SENATE BILL NO. 2165

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 35-3-21, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REVISE CERTAIN QUALIFICATIONS AND REQUIREMENTS FOR VETERANS
- 3 SERVICE OFFICERS AND TO REQUIRE THE COUNTIES TO PROVIDE NECESSARY
- 4 OFFICE SPACE AND CONNECTIVITY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 6 **SECTION 1.** Section 35-3-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 7 amended as follows:
- 8 35-3-21. In order to maintain offices and pay personnel for
- 9 the purpose of assisting all residents of the State of Mississippi
- 10 who served in the military or naval forces of the United States
- 11 during any war, their relatives, beneficiaries or dependents, to
- 12 receive from the United States any and all compensation,
- 13 hospitalization, insurance or other aid or benefits to which they
- 14 may be entitled under existing or hereafter enacted laws of the
- 15 United States, the boards of supervisors in the various counties
- 16 in the state are hereby authorized and empowered, in their
- 17 discretion, to expend out of the general county fund, or special
- 18 veterans' fund herein authorized to be set up, or from both of

- 19 such funds, such monies necessary to defray the office operating
- 20 expenses and salary of the county veteran service officers.
- 21 Two (2) or more counties may, upon resolution duly adopted by
- 22 the board of supervisors of each of such counties, agree to
- 23 establish one (1) veteran service office for all of such counties.
- 24 When two (2) or more counties enter into such an agreement, each
- 25 county shall pay such amount mutually agreed upon and duly adopted
- 26 by resolution of the respective boards of supervisors.
- 27 County veteran service officers shall be (a) honorably
- 28 discharged or honorably released veterans * * * in which the Armed
- 29 Forces of the United States have been, are or shall be committed
- 30 for action; (b) the surviving spouse or child of any such deceased
- 31 veteran; or (c) any person employed as a county veteran service
- 32 officer in any county of this state on March 30, 1990. From and
- 33 after July 1, 1990, county veteran service officers shall be
- 34 certified by the Mississippi State Veterans' Affairs Board which,
- 35 among any other criteria it may establish, shall require such
- 36 officers to (a) attend * * * one (1) of the * * * annual training
- 37 programs provided for such officers by the Mississippi State
- 38 Veterans' Affairs Board, * * * (b) successfully complete a written
- 39 examination each year on the duties and responsibilities of and
- 40 assistance available to such officers and veterans, (c) have
- 41 certification and be accredited according to 38 CFR Section 14.629
- 42 administered by the Mississippi State Veterans' Affairs Board, and
- 43 (d) follow the rules and regulations promulgated by the

- 45 service officers who annually receive and complete such
- 46 instruction in a manner satisfactory to the Veterans' Affairs
- 47 Board and in accordance with this section shall be certified by
- 48 the board. No county veteran service officer shall be entitled to
- 49 receive any compensation for his services, to which he is
- 50 otherwise entitled by law, unless he is annually certified by the
- 51 board.
- 52 County veteran service officers may be employed, in the
- 53 discretion of the boards of supervisors, either full time or part
- 54 time.
- 55 The boards of supervisors of the various counties are
- 56 authorized and directed to provide necessary office space and
- 57 communications connectivity for county veteran service officers.
- 58 The boards of supervisors of the various counties are further
- 59 authorized and empowered to pay all necessary and actual expenses
- 60 of county veteran service officers who attend a school of
- 61 instruction within the State of Mississippi for such county
- 62 veteran service officers.
- It shall also be the duty of the boards of supervisors to aid
- 64 the United States to defeat all unjust claims for aid or benefit
- 65 therefrom.
- Such expenditures may be made by the several counties acting
- 67 alone, or in cooperation with other counties, and in cooperation
- 68 with any federal or state agency carrying out such purposes.

69	In the event that the general revenues of the county levied
70	under and within the limits of existing taxing statutes are not
71	sufficient to pay the expenses authorized herein, the board of
72	supervisors may, in its discretion, levy an additional tax not to
73	exceed one (1) mill on all taxable property in the county to
74	defray such expenses or any part thereof. Any tax levy made under
75	authority of this chapter shall not be considered in refunding
76	homestead exemption losses under Title 27, Chapter 33, Mississippi
77	Code of 1972.

78 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 79 and after July 1, 2021.
