## HOUSE BILL NO. 1393 (As Sent to Governor)

1 2 3	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE SUPPORT AND MAINTENANCE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF WILDLIFE, FISHERIES AND PARKS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2022.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State General
7	Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and maintenance
8	of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for the fiscal
9	year beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022
10	\$ 5,990,033.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in any special fund in
13	the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of Wildlife,
14	Fisheries and Parks which is comprised of special source funds
15	collected by or otherwise available to the department for the
16	support and maintenance of the department, including the Museum of
17	Natural Science and the Bureau of Parks and Recreation, for the
18	fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022

19	\$ 77,023,000.00.
20	The following sum, which is included in the sum appropriated
21	above in this section, is appropriated out of the state excise
22	taxes upon gasoline, oil and other petroleum products to the
23	Fisheries and Wildlife Fund for the fiscal year beginning
24	July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022 \$ 5,750,000.00.
25	The Department of Revenue is directed to set aside the amount
26	of this appropriation or any part thereof at any time it sees fit,
27	out of any collections of taxes upon gasoline, oil and other
28	petroleum products, and to deduct the amounts so set aside from
29	such funds before making distribution thereof. However,
30	provisions shall first be made for the Highway Bonds Sinking Fund,
31	as required under the provisions of Chapter 130, Laws of 1938, and
32	any amendments thereto, and Section 27-5-101, Mississippi Code of
33	1972.
34	Any funds available in the Wildlife Heritage Fund may be
35	expended by the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks as
36	authorized by law. The department shall make a detailed report to
37	the Legislature regarding the spending of the Wildlife Heritage
38	funds by September 1 for the preceding fiscal year.
39	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
40	Section 2 to the Bureau of Wildlife and Fisheries, funds in the
41	amount of One Hundred Twenty-five Thousand Three Hundred
42	Thirty-five Dollars (\$125,335.00) shall be derived from the
43	Education Enhancement Fund deposited pursuant to Sections 27-65-75

- and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the purpose of defraying the expenses of Project WILD for Fiscal Year 2022.
- SECTION 4. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of this act, the following positions are authorized:

With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2023 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2022 funds appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2022 budget by the Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this act. Absent a special situation or circumstance approved by the State Personnel Board, or unless otherwise authorized by this act, no state agency shall take any action to promote or otherwise award salary increases through reallocation or realignment. If the State Personnel Board determines a special situation or circumstance exists and approves an action, then the agency and the State Personnel Board shall provide a monthly report of each

- 69 action approved by the State Personnel Board to the chairmen of
- 70 the Accountability, Efficiency and Transparency Committees of the
- 71 Senate and House of Representatives and the chairmen of the
- 72 Appropriations Committees of the Senate and House of
- 73 Representatives. It shall be the responsibility of the agency
- 74 head to ensure that no single personnel action increases this
- 75 projected annual cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2022 appropriations
- 76 for "Personal Services" when annualized, with the exception of
- 77 escalated funds and the award of benchmarks. If, at the time the
- 78 agency takes any action to change "Personal Services," the State
- 79 Personnel Board determines that the agency has taken an action
- 80 which would cause the agency to exceed this projected annual cost
- 81 or the Fiscal Year 2022 "Personal Services" appropriated level,
- 82 when annualized, then only those actions which reduce the
- 83 projected annual cost and/or the appropriation requirement will be
- 84 processed by the State Personnel Board until such time as the
- 85 requirements of this provision are met.
- 86 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 87 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or
- 88 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
- 89 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
- 90 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
- 91 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
- 92 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions

- 93 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 94 appropriated level.
- No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
  - Funds have been appropriated herein for the purpose of implementation and funding Project SEC2 of the Colonel Guy Groff State Variable Compensation Plan beginning January 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2022. It shall be the agency's responsibility to make certain that each person, excluding executive directors, agency heads, and elected judges, shall receive no more than a 3% annual increase in salary which shall not exceed the market rate established by the State Personnel Board pursuant to the Colonel Guy Groff State Variable Compensation Plan for each classification.
- SECTION 5. Each conservation officer and supervisor shall be furnished an allowance for uniforms not to exceed Five Hundred
  Fifty Dollars (\$550.00) per annum.
- Provided further, when any personnel of the Bureau of Wildlife and Fisheries are transferred from one (1) county to

120	SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
121	Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall maintain
122	complete accounting and personnel records related to the
123	expenditure of all funds appropriated under this act and that such

125	maintained for Fiscal Year 2021. It is further the intention of
126	the Legislature that the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year
127	2023 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee

131	SECTION 7. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance

219	SECTION 9. Of the funds appropriated within this act, the
220	Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks may enter into
221	cooperative agreements with the board of supervisors of any county
222	or any group or combination of counties for the purpose of
223	creating, improving or restoring parks, public game and fish
224	habitat lying or to be situated wholly or partially within such
225	county or in an adjoining county; and each county is empowered and
226	authorized, in its discretion, to expend funds from the general
227	county fund for such purposes from which fund they shall reimburse
228	to the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks the actual cost
229	of all surveying and engineering projects incurred by the
230	Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks incidental thereto.
231	Such boards of supervisors are further authorized and empowered,
232	in their discretion, to enter into agreements necessary to carry
233	out the purposes of this act with any other county, the United
234	States Forest Service or any other agency if same should be
235	necessary for the acquisition of land by lease or otherwise for
236	such purposes.
237	SECTION 10. It shall be unlawful for any officer, employee
238	or other person whatsoever to use or permit or authorize the use
239	of any automobile or any other motor vehicle owned by the State of
240	Mississippi or any department, agency or institution thereof for

