HOUSE BILL NO. 550 (As Sent to Governor)

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 45-33-43, 63-1-5, 63-1-9, 63-1-10.1, 63-1-23, 63-1-35, 63-1-43 AND 63-1-47, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO DELETE ALL REFERENCES TO AN INTERMEDIATE DRIVER'S LICENSE; TO AMEND SECTION 63-1-21, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE A REGULAR LICENSE HOLDER UNDER THE AGE OF 18 TO DRIVE UNSUPERVISED AT ANY TIME DIRECTLY TO OR FROM AN EDUCATIONAL OR EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITY; TO CONFORM TO THE PRECEDING SECTIONS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- 9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- SECTION 1. Section 45-33-43, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 11 amended as follows:
- 12 45-33-43. At the time a person surrenders a driver's license
- 13 from another jurisdiction or makes an application for a driver's
- 14 license, temporary driving permit, * * * commercial driver's
- 15 license or identification card issued under Section 45-35-3, the
- 16 department shall provide the applicant with written information on
- 17 the registration requirements of this chapter and shall require
- 18 written acknowledgment by the applicant of receipt of the

- 19 notification.
- 20 **SECTION 2.** Section 63-1-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 21 amended as follows:

- 22 63-1-5. (1) (a) No person shall drive or operate a motor
- 23 vehicle or an autocycle as defined in Section 63-3-103 upon the
- 24 highways of the State of Mississippi without first securing an
- 25 operator's license to drive on the highways of the state, unless
- 26 specifically exempted by Section 63-1-7.
- 27 (b) The types of operator's licenses are:
- 28 (i) Class R;
- 29 (ii) Class D;
- 30 (iii) Class A, B or C commercial license governed
- 31 by Article 5 of this chapter; and
- 32 * * *
- 33 (* * *iv) Interlock-restricted license as
- 34 prescribed in Section 63-11-31.
- 35 (2) (a) Every person who makes application for an original
- 36 license or a renewal license to operate any single vehicle with a
- 37 gross weight rating of less than twenty-six thousand one (26,001)
- 38 pounds or any vehicle towing a vehicle with a gross vehicle weight
- 39 rating not in excess of ten thousand (10,000) pounds other than
- 40 vehicles included in Class C, vehicles which require a special
- 41 endorsement, or to operate a vehicle as a common carrier by motor
- 42 vehicle, taxicab, passenger coach, dray, contract carrier or
- 43 private commercial carrier as defined in Section 27-19-3, other
- 44 than those vehicles for which a Class A, B or C license is
- 45 required under Article 5 of this chapter, may, in lieu of the
- 46 Class R regular driver's license, apply for and obtain a Class D

- 47 driver's license. The fee for the issuance of a Class D driver's
- 48 license shall be as set forth in Section 63-1-43 and the Class D
- 49 license shall be valid for the term prescribed in Section 63-1-47.
- 50 Except as required under Article 5 of this chapter, no driver of a
- 51 pickup truck shall be required to have a Class D or a commercial
- 52 license regardless of the purpose for which the pickup truck is
- 53 used.
- 54 (b) Persons operating vehicles listed in paragraph (a)
- of this subsection for private purposes or in emergencies need not
- 56 obtain a Class D license.
- 57 (3) An interlock-restricted license allows a person to drive
- 58 only a motor vehicle equipped with an iginition-interlock device.
- 59 (4) A person who violates this section is guilty of a
- 60 misdemeanor and, upon conviction, may be punished by imprisonment
- 61 for not less than two (2) days nor more than six (6) months, by a
- 62 fine of not less than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) nor more than
- 63 Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), or both.
- SECTION 3. Section 63-1-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 65 amended as follows:
- 66 63-1-9. (1) No driver's license * * * or regular learner's
- 67 permit shall be issued pursuant to this article:
- 68 (a) To any person under the age of eighteen (18) years
- 69 except as provided in this article.
- 70 (b) To any person whose license to operate a motor

