HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 40

A RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE DISTINGUISHED CAREER AND

2 MERITORIOUS LEADERSHIP AND SERVICE OF REVEREND ROBERT L. COOK UPON 3 THE OCCASION OF HIS RETIREMENT AS THE DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF WILDLIFE, FISHERIES AND PARKS. 5 WHEREAS, the Deputy Executive Director of the Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks and exceptional public 6 7 servant, Reverend Robert L. Cook, retired on February 28, 2021, after a remarkably distinguished career of exemplary leadership 8 9 and service to the State of Mississippi; and 10 WHEREAS, during his tenure as the Deputy Executive Director of the Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks, 11 12 Reverend Cook was the highest ranking African American in a state 13 natural resource agency in the country; and 14 WHEREAS, the son of the late William Cook, Sr., and Florence Cook, Reverend Cook is a native of Magnolia, Mississippi, and 15 graduated from South Pike High School before earning his bachelor 16 of science degree in criminal justice and correctional services

from Jackson State University in 1978; and

19	WHEREAS, after completing several semesters of graduate work
20	in public administration, Reverend Cook began his professional
21	career as a deputy sheriff in his hometown of Magnolia,
22	Mississippi, in 1979, and just one year later, in July 1980, he
23	became only the second African American to hold the position of
24	criminal investigator for the State Attorney General's Office; and
25	WHEREAS, in 1986, Reverend Cook was promoted in state service
26	to Investigative Chief with the Office of the State Auditor, an
27	appointment that began a trend in his career of becoming the first
28	African American to hold senior management positions with a number
29	of state agencies, including Director of the State Capitol Police,
30	Director of Program Integrity and Inspector General for the
31	Mississippi Department of Human Services, Deputy Administrator for
32	Administration for the Department of Human Services and Director
33	of Administrative Services for the Department of Wildlife,
34	Fisheries and Parks; and
35	WHEREAS, currently, Reverend Cook, an immensely proud and
36	dedicated Jackson State University alumnus, is the chair and
37	co-founder of the Jackson State University Tiger Fund, which is
38	Jackson State's Athletic Foundation, a charter member of the Blue
39	Bengal Athletic Association, chair of the Board of Directors for
40	the Jackson State University Sports' Hall of Fame, a member of the
41	Jackson State University Development Foundation Board of Directors
42	and a member of the State of Mississippi Wireless Communication
43	Commission; and

44	WHEREAS, additionally, Reverend Cook is a past member of the
45	Central Mississippi Sickle Cell Foundation's Board of Directors
46	and the Mississippi Contract Review Board, past chair of the
17	Southeastern Association of Wildlife and Fisheries Agencies'
48	Minorities in Natural Resource Committee, president and founder of
49	Metro Karate Clubs, Inc., and the National Martial Arts Alliance;

51	WHEREAS, Reverend Cook also serves as Senior Pastor of Seven
52	Springs United Methodist Church in Raymond, Mississippi, as a
53	member of the Mississippi Conference of the United Methodist
54	Church and as a son of Anderson United Methodist Church; and
55	WHEREAS, throughout his career, Reverend Cook has received
56	unwavering support from his three sons, Chris, Carlos and Corey,
57	and served as a mentor to many other young men throughout his
58	community; and
59	WHEREAS, Reverend Cook has been an incredible public servant
60	to the Magnolia State not only as the Deputy Executive Director of
51	the Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks, but
62	also in the numerous other roles he held throughout state
63	government, and his knowledge, skill and strenuous laboriousness
54	will be dearly missed by all of his colleagues and others who were
65	fortunate to have the opportunity to work with him and experience
66	his greatness; and
