SENATE BILL NO. 2417

AN ACT TO REENACT SECTIONS 73-7-1, 73-7-2, 73-7-3, 73-7-5, 73-7-7, 73-7-9, 73-7-11, 73-7-12, 73-7-14, 73-7-15, 73-7-16, 2 73-7-17, 73-7-18, 73-7-19, 73-7-21, 73-7-23, 73-7-25, 73-7-27, 73-7-29, 73-7-31, 73-7-33, 73-7-35, 73-7-37, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 3 1972, WHICH CREATE THE STATE BOARD OF COSMETOLOGY AND PRESCRIBE 5 6 ITS DUTIES AND POWERS; TO AMEND REENACTED SECTION 73-7-12, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REMOVE THE AUTOMATIC REPEALER IN THAT SECTION; TO AMEND SECTION 73-7-63, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 7 8 9 EXTEND THE AUTOMATIC REPEALER ON THOSE SECTIONS; AND FOR RELATED 10 PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 11 12 **SECTION 1.** Section 73-7-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 13 reenacted as follows: 73-7-1. There is hereby continued and reconstituted a State 14 15 Board of Cosmetology, composed of five (5) members to be appointed by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Senate, and 16 17 whose term of office shall be four (4) years from the date of appointment except as otherwise provided herein. However, no more 18 than two (2) members shall be appointed from each Supreme Court 19 20 district. There shall be a president of the board and such other 21

officers as deemed necessary by the board elected by and from its

- 23 membership, provided that the member elected as president shall
- 24 have at least one (1) year of experience on the board. Any member
- 25 appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the Senate for a term
- 26 to begin on or after July 1, 1997, who was designated by the
- 27 Governor to serve as president of the board, shall be fully
- 28 qualified to serve on the board for a full term of office, but
- 29 shall not serve as president of the board unless elected by the
- 30 membership of the board as provided under this paragraph.
- To be eligible for appointment as a member of the State Board
- 32 of Cosmetology, the person applying shall have been a citizen of
- 33 this state for a minimum of five (5) years immediately prior to
- 34 appointment. Such person shall be at least thirty (30) years of
- 35 age, possess a high school education or its equivalent, and shall
- 36 have been a licensed cosmetologist with not less than ten (10)
- 37 years' active practice in cosmetology. No member of the board
- 38 shall be connected in any way with any school wherein cosmetology
- 39 is taught, nor shall any two (2) members of the board be graduates
- 40 of the same school of cosmetology.
- However, in the event of vacancy by death or resignation of
- 42 any member of the board, the Governor shall, within thirty (30)
- 43 days, appoint a person possessing all qualifications required to
- 44 serve the remainder of the term. Any member who shall not attend
- 45 two (2) consecutive meetings of the board for reasons other than
- 46 illness of such member shall be subject to removal by the
- 47 Governor. The president of the board shall notify the Governor in

- 48 writing when any such member has failed to attend two (2)
- 49 consecutive regular meetings.
- The salaries of all paid employees of the board shall be paid
- 51 out of funds in the board's special fund in the State Treasury.
- 52 Each member of the board, excepting the inspectors provided for
- 53 herein, shall receive per diem as authorized by Section 25-3-69,
- 54 and shall be reimbursed for such other expenses at the same rate
- 55 and under the same conditions as other state employees as provided
- 56 for in Section 25-3-41.
- 57 The board shall give reasonable public notice of all board
- 58 meetings not less than ten (10) days prior to such meetings.
- 59 **SECTION 2.** Section 73-7-2, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 60 reenacted as follows:
- 61 73-7-2. As used in this chapter, the following terms shall
- 62 have the meanings ascribed herein unless the context otherwise
- 63 requires:
- 64 (a) "Board" means the State Board of Cosmetology.
- (b) "Cosmetology" means any one (1) or a combination of
- 66 the following practices if they are performed on a person's head,
- 67 face, neck, shoulder, arms, hands, legs or feet for cosmetic
- 68 purposes:
- 69 (i) Cutting, clipping or trimming hair and hair
- 70 pieces.