71 vehicle on the highways of Mississippi has been previously revoked

- 72 or suspended by this state or any other state or territory of the
- 73 United States or the District of Columbia, if the revocation or
- 74 suspension period has not expired.
- 75 (c) To any person who is an habitual drunkard or who is
- 76 addicted to the use of other narcotic drugs.
- 77 (d) To any person who would not be able by reason of
- 78 physical or mental disability to operate a motor vehicle on the
- 79 highways with safety. However, persons who have one (1) arm or
- 80 leg, or have arms or legs deformed, and are driving a car provided
- 81 with mechanical devices whereby the person is able to drive in a
- 82 safe manner over the highways, if otherwise qualified, shall
- 83 receive an operator's license the same as other persons.
- 84 Moreover, deafness shall not be a bar to obtaining a license.
- 85 (e) To any person as an operator who has previously
- 86 been adjudged to be afflicted with and suffering from any mental
- 87 disability and who has not at time of application been restored to
- 88 mental competency.
- 89 (f) To any unmarried person under the age of eighteen
- 90 (18) years who does not at the time of application present a
- 91 diploma or other certificate of high school graduation or a
- 92 general educational development certificate issued to the person
- 93 in this state or any other state; or on whose behalf documentation
- 94 has not been received by the Department of Public Safety from that
- 95 person or a school official verifying that the person:

- 97 in a course leading to a general educational development
- 98 certificate;
- 99 (ii) Is enrolled in school in this state or any
- 100 other state;
- 101 (iii) Is enrolled in a "nonpublic school," as such
- 102 term is defined in Section 37-13-91(2)(i); or
- 103 (iv) Is unable to attend any school program due to
- 104 circumstances deemed acceptable as set out in Section 63-1-10.
- 105 (g) To any person under the age of eighteen (18) years
- 106 who has been convicted under Section 63-11-30.
- 107 (2) All permits and licenses issued on or before July 31,
- 108 2009, shall be valid according to the terms upon which issued.
- 109 From and after August 1, 2009:
- 110 (a) A regular learner's permit may be issued to any
- 111 person who is at least fifteen (15) years of age who otherwise
- 112 meets the requirements of this article.
- 113 * * *
- 114 (* * *b) A driver's license may be issued to any
- 115 person who is at least * * * sixteen (16) years of age who
- 116 otherwise meets the requirements of this article and who has
- 117 held * * * a regular learner's permit for at least one (1) year
- 118 without any conviction under Section 63-11-30 or of a moving
- 119 violation. Any conviction under Section 63-11-30 or of a moving
- 120 violation shall restart the \star \star one-year requirement for the

- 121 holding of * * * a regular learner's permit before an applicant
- 122 can qualify for a driver's license. * * *
- 123 (* * *c) An applicant for a Mississippi driver's
- 124 license who, at the time of application, is at least * * * sixteen
- 125 (16) years of age and who has held a valid motor vehicle driver's
- 126 license issued by another state for at least six (6) months shall
- 127 not be required to hold a regular learner's permit * * * before
- 128 being issued a driver's license.
- 129 (3) The commissioner shall ensure that the regular learner's
- 130 permit * * * and driver's license issued under this article are
- 131 clear, distinct and easily distinguishable from one another.
- 132 **SECTION 4.** Section 63-1-10.1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 133 amended as follows:
- 134 63-1-10.1. A school superintendent or designee shall report
- 135 to the Department of Education on a schedule determined by the
- 136 State Board of Education when a student under eighteen (18) years
- of age who has been issued a driver's license * * * or temporary
- 138 learning permit has been coded as a "drop out" as defined by the
- 139 State Board of Education. The Department of Education will
- 140 provide notification to the Department of Public Safety of those
- 141 students under eighteen (18) years of age who have obtained a
- 142 driver's license * * * or temporary learning permit and have been
- 143 coded by the local school district as a "drop out" upon
- 144 verification that prior written parental consent for the release
- 145 of educational records has been obtained in compliance with the

