HOUSE BILL NO. 1328

- AN ACT TO CREATE THE MISSISSIPPI WARRANTS TASK FORCE; TO PROVIDE THE PURPOSE OF THE TASK FORCE; TO PROVIDE DUTIES FOR THE TASK FORCE; TO REQUIRE A REPORT OF RECOMMENDATIONS FROM THE TASK FORCE TO THE SPEAKER OF THE MISSISSIPPI HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES 5 AND THE LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR BY A CERTAIN DATE; TO PROVIDE HOW 6 MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE ARE COMPENSATED; AND FOR RELATED 7 PURPOSES.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- SECTION 1. (1) There is created the Mississippi Warrants
- 10 Task Force. The purpose of the task force is to study: how
- 11 warrants are issued in the state, the procedural elements of knock
- and announce warrants, the number of injuries, if any, that have 12
- 13 occurred when executing warrants in the state, and the
- geographical locations of such executions and injuries occurred. 14
- 15 The Mississippi Warrants Task Force shall be composed of
- 16 the following members:
- 17 (a) The Commissioner of the Department of Public
- 18 Safety, who shall serve as chair;
- 19 (b) Executive Director of the Mississippi Bureau of

- 29 (g) One (1) member appointed by the Speaker of the

- 33 (i) One (1) member appointed from the Bureau of
- 34 Investigations by the Commissioner of the Department of Safety.
- 35 (3) The Mississippi Warrants Task Force shall have the
- 36 following duties, to:
- 37 (a) Study how warrants are issued throughout the state;
- 38 (b) Study all entities who are authorized to issue
- 39 warrants, and provide a list of such entities;
- 40 (c) Provide all documented circumstances in which
- 41 warrants are issued in the state;
- 42 (d) Study the number of injuries, if any, incurred when
- 43 executing warrants in the state;
- (e) Create standards for issuing and executing

- (4) The members of the task force shall serve at the will and pleasure of their respective appointing authorities. A majority of the members of the task force shall constitute a
- 53 (5) (a) The task force shall hold its first meeting no 54 later than fifteen (15) days after July 1, 2021. At its first 55 meeting, the task force shall adopt rules for transacting its 56 business and keeping records.

quorum for the transaction of business.

- 57 (b) The task force shall meet and conduct business at 58 least once a month. All meetings of the task force and any 59 committees of the task force will be open to the public, with opportunities for public comment provided on a regular basis. 60 61 Notice of all meetings shall be given as provided in the Open 62 Meetings Act Section 25-41-1 et seq. and appropriate notice also 63 shall be given to all persons so requesting of the date, time and 64 place of each meeting.
- (c) The task force is assigned to the Mississippi

 Department of Public Safety for administrative purposes only, and

 the department shall designate staff to assist the task force.
- 68 (6) Members of the task force who are not state officials or 69 state employees may be compensated at the per diem rate authorized 70 by Section 25-3-69 and may be reimbursed in accordance with

52

71 Section 25-3-41 for mileage and actual expenses incurred in the 72 performance of their duties. If legislative members are appointed 73 to the task force, they will be paid from the contingent expense 74 funds of their respective houses in the same manner as provided for committee meetings when the Legislature is not in session. 75 76 However, legislative members will not be paid per diem or expenses 77 for attending meetings of the task force while the Legislature is in session. No task force member may incur per diem, travel or 78 79 other expenses unless previously authorized by vote, at a meeting of the task force, which action must be recorded in the official 80 minutes of the meeting. Non-legislative members may be paid from 81 any funds made available to the task force for that purpose. 82 83 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2021. 84