- compensation, whether direct or indirect, engages in the practice 85
- 86 of cosmetology.
- 87 "Esthetics" means any one (1) or a combination of (d)
- the following practices: 88
- 89 Massaging the face or neck of a person. (i)
- 90 (ii) Arching eyebrows to include trimming,
- 91 tweezing, waxing, threading or any other method of epilation or
- 92 tinting eyebrows and eyelashes.
- 93 (iii) Tinting eyelashes or eyebrows.
- (iv) Waxing, stimulating, cleaning or beautifying 94
- 95 the face, neck, arms or legs of a person by any method with the

- 96 aid of the hands or any mechanical or electrical apparatus, or by
- 97 the use of a cosmetic preparation.
- The term "esthetics" shall not include the diagnosis,
- 99 treatment or therapy of any dermatological condition.
- 100 (e) "Esthetician" means any person who, for
- 101 compensation, either direct or indirect, engages in the practice
- 102 of esthetics.
- 103 (f) "Instructor" means a person licensed to teach
- 104 cosmetology, or manicuring and pedicuring, or esthetics, or all of
- 105 those, pursuant to this chapter, and shall include those persons
- 106 engaged in the instruction of student instructors.
- 107 (g) "Manicuring and pedicuring" means any one (1) or a
- 108 combination of the following practices:
- 109 (i) Cutting, trimming, polishing, coloring,
- 110 tinting, cleansing or otherwise treating a person's nails.
- 111 (ii) Applying artificial nails.
- 112 (iii) Massaging or cleaning a person's hands,
- 113 arms, legs or feet.
- (h) "Manicurist" means a person who for compensation,
- 115 either direct or indirect, engages in the practice of manicuring
- 116 and pedicuring.
- 117 (i) "Master" means a person holding a cosmetology,
- 118 manicuring and esthetics license who has completed the minimum
- 119 course of continuing education prescribed by Section 73-7-14.

120	(j) "Salon" means an establishment operated for the
121	purpose of engaging in the practice of cosmetology, or manicuring
122	and pedicuring, or esthetics, or wigology, or all of those.
123	(k) "School" means an establishment, public or private
124	operated for the purpose of teaching cosmetology, or manicuring

operated for the purpose of teaching cosmetology, or manicuring and pedicuring, or esthetics, or wigology, or all of those.

SECTION 3. Section 73-7-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 127 reenacted as follows:

73-7-3. The board shall be authorized to employ such clerical and stenographic assistance, bookkeepers, investigators and other agents as they may deem necessary to carry out the provisions of this chapter, and to fix their tenure of employment and compensation therefor. The members of the board shall file a bond with the Secretary of State in the sum of not less than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) payable to the State of Mississippi for the faithful performance of their duties. The bond shall be made by a surety company authorized to do business in this state, the premium of the bond to be paid out of any money in the board's special fund in the State Treasury.

The office of the board shall be located in the greater metropolitan area of the City of Jackson, Mississippi, and in the event office space cannot be obtained in any state-owned building, the board is authorized to rent suitable office space and to pay therefor out of funds in the board's special fund. The board shall employ inspectors as needed, not to exceed seven (7), who

- shall be full-time employees and whose salaries and duties shall be fixed by the board.
- 147 The salaries of all paid employees of the board shall be paid
- 148 out of the funds in the board's special fund. The inspectors
- 149 shall, in addition to their salaries, be reimbursed for such
- 150 expenses as are allowed other state employees under the provisions
- of Section 25-3-41. In addition to the paying of office rent, the
- 152 board is authorized to purchase necessary office furniture and
- 153 equipment, stationery, books, certificates and any other equipment
- 154 necessary for the proper administration of this chapter.
- SECTION 4. Section 73-7-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 156 reenacted as follows:
- 157 73-7-5. (1) All fees and any other monies received by the
- 158 board shall be deposited in a special fund that is created in the
- 159 State Treasury and shall be used for the implementation and
- 160 administration of this chapter when appropriated by the
- 161 Legislature for such purpose. The monies in the special fund
- 162 shall be subject to all provisions of the state budget laws that
- 163 are applicable to special fund agencies, and shall be disbursed by
- 164 the State Treasurer only upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal
- 165 Officer upon requisitions signed by the president of the board or
- 166 another board member designated by the president, and
- 167 countersigned by the secretary of the board. Any interest earned
- 168 on this special fund shall be credited by the State Treasurer to
- 169 the fund and shall not be paid into the State General Fund. Any

