HOUSE BILL NO. 775

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 25-53-191, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO EXEMPT STATE INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING AND THEIR AGENTS AND FACULTY MEMBERS FROM THE PROVISIONS GOVERNING THE ACQUISITION AND USE OF CERTAIN WIRELESS COMMUNICATIONS DEVICES; TO AUTHORIZE 5 STATE IHLS, WITH APPROVAL OF THE IHL BOARD, TO USE THE EXPRESS 6 PRODUCTS LIST (EPL) COMPILED BY THE MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF 7 INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY SERVICES (MDITS) TO NEGOTIATE BEST PRICING WHEN MAKING PURCHASES OF ALL NEEDED INFORMATION WIRELESS 8 9 COMMUNICATION DEVICES, TELECOMMUNICATIONS EQUIPMENT, SOFTWARE 10 PROGRAMS AND SERVICES AND SERVICE PLANS TO PROMOTE ACCESS, FUNCTIONALITY AND EFFICIENT USE IN THE DELIVERY OF EDUCATIONAL 11 12 INSTRUCTION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 14 **SECTION 1.** Section 25-53-191, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 15 amended as follows:
- 16 25-53-191. (1) For the purposes of this section, the
- 17 following terms shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this
- 18 section unless the context otherwise clearly requires:

- 19 (a) "Department" means the Mississippi Department of
- 20 Information Technology.
- (b) "State agency" means any agency, department,
- 22 commission, board, bureau, institution or other instrumentality of
- 23 the state.

- Before a wireless communication device may be assigned, 27 (2) 28 issued or made available to an agency officer or employee, the 29 agency head, or his designee, shall sign a statement certifying the need or reason for issuing the device. No officer or employee 30 31 of any state agency, except for an officer or employee of the 32 Mississippi Emergency Management Agency, shall be assigned or issued more than one (1) such wireless communication device. No 33 34 officer or employee of any state agency to whom has been assigned, 35 issued or made available the use of a wireless communication 36 device, the cost of which is paid through the use of public funds, 37 shall use such device for personal use.
- 38 (3) A state agency shall not reimburse any officer or 39 employee for use of his or her personal wireless communication 40 device.
 - (4) Every state agency that, at the expense of the state agency, assigns, issues or makes available to any of its officers or employees a wireless communication device shall obtain and maintain detailed billing for every wireless communication device account. A list of approved vendors for the procurement of wireless communication devices and the delivery of wireless communication devices shall be developed for all state agencies by the Mississippi Department of Information Technology

49	Services in conjunction with the Wireless Communication Commission
50	created in Section 25-53-171. The department, in conjunction with
51	the Wireless Communication Commission, shall exercise the option
52	of selecting one (1) vendor from which to procure wireless
53	communication devices and to provide wireless communication device
54	services, or if it deems such to be most advantageous to the state
55	agencies, it may select multiple vendors. The department, in
56	conjunction with the Wireless Communication Commission, shall
57	select a vendor or vendors on the basis of lowest and best bid
58	proposals. A state agency may not procure a wireless
59	communication device from any vendor or contract for wireless
60	communication device services with any vendor unless the vendor
61	appears on the list approved by the department, in conjunction
62	with the Wireless Communication Commission. A contract entered
63	into in violation of this section shall be void and unenforceable.
64	(5) The department shall promulgate a model acceptable use
65	policy defining the appropriate use of all wireless communication
66	devices. The acceptable use policy should specify that these
67	resources, including both devices and services, are provided at
68	the state agency's expense as tools for accomplishing the business
69	missions of the state agency; that all those resources are for
70	business use; and that more than incidental personal use of those
71	resources is prohibited. The acceptable use policy should require
72	that each official and employee issued one (1) of the above
73	devices or authorized to access one (1) of the above services sign

- 74 the policy and that the signed copy be placed in the personnel
- 75 file of the official or employee. The acceptable use policy
- 76 should also require that the use of these resources be tracked,
- 77 verified and signed by the official or employee and the supervisor
- 78 of the official or employee at each billing cycle or other
- 79 appropriate interval. All state agencies shall adopt the model
- 80 policy or adopt a policy that is, at minimum, as stringent as the
- 81 model policy and shall provide a copy of the policy to the
- 82 department.
- 83 (6) All state agencies shall purchase or acquire only the
- 84 lowest cost cellular telephone, pager or personal digital
- 85 assistance device which will carry out its intended use.
- 86 (7) (a) The University of Mississippi Medical Center and
- 87 its employees, the Mississippi State University Extension Service
- 88 and its agents and faculty members, the Mississippi State
- 89 University Agricultural and Forestry Experiment Station and its
- 90 faculty members, the Mississippi State University Forestry and
- 91 Wildlife Research Center and its faculty members, and the
- 92 Mississippi State University College of Veterinary Medicine and
- 93 its faculty members shall be exempt from the application of this
- 94 section.
- 95 (b) State institutions of higher learning and their
- 96 agents and faculty members shall be exempt from the provisions of
- 97 this section. The state institutions of higher learning, with the
- 98 approval of the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher

99	Learning, are further authorized to use the Express Products List
100	(EPL) compiled by the Mississippi Department of Information
101	Technology Services (MDITS) to negotiate best pricing with
102	approved vendors when making purchases of all needed information
103	wireless communication devices, telecommunications equipment,
104	software programs and services and service plans associated
105	therewith, to promote access, functionality and efficient use in
106	the delivery of educational instruction.
107	(8) The State Auditor shall conduct necessary audits to
108	ensure compliance with the provisions of this section.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from

and after July 1, 2021.
