## HOUSE BILL NO. 793

AN ACT TO CREATE A HEALTHY LOCAL FOOD INCENTIVE PROGRAM; TO PROVIDE THAT THE PROGRAM SHALL BE ESTABLISHED AND ADMINISTERED BY THE MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES FOR THE PURPOSE OF INCREASING THE PURCHASING POWER OF MISSISSIPPI RESIDENTS WITH 5 LIMITED ACCESS TO FRESH FRUITS AND VEGETABLES; TO CREATE THE "HEALTHY LOCAL FOOD INCENTIVES FUND," AS A SPECIAL FUND IN THE 7 STATE TREASURY, FOR THE PURPOSE OF IMPLEMENTING THE HEALTHY LOCAL FOOD INCENTIVES PROGRAM; TO REQUIRE THE DEPARTMENT TO MAKE AN 8 ANNUAL GRANT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$500,000.00 FROM THE FUND TO A 9 QUALIFIED MISSISSIPPI NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION OR AGENCY DESIGNATED 10 11 BY THE DEPARTMENT AND THE MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE 12 AND COMMERCE SUBJECT TO LEGISLATIVE APPROPRIATION; TO PROVIDE THAT SUCH GRANT FUNDS SHALL BE DISTRIBUTED TO PARTICIPATING MISSISSIPPI FARMERS MARKETS FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING MATCHING DOLLAR 14 1.5 INCENTIVES FOR THE DOLLAR VALUE OF SNAP BENEFITS SPENT ON FINI 16 ELIGIBLE FRUITS AND VEGETABLES AT PARTICIPATING MISSISSIPPI 17 FARMERS MARKETS AND DIRECT PRODUCER-TO-CONSUMER VENUES; TO SPECIFY 18 CRITERIA FOR POTENTIAL NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS OR AGENCIES 19 SELECTED AS RECIPIENT OF GRANT FUNDS; TO REQUIRE 100% OF THE 20 MONEYS DEPOSITED INTO THE FUND TO BE DISTRIBUTED TO PARTICIPATING 21 MISSISSIPPI FARMERS MARKETS FOR HEALTHY LOCAL FOOD INCENTIVES; TO 22 REQUIRE THE DESIGNATED QUALIFIED NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION OR AGENCY 23 SHALL SUBMIT A PROGRESS REPORT TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES 24 WITHIN 90 DAYS AFTER THE END OF A GRANT CYCLE; TO REQUIRE THE 25 DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES TO ADOPT RULES TO IMPLEMENT THE 26 PROGRAM NO LATER THAN DECEMBER 31, 2021; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 27 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 28 SECTION 1. Legislative findings. Diet and other lifestyle 29 choices contribute to more than half of all deaths in Mississippi. - 31 high blood pressure and alcohol and drug use. Mississippi
- 32 residents should be encouraged to adopt diets and lifestyles that
- 33 lead to wellness. The state can help provide encouragement by
- 34 funding wellness programs that enhance the health of Mississippi
- 35 residents. Healthy local food incentives encourage wellness among
- 36 some of the most vulnerable residents of Mississippi, particularly
- 37 those whose incomes are below the poverty line and who often have
- 38 limited access to fresh, healthy and affordable foods, by doubling
- 39 the purchasing power of EBT cardholders at farmers markets across
- 40 the state. The benefits of such a program include:
- 41 (a) An increase in population health;
- 42 (b) Medicaid health care cost savings;
- 43 (c) Decreased incidence of preventable diseases;
- (d) Increased revenue for Mississippi's small farmers;
- 45 and
- 46 (e) Economic stimulus for the region.
- 47 **SECTION 2.** As used in this act, the following terms shall
- 48 have the meanings ascribed in this section, unless context clearly
- 49 requires otherwise:
- 50 (a) "Department" means the Mississippi Department of
- 51 Human Services.
- 52 (b) "EBT card" means an electronic benefits transfer
- 53 card issued by the Mississippi Department of Human Services for

- 54 the purpose of enabling a user of the card to obtain SNAP benefits
- 55 or cash.