- unexpended monies remaining in the special fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not lapse into the State General Fund.
- 172 The State Auditor shall audit the financial affairs of 173 the board and the transactions involving the special fund at least 174 once a year in the same manner as for other special fund agencies. 175 In addition, the Governor, in his discretion, shall have the power from time to time to require an audit of the financial affairs of 176 177 the board, the same to be made by the State Auditor upon request 178 of the Governor. The Governor shall have the power to suspend any member of the board who shall be found in default in any account 179 until such time as it shall be determined whether such default was 180 181 a result of an act of dishonesty on the part of the member, and in 182 the event it is found that such default is an act of dishonesty,
- SECTION 5. Section 73-7-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is reenacted as follows:

73-7-7. (1) The board shall have authority to make
reasonable rules and regulations for the administration of the
provisions of this chapter. The board shall set up a curriculum
for operation of schools of cosmetology and the other professions
it is charged to regulate in this state. The board shall receive
and consider for adoption recommendations for rules and
regulations, school curriculum, and related matters from the

195 of, in addition to the board members, five (5) elected delegates 196 from the Mississippi Cosmetology Association, five (5) elected 197 delegates from the Mississippi Cosmetology School Association, five (5) elected delegates from the Mississippi Independent 198 Beauticians Association, and five (5) elected delegates from the 199 200 School Owners and Teachers Association. The board may revoke the 201 license of any cosmetologist, esthetician, manicurist, instructor, 202 school of cosmetology, or salon, or may refuse to issue a license 203 to any cosmetologist, esthetician, manicurist, instructor, school 204 of cosmetology, or salon that fails or refuses to comply with the 205 provisions of this chapter and the rules and regulations of the 206 board in carrying out the provisions of this chapter.

(2) The board shall have authority to prescribe reasonable rules and regulations governing sanitation of schools of cosmetology and beauty salons for the guidance of persons licensed under this chapter in the operation of schools of cosmetology, or a beauty salon, and in the practice of cosmetology, esthetics, manicuring and pedicuring, and wigology. However, any and all rules and regulations relating to sanitation shall, before adoption by the board, have the written approval of the State Board of Health. When the board has reason to believe that any of the provisions of this chapter or of the rules and regulations of the board have been violated, either upon receipt of a written complaint alleging such violations or upon the board's own initiative, the board, or any of its authorized agents, shall

- 220 investigate same and shall have authority to enter upon the 221 premises of a school of cosmetology or salon at any time during 222 the regular business hours of that school or salon to conduct the 223 investigation. Such investigation may include, but not be limited 224 to, conducting oral interviews with the complaining party, school 225 or salon owner(s) and/or students of the school, and reviewing 226 records of the school or salon pertinent to the complaint and 227 related to an area subject to the authority of the board. 228 investigation shall not include written interviews or surveys of 229 school employees or students, and the privacy of patrons shall be 230 respected by any person making such investigation.
- On or before July 1, 2001, the board shall adopt 231 232 regulations to ensure that all fingernail service products used by 233 licensed cosmetologists, manicurists and other licensees do not 234 contain methyl methacrylate (MMA) as a monomer agent for cosmetic 235 nail applications.
- 236 If the board finds that a violation of the provisions of this chapter or the rules and regulations of the board has 237 238 occurred, it may cause a hearing to be held as set forth in Section 73-7-27. 239
- 240 SECTION 6. Section 73-7-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 241 reenacted as follows:
- 242 73-7-9. No person required by this chapter to have a license 243 shall conduct a beauty salon or school of cosmetology, or practice cosmetology, esthetics, manicuring and pedicuring, or practice as 244