- 146 Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1972, as amended, 20
- 147 USCS Section 1232.
- 148 **SECTION 5.** Section 63-1-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 149 amended as follows:
- 150 63-1-21. (1) To obtain a new or original Class R or Class
- 151 D * * * license, every applicant other than a person holding a
- 152 valid out-of-state license shall first obtain a regular learner's
- 153 permit, successfully complete the examination provided for in
- 154 Section 63-1-33, and pay the regular learner's permit fee and
- examination fee prescribed in Section 63-1-43.
- 156 (2) A regular learner's permit entitles the holder, if the
- 157 permit is in his immediate possession, to drive a motor vehicle
- 158 other than a motorcycle on the highways of the State of
- 159 Mississippi only when accompanied by a licensed operator who is at
- 160 least twenty-one (21) years of age and who is actually occupying
- 161 the seat beside the driver. A regular learner's permit may be
- 162 issued to any applicant who is at least fifteen (15) years of age
- and shall be valid for a period of two (2) years from the date of
- 164 issue.
- 165 (3) * * * A regular license holder under the age of eighteen
- 166 (18) shall be allowed unsupervised driving from 6:00 a.m. to 10:00
- 167 p.m. Sunday through Thursday and 6:00 a.m. to 11:30 p.m. Friday
- 168 and Saturday, and * * * shall be allowed unsupervised driving any
- 169 time for a person traveling directly to or from work or other

170 educational or extracurricular activity. At all other times * * *

- 171 for the first six (6) months as a regular license holder, the
- 172 regular license holder under the age of eighteen (18) must be
- 173 supervised by a parent, guardian or other person aged twenty-one
- 174 (21) years or older who holds a valid driver's license under this
- 175 article and who is actually occupying the seat beside the driver.
- 176 * * *
- SECTION 6. Section 63-1-23, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 178 amended as follows:
- 179 63-1-23. The application of any person under the age of
- 180 seventeen (17) years for a temporary driving permit * * * or
- 181 license issued pursuant to this article shall be signed and
- 182 verified before a person authorized to administer oaths by both
- 183 the father and mother of the applicant, if both are living and
- 184 have custody of him, or in the event neither parent is living then
- 185 by the person or quardian having such custody or by an employer of
- 186 him, or in the event there is no guardian or employer then by any
- 187 other responsible person who is willing to assume the obligation
- 188 imposed under Section 63-1-25 upon a person signing the
- 189 application of a minor.
- 190 **SECTION 7.** Section 63-1-35, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 191 amended as follows:
- 192 63-1-35. (1) The Commissioner of Public Safety shall
- 193 prescribe the form of license issued pursuant to this article
- 194 which shall, among other features, include a driver's license

195 number assigned by the Department of Public Safety. A licensee

196 shall list his social security number with the department which 197 shall cross reference the social security number with the driver's 198 license number for purposes of identification. Additionally, each 199 license shall bear a full-face color photograph of the licensee in 200 such form that the license and the photograph cannot be separated. 201 The photograph shall be taken so that one (1) exposure will 202 photograph the applicant and the application simultaneously on the 203 same film. The department shall use a process in the issuance of 204 a license with a color photograph that shall prevent as nearly as 205 possible any alteration, counterfeiting, duplication, 206 reproduction, forging or modification of the license or the 207 superimposition of a photograph without ready detection. 208 photograph shall be replaced by the department at the time of 209 renewal. Drivers' licenses, including photographs appearing 210 thereon, may be renewed by electronic means according to rules and 211 regulations promulgated by the commissioner in conformity to Section 27-104-33. 212

- (2) The commissioner shall prescribe the form of license issued pursuant to this article to licensees who are not United States citizens and who do not possess a social security number issued by the United States government. The license of such persons shall include a number and/or other identifying features.
- 218 (3) Any new, renewal or duplicate driver's license,
 219 temporary driving permit * * * or commercial driver's license
 220 issued to a person required to register as a sex offender pursuant

221	to Section 45-33-25 shall bear a designation identifying the
222	licensee or permittee as a sex offender.
223	(4) The commissioner is authorized to provide the new,
224	renewal or duplicate driver's license, temporary driving
225	permit * * * or commercial driver's license to any honorably
226	discharged veteran as defined in Title 38 of the United States
227	Code, and such license or permit shall exhibit the letters "Vet"
228	or any other mark identifying the person as a veteran. The
229	veteran requesting the "Vet" designation shall present his DD-214
230	or equivalent document that includes a notation from the State
231	Veterans Affairs Board that the applicant is a veteran.
232	(5) Not later than July 1, 2021, the commissioner shall
233	develop and implement a driver's license or driving permit in
234	electronic format as an additional option for license or permit
235	holders. Acceptable electronic formats include display of
236	electronic images on a cellular phone or any other type of
237	electronic device.
238	SECTION 8. Section 63-1-43, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
239	amended as follows:
240	63-1-43. (1) The commissioner shall charge and collect the
241	following fees:
242	(a) Fees to which the card stock fee authorized in