242	Mississippi or any agency, department or institution thereof.
243	It is the intent of the Legislature that motor vehicles
244	authorized to be owned and operated by this agency shall comply
245	with Sections 25-1-77 through 25-1-93, Mississippi Code of 1972.
246	SECTION 11. In order to be in compliance with Section
247	63-1-201 et seq., funds are herein provided and may be expended by
248	the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks to pay the costs
249	of commercial driver's licenses for specific employees and/or to
250	reimburse such costs for specific employees who, in the course of
251	their duties and responsibilities, are required to hold a valid
252	Mississippi Commercial Driver's License.
253	SECTION 12. The Mississippi Department of Wildlife,
254	Fisheries and Parks is authorized to provide financial support of
255	One Hundred Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$175,000.00) and to
256	enter into an agreement with the Mississippi Cooperative Extension
257	Service for a project specialist and related supportive cost.
258	SECTION 13. The department is authorized to spend up to
259	sixty percent (60%) of revenue in the State Park Timber Endowment
260	Fund, as needed, to operate and maintain the state parks.
261	SECTION 14. It is the intention of the Legislature that
262	whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the

269 SECTION 15. Of the funds appropriated herein, Two Hundred 270 Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) may be provided to fund the Youth 271 Participation Initiative for the purpose of educating children in 272 the areas of hunting, fishing, conservation, and safety.

SECTION 16. The fund created pursuant to Section 49-5-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, and known as the "Fisheries and Wildlife Fund" shall be treated as a special trust fund. All funds derived from the sale of licenses, fees, fines and other revenues received by the department as provided by law, shall be deposited in the Fisheries and Wildlife Fund. In addition, revenue derived from the sale of timber on wildlife management areas, refuges and preserves shall be deposited into an account established for such revenues under the Fisheries and Wildlife Fund. The interest and any investment income earned on the fund shall be credited by the State Treasurer to the Fisheries and Wildlife Fund and shall not be paid into the General Fund. Any unexpended funds remaining in the fund at the end of the fiscal year shall not lapse and shall remain in the fund. Nothing in this section shall prevent the use of said funds from maintenance and upgrade of wildlife management areas.

- 291 (\$1,300,000.00) be expended from the Motor Vehicle Fund for the 292 purchase of any type of motor vehicle.
- SECTION 18. The executive director of the Department of
  Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks is authorized to enter into an
  agreement with any public or private entities to manage any park
  or parks within the state park system.
- 297 SECTION 19. It is the intent of the Legislature that no 298 state-owned wildlife management area be closed and that to the 299 greatest practicable extent, department land management decisions 300 and actions may not result in any net loss of any acreage 301 available for hunting opportunities that existed on July 1, 2006, as provided in Section 49-5-99(4). It is the intention of the 302 303 Legislature that no state park be closed without legislative 304 approval.
- 305 SECTION 20. It is the intent of the Legislature that the 306 Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have 307 the authority to enter into multi-year contracts for the purpose 308 of placing a sign on such state park property under the 309 department's domain, in accordance with any applicable rules and 310 regulations. All proceeds generated from these activities shall 311 remain with the department and shall be deposited into the proper 312 special fund.
- 313 **SECTION 21.** It is the intent of the Legislature that from the funds available to the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks, the department may purchase and pay premium(s) on property

316	damage insurance on its motor vehicles, boats, trailers, real
317	property improvements, buildings, furnishings, and such other
318	assets as may be appropriate or practical, and/or as required by a
319	granting entity.

- 320 **SECTION 22.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
  321 of Section 2, One Million Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars
  322 (\$1,750,000.00) shall be designated for the purpose of defraying
  323 the operational expenses of Special Projects. None of these funds
  324 shall be used for "Personal Services".
- 325 SECTION 23. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
  326 Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have the
  327 authority to receive, budget and expend funds from the Gulf and
  328 Wildlife Protection Fund, not to exceed Fifty Thousand Dollars
  329 (\$50,000.00) for the purpose of preservation, protection,
  330 conservation, and acquisition of waters, land and wildlife of this
  331 state.
- 332 SECTION 24. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of Section 2, Four Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$400,000.00), or so 333 334 much thereof, shall be derived out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Capital Expense Fund, as created in 335 336 Section 27-103-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, and allocated in a 337 manner as determined by the Treasurer's Office, is provided for 338 the detection and prevention of Chronic Wasting Disease in deer 339 populations across the state.

340	<b>SECTION 25.</b> Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
341	of Section 2, Three Million One Hundred Thousand Dollars
342	(\$3,100,000.00), or so much thereof, shall be derived out of any
343	money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Capital Expense
344	Fund, as created in Section 27-103-303, Mississippi Code of 1972,
345	and allocated in a manner as determined by the Treasurer's Office,
346	is provided for the purchase of land to provide public access to
347	hunting, fishing, and outdoor activities.

section 26. It is the intention of the Legislature that the funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for actions contrary to this provision.

SECTION 27. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, it is the intention of the Legislature that Fifty-eight Thousand Five Hundred Ninety-three Dollars (\$58,593.00) may be allocated for the Hunter Education program supported from the General Fund court assessments.

SECTION 28. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