- 245 an instructor, unless such person has received a license or
- 246 temporary permit therefor from the board. Students determined to
- 247 have violated any of these rules or regulations prior to being
- 248 licensed by the board shall be subject to the same discipline by
- 249 the board as licensees. They may be disciplined and fined
- 250 accordingly.
- 251 **SECTION 7.** Section 73-7-11, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 252 reenacted as follows:
- 253 73-7-11. Each owner of a license issued by the board under
- 254 the provisions of this chapter shall display the license in a
- 255 conspicuous place in his or her principal office, place of
- 256 business or employment, at all times.
- 257 Each practitioner and instructor license shall contain a head
- 258 photograph of the license holder, the person's name, and the type
- 259 of license held by the person. The requirements of this section
- 260 shall apply at the time of issuance of a new license or at the
- 261 time of renewal of an existing license.
- SECTION 8. Section 73-7-14, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 263 reenacted as follows:
- 73-7-14. (1) Any person who holds a current, valid
- 265 cosmetology, manicuring or esthetics license may be licensed as a
- 266 master cosmetologist, manicurist or esthetician if he or she has
- 267 been a licensed cosmetologist, manicurist or esthetician in this
- 268 state for a period of not less than twelve (12) months, and has
- 269 completed a minimum course of sixteen (16) hours' study in

270	continuing education approved by the board within the licensing
271	period preceding initial application for the license, and has paid
272	the original license fee. Master cosmetologist, manicurist or
273	esthetician licenses shall be renewable upon completion of a
274	minimum course of eight (8) hours' study in continuing education
275	approved by the board within a licensing period and payment of the
276	required renewal fee. This is an optional license and persons who
277	do not wish to complete the continuing education requirement may
278	obtain a cosmetology license when renewing their license.

- 279 (2) Each application or filing made under this section shall 280 include the social security number(s) of the applicant in 281 accordance with Section 93-11-64, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- SECTION 9. Section 73-7-15, Mississippi Code of 1972, is reenacted as follows:
- 73-7-15. (1) The board shall admit to examination for a cosmetology instructor's license any person who has made application to the board in proper form, has paid the required fee, and who:
- 288 (a) Is not less than twenty-one (21) years of age;
- 289 (b) Can read, write and speak English;
- 290 (c) Is a graduate of a licensed cosmetology school;
- 291 (d) Has a high school education or its equivalent;
- (e) Has successfully completed one thousand (1,000)
- 293 hours of instructor training in a licensed school of cosmetology;

- 296 (g) Holds a current, valid Mississippi cosmetology

- 311 (e) Has successfully completed six (6) semester hours
- 312 in college courses approved by the board;
- 313 (f) Holds a current, valid Mississippi esthetician's
- 314 license; and
- 315 (g) Has had one (1) year of active practical experience
- 316 as an esthetician or, as an alternative to such experience, has
- 317 successfully completed one thousand (1,000) hours of instructor

- The board shall admit to examination for a manicurist 320 (3) 321 instructor's license any person who has made application to the 322 board in proper form, has paid the required fee, and who:
- 323 (a) Is not less than twenty-one (21) years of age;
- 324 Can read, write and speak English; (b)
- 325 Has a high school education or its equivalent; (C)
- 326 Has successfully completed one thousand (1,000) (d)
- hours of instructor training in a licensed school in which the 327
- 328 practice of manicuring is taught;
- 329 Has successfully completed six (6) semester hours
- 330 in college courses approved by the board;
- 331 Holds a current, valid Mississippi manicurist's (f)
- 332 license; and
- 333 Has had one (1) year of active practical experience
- 334 as a manicurist or, as an alternative to such experience, has
- successfully completed one thousand (1,000) hours of instructor 335
- 336 training in a licensed school in which the practice of manicuring
- 337 is taught.
- 338 Applicants shall satisfactorily pass the examination
- 339 prescribed by the board for licensing instructors prior to the
- 340 issuance of the licenses provided for in this section. However,
- 341 the board may, in its discretion, issue a temporary instructor's
- permit until such time as the next examination may be held, but 342