- 301 renewal license for which the fee is greater than Ten Dollars
- 302 (\$10.00), if the applicant brings all required documentation but
- 303 does not receive his or her license within two and one-half
- 304 (2-1/2) hours of entering and remaining at the license station,
- 305 Ten Dollars (\$10.00) shall be deducted from the total amount owed
- 306 for the license.
- 307 (2) All originals and renewals of operators' licenses shall
- 308 be in compliance with Section 63-1-47.
- 309 **SECTION 9.** Section 63-1-47, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 310 amended as follows:
- 311 63-1-47. (1) (a) Except as otherwise provided in this
- 312 section, each applicant for an original or renewal Class R or
- 313 Class D license issued pursuant to this article, who is entitled
- 314 to issuance of same, shall be issued a four-year license or an
- 315 eight-year license, at the option of the applicant, which will
- 316 expire at midnight on the licensee's birthday and may be renewed
- 317 any time within six (6) months before the expiration of the
- 318 license upon application and payment of the required fee, unless
- 319 required to be reexamined.
- 320 * * *

- 321 (* * *b) The term of an ignition-interlock-restricted 322 license issued under this article shall be four (4) years.
- 323 Any commercial driver's license issued under Article 5 324 of this chapter shall be issued for a five-year term to expire at 325 midnight on the licensee's birthday.
- 326 (3) (a) All applications by an operator under eighteen (18) 327 years of age must be accompanied by documentation that the 328 applicant is in compliance with the education requirements of 329 Section 63-1-9(1)(g), and the documentation used in establishing 330 compliance must be dated no more than thirty (30) days before the 331 date of application.
- 332 All applications by an operator under eighteen (18) 333 years of age, if applicable, must be accompanied by documentation 334 signed and notarized by the parent or quardian of the applicant and the appropriate school official, authorizing the release of 335 336 the applicant's attendance records to the Department of Public 337 Safety as required under Section 63-1-10.
- The commissioner shall suspend the driver's 338 339 license * * * or regular learner's permit of a student under 340 eighteen (18) years of age who has been reported by the Department 341 of Education as required by Section 63-1-10.1, and shall give 342 notice of the suspension to the licensee as provided in Section 63-1-52(4). A school superintendent or designee may request that 343 the driver's license * * * or regular learner's permit that has 344 been suspended under the provisions of this subsection be 345

- 348 (4) (a) Any original or renewal license issued under this chapter to a person who is not a United States citizen shall 349 350 expire four (4) years from the date of issuance or on the 351 expiration date of the applicant's authorized stay in the United 352 States, whichever is the lesser period of time, and may be renewed, if the person is otherwise qualified to renew the 353 354 license, within thirty (30) days of expiration. The fee for any 355 such license and for renewal shall be as prescribed in Section 356 63-1-43.
- 357 (b) Any applicant for an original or renewal license 358 under this subsection (4) must present valid documentary evidence 359 documenting that the applicant:
- 360 (i) Is a citizen or national of the United States;
- 361 (ii) Is an alien lawfully admitted for permanent or temporary residence in the United States;
- 363 (iii) Has conditional permanent residence status 364 in the United States;
- 365 (iv) Has an approved application for asylum in the 366 United States or has entered into the United States in refugee 367 status;
- (v) Has a valid, unexpired nonimmigrant visa or nonimmigrant visa status for entry into or lawful presence in the United States;

371	(vi) Has a pending application for asylum in the
372	United States;
373	(vii) Has a pending or approved application for
374	temporary protected status in the United States;
375	(viii) Has approved deferred-action status;
376	(ix) Has a pending application for adjustment of
377	status to that of an alien lawfully admitted for permanent
378	residence in the United States or conditional permanent resident
379	status in the United States; or
380	(x) Has a valid employment authorization card
381	issued by the United States Department of Homeland Security.
382	(5) For any driver's license issued under this chapter, the
383	Department of Public Safety shall send an email and text message
384	notification of an upcoming driver's license expiration date to
385	the known emails and phone numbers authorized by license holders
386	for such notices not less than thirty (30) days before the
387	expiration date of that license.
388	SECTION 10. This act shall take effect and be in force from
389	and after its passage.
