HOUSE BILL NO. 352

- AN ACT TO CREATE NEW SECTION 73-60-47, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REQUIRE APPLICANTS FOR LICENSURE AS A HOME INSPECTOR TO UNDERGO CERTAIN BACKGROUND CHECKS; TO AMEND SECTIONS 73-60-11 AND 73-60-31, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CONFORM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 7 **SECTION 1.** The following shall be codified as Section
- 8 73-60-47, Mississippi Code of 1972:
- 9 73-60-47. (1) (a) To qualify for a Mississippi home
- 10 inspector license, an applicant must have successfully been
- 11 cleared for licensure through an investigation that shall consist
- 12 of a determination that the applicant does not possess a
- 13 background which calls into question public trust, as set forth
- 14 below in subsection (2), and verification that the prospective
- 15 licensee is not guilty of or in violation of any statutory ground
- 16 for denial of licensure as set forth in Section 73-60-31.
- 17 (b) To assist the commission in conducting its

- 18 licensure investigation, on or after July 1, 2021, all applicants
- 19 for a Mississippi home inspector license, and all applicants for

- 20 renewal of any home inspector license shall undergo a
- 21 fingerprint-based criminal history records check of the
- 22 Mississippi central criminal database and the Federal Bureau of
- 23 Investigation criminal history database. Each applicant shall
- 24 submit a full set of the applicant's fingerprints in a form and
- 25 manner prescribed by the commission, which shall be forwarded to
- 26 the Mississippi Department of Public Safety (department) and the
- 27 Federal Bureau of Investigation Identification Division for this
- 28 purpose.
- 29 (c) Any and all state or national criminal history
- 30 records information obtained by the commission that is not already
- 31 a matter of public record shall be deemed nonpublic and
- 32 confidential information restricted to the exclusive use of the
- 33 commission, its members, officers, investigators, agents and
- 34 attorneys in evaluating the applicant's eligibility or
- 35 disqualification for licensure, and shall be exempt from the
- 36 Mississippi Public Records Act of 1983. Except when introduced
- 37 into evidence in a hearing before the commission to determine
- 38 licensure, no such information or records related thereto shall,
- 39 except with the written consent of the applicant or by order of a
- 40 court of competent jurisdiction, be released or otherwise
- 41 disclosed by the commission to any other person or agency.
- 42 (d) The commission shall provide to the department the
- 43 fingerprints of the applicant, any additional information that may
- 44 be required by the department, and a form signed by the applicant

- 45 consenting to the check of the criminal records and to the use of
- 46 the fingerprints and other identifying information required by the
- state or national repositories. 47
- The commission shall charge and collect from the 48
- 49 applicant, in addition to all other applicable fees and costs,
- 50 such amount as may be incurred by the commission in requesting and
- obtaining state and national criminal history records information 51
- 52 on the applicant.
- 53 (2) (a) The commission must ensure that applicants for home
- 54 inspector licenses do not possess a background that could call
- 55 into question public trust. An applicant found by the commission
- 56 to possess a background which calls into question the applicant's
- 57 ability to maintain public trust shall not be issued a home
- inspector license. 58

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- 59 (b) The commission shall not issue a home inspector
- 60 license if:
- 61 The applicant has had a home inspector license (i)
- revoked in any governmental jurisdiction within the five-year 62
- 63 period immediately preceding the date of the application;
- 64 The applicant has been convicted of, or pled (ii)
- 65 quilty or nolo contendere to, a felony in a domestic or foreign
- court involving an act of fraud, dishonesty or a breach of trust, 66
- 67 or money laundering at any time preceding the date of the
- application if, in the discretion of the commission following 68

- 69 notice to the applicant and a hearing, good cause exists to deny
- 70 or not renew licensure.
- 71 Applicants for a home inspector license or renewal
- 72 of a home inspector license who hold any other license falling
- 73 under the jurisdiction of the commission requiring a background
- 74 check shall not be required to pay for more than one (1)
- 75 background check during a calendar year.
- 76 The commission shall adopt rules and regulations
- 77 necessary to implement, administer and enforce the provisions of
- 78 this section.
- 79 SECTION 2. Section 73-60-11, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- amended as follows: 80
- 81 73-60-11. (1) An application for an original license shall
- be made in writing to the commission on forms as the commission 82
- 83 may prescribe and shall be accompanied by the required fee and
- 84 proof of liability insurance and errors and omissions insurance.
- 85 To qualify for a license under this chapter, a person
- 86 shall:
- 87 Have successfully completed high school or its
- 88 equivalent;
- 89 (b) Be at least twenty-one (21) years of age;
- 90 Have successfully completed an approved course of
- 91 study of at least sixty (60) hours that may include field work as
- prescribed by the commission; 92

- 95 (e) Provide a certificate of insurance for errors and
- 96 omissions and general liability insurance (in the required
- 97 amounts) pursuant to Section 73-60-15 * * *; and
- 98 (f) Have passed a background investigation pursuant to
- 99 Section 73-60-47.
- 100 (3) The commission must review each application for a
- 101 license submitted to it and must notify each applicant that the
- 102 application is either accepted or rejected. The commission must
- 103 send notification of acceptance or rejections to the applicant at
- 104 the address provided by the applicant in the application within
- 105 thirty (30) days of receiving the application. If the application
- 106 is rejected, the notice sent to the applicant must state the
- 107 reasons for the rejection.
- SECTION 3. Section 73-60-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 109 amended as follows:
- 110 73-60-31. The commission may refuse to issue or to renew or
- 111 may revoke or suspend a license or may place on probation,
- 112 censure, reprimand, or take other disciplinary action with regard
- 113 to any license issued under this chapter, including the issuance
- 114 of fines for each violation, for any one (1) or combination of the
- 115 following causes:
- 116 (a) Violations of this chapter or the commission's
- 117 rules promulgated pursuant hereto;

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| 119 | (c) Conviction of a felony or making a plea of guilty |