- 56 "FINI eligible fruits and vegetables" means any
- variety of fresh, canned, dried, or frozen whole or cut fruits and 57
- vegetables without added sugars, fats, or oils and salt, as 58
- defined by the Food Insecurity Nutrition Incentive Grant Program 59
- 60 administered by the United States Department of Agriculture.
- 61 (d) "Fund" means the "Healthy Local Food Incentives
- 62 Fund."
- "SNAP" means the federal Supplemental Nutrition 63 (e)
- 64 Assistance Program, which enables low-income families the ability
- 65 to purchase nutritious food by providing monthly food assistance
- benefits. 66
- 67 The Mississippi Department of Human Services SECTION 3. (1)
- 68 shall establish a Healthy Local Food Incentives Program to double
- 69 the purchasing power of Mississippi residents with limited access
- 70 to fresh fruits and vegetables.
- 71 There is created as a special fund in the State
- 72 Treasury, to be known as the "Healthy Local Food Incentives Fund,"
- for the purpose of implementing the Healthy Local Food Incentives 73
- 74 Program, and from which grants authorized by this act shall be
- 75 disbursed by the department. All monies received under the
- 76 authority of this section shall be deposited into the "Healthy
- 77 Local Food Incentives Fund."
- 78 Subject to legislative appropriation, the department
- 79 shall make an annual grant of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars

80 (\$500,000.00) from the fund to a qualified Mississippi nonprofit

- 81 organization or agency designated by the department and the
- 82 Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce, which shall be
- 83 distributed to participating Mississippi farmers markets for the
- 84 purpose of providing matching dollar incentives, up to an amount
- 85 specified by both departments for the dollar value of SNAP
- 86 benefits spent on FINI eligible fruits and vegetables at
- 87 participating Mississippi farmers markets and direct
- 88 producer-to-consumer venues.
- 89 (4) The designated qualified nonprofit organization or
- 90 agency shall have a demonstrated record of:
- 91 (a) Designing and implementing successful healthy food
- 92 incentive programs that connect SNAP recipients with local
- 93 producers;
- 94 (b) Implementing funds distribution and reporting
- 95 processes;
- 96 (c) Providing training and technical assistance to
- 97 farmers markets;
- 98 (d) Conducting community outreach and data collection;
- 99 and
- 100 (e) Providing full accounting and administration of
- 101 funds distributed to farmers markets.
- 102 (5) (a) One hundred percent (100%) of the monies deposited
- 103 into the fund shall be distributed to participating Mississippi
- 104 farmers markets for healthy local food incentives.

(b) Within ninety $(90)$ d	ays after the end of a grant
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- 106 cycle, the designated qualified nonprofit organization or agency
- 107 shall submit a progress report to the Department of Human
- 108 Services. The progress report shall include the following
- 109 information:
- 110 (i) The names and locations of Mississippi farmers
- 111 markets and direct producer-to-consumer venues that received funds
- 112 distributed under the program;
- 113 (ii) The dollar amount of funds awarded to each
- 114 participating Mississippi farmers market and direct
- 115 producer-to-consumer venue;
- 116 (iii) The dollar amount of SNAP benefits, and
- 117 funds provided under the program, that were spent at Mississippi
- 118 farmers markets participating in the program, as well as the
- 119 dollar amount of any unspent funds available under the program;
- 120 (iv) The number of SNAP transactions carried out
- 121 annually at participating Mississippi farmers markets;
- 122 (v) The impact of the program on increasing the
- 123 quantity of fresh fruits and vegetables consumed by SNAP families,
- 124 as determined by customer surveys.
- 125 (6) No later than December 31, 2021, the Department of

- 126 Human Services shall adopt rules to implement the provisions of
- 127 this section.
- 128 **SECTION 4.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 129 and after July 1, 2021.