- 343 such applicant shall be issued only one (1) temporary permit. All
- 344 applications for an instructor's examination shall be accompanied
- 345 by two (2) recent head photographs of the applicant.
- 346 (5) All instructors licensed pursuant to this section shall
- 347 biennially obtain twenty-four (24) clock hours of continuing
- 348 education in teacher training instruction in cosmetology or
- 349 esthetics or manicuring, as the case may be, as approved by the
- 350 board. Any instructor who fails to obtain the continuing
- 351 education required by this subsection shall not be allowed to
- 352 instruct nor enroll students under his or her license until such
- 353 education requirement has been met. The board may issue an
- 354 inactive instructor's license to such instructors, and an inactive
- 355 license may be converted into an active license after proof
- 356 satisfactory to the board of completion of at least twenty-four
- 357 (24) clock hours of approved continuing education required for
- 358 teacher training instruction.
- 359 (6) Each application or filing made under this section shall
- 360 include the social security number(s) of the applicant in
- 361 accordance with Section 93-11-64.
- 362 **SECTION 10.** Section 73-7-16, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 363 reenacted as follows:
- 364 73-7-16. (1) All schools of cosmetology or school owners
- 365 shall have a school license and shall pay to the board the
- 366 required license fee biennially therefor. A grace period of sixty
- 367 (60) days will be given in which to renew the license, and upon

368	the expiration of the grace period of sixty (60) days, any
369	applicant for the renewal of a school license will be required to
370	pay a delinquent fee in addition to the renewal fee. The board is
371	hereby authorized and empowered to promulgate necessary and
372	reasonable rules and regulations for the issuance and renewal of
373	school licenses. However, the board shall not refuse to issue or
374	renew a school's license because of the number of schools already
375	in that area of the state, and any rule promulgated by the board
376	for that purpose shall be null and void.

- 377 (2) Each application or filing made under this section shall 378 include the social security number(s) of the applicant in 379 accordance with Section 93-11-64.
- 380 (3) The board shall require all schools of cosmetology to 381 only admit students who have not less than a Tenth-Grade education 382 or a high school diploma or its equivalency.
- 383 **SECTION 11.** Section 73-7-17, Mississippi Code of 1972, is reenacted as follows:
- 385 73-7-17. (1) All salon owners shall have a salon license 386 and shall pay to the board the required license fee therefor and 387 pay the required renewal fee for renewal thereof. A grace period 388 of sixty (60) days will be given in which to renew the license, 389 and upon the expiration of the grace period of sixty (60) days any 390 applicant for the renewal of a salon license will be required to 391 pay a delinquent fee in addition to the renewal fee. A salon 392 license that has been expired for over one (1) year is

393	nonrenewable	and	requires	а	new	application.	Prior	to	the	initial

- 394 issuance of such license, the board shall inspect the premises to
- 395 determine if same qualifies with the law, upon payment by the
- 396 applicant of the required inspection fee.
- 397 (2) Each application or filing made under this section shall
- 398 include the social security number(s) of the applicant in
- 399 accordance with Section 93-11-64, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 400 **SECTION 12.** Section 73-7-18, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 401 reenacted as follows:
- 402 73-7-18. (1) The board shall admit to examination for an
- 403 esthetician's license any person who has made application to the
- 404 board in proper form, has paid the required fee, and who:
- 405 (a) Is not less than seventeen (17) years of age;
- 406 (b) Can read, write and speak English;
- 407 (c) Has a high school education or its equivalent; and
- 408 (d) Has successfully completed a course of training in
- 409 esthetics of not less than six hundred (600) hours in an
- 410 accredited school in which the practice of esthetics is taught,
- 411 including not less than one hundred (100) hours of theory and five
- 412 hundred (500) hours of skill practice.
- Any licensed esthetician wishing to acquire a cosmetology
- 414 license may apply the six hundred (600) hours of esthetics
- 415 training toward the requirements for a cosmetology license.
- 416 (2) Every person who has completed not less than three
- 417 hundred fifty (350) hours of training in esthetics approved by the

