Mississippi Department of

Corrections shall (i) include the words "retired law enforcement

officer" on the front of the license, and (ii) that the license

itself have a red background to distinguish it from other licenses

issued under this section.

- 371 An honorably retired law enforcement officer and 372 honorably retired correctional officer shall provide the following information to receive the license described in this section: 373 374 a letter, with the official letterhead of the agency or department 375 from which such officer is retiring, which explains that such officer is honorably retired, and (ii) a letter with the official 376 377 letterhead of the agency or department, which explains that such 378 officer has completed a certified law enforcement training 379 academy.
- 380 (23) A disabled veteran who seeks to qualify for an
 381 exemption under this section shall be required to provide a
 382 veterans health services identification card issued by the United
 383 States Department of Veterans Affairs indicating a
 384 service-connected disability, which shall be sufficient proof of
 385 such service-connected disability.
- 386 (24) A license under this section is not required for a
 387 loaded or unloaded pistol or revolver to be carried upon the
 388 person in a sheath, belt holster or shoulder holster or in a
 389 purse, handbag, satchel, other similar bag or briefcase or fully
 390 enclosed case if the person is not engaged in criminal activity

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- 392 prohibited from possessing a pistol or revolver under state or
- 393 federal law, and is not in a location prohibited under subsection
- 394 (13) of this section.
- 395 **SECTION 2.** Section 63-11-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 396 amended as follows:
- 397 63-11-25. If the forfeiture, suspension or denial of
- 398 issuance is sustained by the Commissioner of Public Safety, or his
- 399 duly authorized agent pursuant to subsection (1) of Section
- 400 63-11-23, upon such hearing, the person aggrieved may file within
- 401 ten (10) days after the rendition of such decision a petition in
- 402 the circuit or county court having original jurisdiction of the
- 403 violation for review of such decision and such hearing upon review
- 404 shall proceed as a trial de novo before the court without a jury.
- 405 The petition shall be served upon the Attorney General and the
- 406 Commissioner of Public Safety. Provided further, that no such
- 407 party shall be allowed to exercise the driving privilege while any
- 408 such appeal is pending.
- 409 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 410 and after July 1, 2021.
