SENATE BILL NO. 2151

1 AN ACT TO CREATE THE EDUCATION CONTINUUM FOR MISSISSIPPI'S 2 FUTURE TASK FORCE TO RESEARCH, REVIEW AND MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS TO 3 THE STATE LEGISLATURE REGARDING THE STATE'S EDUCATION COORDINATING 4 AGENCIES FOR EARLY EDUCATION THROUGH POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 7 SECTION 1. There is created the Education Continuum for 8 Mississippi's Future Task Force, which shall be responsible for 9 studying the state's current system of coordinating agencies for 10 early education through postsecondary education. 11 SECTION 2. (1) The task force shall be composed of thirteen 12 (13) members from Mississippi as follows: 13 The Chairmen of the Senate and House Universities (a) and Colleges Committees, who shall serve as co-chairmen of the 14 15 task force; The Chairmen of the Senate and House Education 16 (b) 17 Committees; 18 (c) Two (2) members from Mississippi with significant experience in public K-12 education, with one (1) member selected 19

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20 by the Lieutenant Governor and one (1) member selected by the 21 Speaker of the House of Representatives;

(d) Two (2) members from Mississippi with significant experience in community and junior college education, with one (1) member selected by the Lieutenant Governor and one (1) member selected by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;

(e) Two (2) members from Mississippi with significant
experience in public undergraduate or graduate higher education,
with one (1) member selected by the Lieutenant Governor and one
(1) member selected by the Speaker of the House of

31 (f) A member from Mississippi with significant
 32 experience in early childhood education appointed by the Governor;

33 (g) A member with significant experience in business34 appointed by the Governor; and

35 (h) A member with significant experience in workforce36 development appointed by the Governor.

37 (2) Appointees to the task force shall not include the State
38 Superintendent of Education, any current member of the State Board
39 of Education, the Executive Director of the Mississippi Community
40 College Board, any current member of the Mississippi Community
41 College Board, the Commissioner of Higher Education or any current
42 member of the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher
43 Learning.

No. 2151 21/SS08/R512 PAGE 2 (scm\lr) 44 (3) The chairmen of the task force shall jointly call the 45 first meeting, at which time the task force shall set a schedule for meeting and adopting rules for transacting its business and 46 keeping records. Members of the task force shall receive a per 47 diem in the amount provided in Section 25-3-69 for each day 48 49 engaged in the business of the task force. Members of the task force other than the legislative members shall receive 50 51 reimbursement for travel expenses incurred while engaged in office 52 business of the task force in accordance with Section 25-3-41. Legislative members of the task force shall receive the expense 53 54 allowance provided in Section 5-1-47.

55 (4) The duties of the task force shall be to research,56 review and make recommendations related to:

57 (a) The cost and efficiency of the current structure of
58 the state's education coordinating agencies, including the
59 Mississippi Department of Education, Mississippi Community College
60 Board, and the Mississippi institutions of higher learning;

61 The coordination of the current structure related (b) 62 to transitions from early childhood to elementary education, 63 elementary to secondary education and secondary education to workforce training and/or postsecondary education, with the goal 64 65 of creating a seamless system students enter in early childhood and exit when they are prepared to enter the workforce, whether 66 67 after receiving a high school diploma, nondegree credential, or associate, bachelor or graduate degree; 68

(c) The efficiency and outcomes of current
collaborations between education coordinating agencies in the
state, including, but not limited to, the efficacy of dual credit
and enrollment programs, and career and technical education;

73 (d) The ability to set and carry out the state's74 educational attainment goals; and

(e) The distribution and use of federal, state and local dollars in carrying out the state's educational attainment goals.

(5) The task force shall report in writing to the
Mississippi State Legislature by October 1, 2021, with
recommendations as to any necessary statutory changes.

(6) The task force shall have access to any and all information, including, but not limited to, any and all information housed within the Mississippi Department of Health, Mississippi Department of Education, Mississippi Community College Board or Mississippi institutions of higher learning, as necessary to fulfill the responsibilities provided in this section.

87 (7) If the task force requests information from a state 88 agency or local governmental arm, the agency or entity shall 89 provide the information to the task force in an expeditious 90 manner.

91 (8) The Legislative Budget Office and Joint Committee on
92 Performance Evaluation and Expenditure shall supply the necessary
93 staff and research assistance needed by the task force.

95 Open Meetings Act as provided in Section 25-41-5. The task force
96 shall be subject to the provisions of the Public Records Act as
97 provided in Section 25-61-5.

98 (10) This section shall stand repealed on July 1, 2022.
 99 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from
 100 and after its passage.