- board in this or any other state prior to July 1, 1987, shall be registered with the board within a period not exceeding six (6)

 months after July 1, 1987, and shall be granted an esthetician's license by the board if such person presents satisfactory evidence to the board that he or she has fulfilled all the requirements to be admitted to examination except the training hours requirement.
- 424 (3) Each application or filing made under this section shall 425 include the social security number(s) of the applicant in 426 accordance with Section 93-11-64, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- SECTION 13. Section 73-7-19, Mississippi Code of 1972, is reenacted as follows:
- 429 (1) Except as provided in Section 33-1-39, all 73 - 7 - 19. 430 licenses shall be renewed biennially under the fee schedule in 431 Section 73-7-29. Applications for renewal of licenses for 432 cosmetologists, estheticians, manicurists and instructors must be 433 accompanied by the required renewal fee. A grace period of sixty 434 (60) days will be given in which to renew the license; and upon the expiration of the grace period of sixty (60) days, any 435 436 applicant for the renewal of a license will be required to pay the 437 required renewal fee and a delinquent fee in addition to the 438 renewal fee. The fees may be paid by either personal or certified 439 check, cash or money order, under such safeguards, rules and 440 regulations as the board may prescribe. Checks returned to the 441 board because of insufficient funds shall result in nonrenewal of

the license, which will require the penalty fee for insufficient

- 443 fund checks plus all other amounts due for renewal of the license
- 444 before the license may be renewed. After one (1) year has passed
- 445 from the expiration date of the license, a delinquent fee must be
- 446 paid for each year up to three (3) years, after which the required
- 447 examination must be taken. All applications for examination
- 448 required by this chapter shall expire ninety (90) days from the
- 449 date thereof.
- 450 (2) Each application or filing made under this section shall
- 451 include the social security number(s) of the applicant in
- 452 accordance with Section 93-11-64.
- 453 **SECTION 14.** Section 73-7-21, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 454 reenacted as follows:
- 73-7-21. (1) The board shall admit to examination for a
- 456 manicurist's license any person who has made application to the
- 457 board in proper form, has paid the required fee, and who:
- 458 (a) Is at least seventeen (17) years of age;
- 459 (b) Can read, write and speak English;
- 460 (c) Has successfully completed no less than three
- 461 hundred fifty (350) hours of practice and related theory in
- 462 manicuring and pedicuring over a period of no less than nine (9)

Such application must be accompanied by two (2) recent passport photographs of the 502 503 applicant. Applicants shall pay the required license fee.

- An applicant for a Mississippi instructor's license by (3) reciprocity who has not completed the college courses requirement at the time of application may apply for a onetime temporary teaching permit, which shall be valid for six (6) months and shall be nonrenewable. Such application must be accompanied by proof of enrollment in college course(s), required permit fee, two (2) recent passport photographs of the applicant and other documentation as required for application for a Mississippi instructor's license by reciprocity. Upon proof of completion of college courses and payment of the required license fee, a Mississippi instructor's license shall be issued.
- 515 The issuance of a license by reciprocity to a 516 military-trained applicant or military spouse shall be subject to the provisions of Section 73-50-1. 517

SECTION 16. Section 73-7-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, is reenacted as follows:

520 73-7-25. Every demonstrator in the field of cosmetology 521 shall, before making demonstrations in a salon or school, apply 522 for and obtain a permit from the board. For such permit, which 523 shall be for one (1) year, the required fee shall be paid to the 524 board. This section shall be construed to apply to demonstrators 525 in salons and schools.

SECTION 17. Section 73-7-27, Mississippi Code of 1972, is reenacted as follows:

- violating any of the provisions of this chapter. A conviction of violating any of the provisions of this chapter shall be grounds for automatic suspension of the license or certificate of such person.

In addition, the court may enter a judgment against such person for attorney's 810 811 fees, court costs and the actual costs incurred by the board in 812 investigating the actions of such person for which the board 813 brought the suit for an injunction. In case of violation of any decree issued in compliance with this subsection, the court may 814

- 815 punish the offender for contempt of court and the court shall
- 816 proceed as in other cases.
- 817 (3) The proceedings in this section shall be in addition to
- 818 and not in lieu of the other remedies and penalties provided in
- 819 this chapter.
- SECTION 23. Section 73-7-12, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

- 822 73-7-12. (1) Effective January 1, 2020, the State Board of

- 824 proper notice and shall conduct examinations for cosmetologists,
