1 2 3 4 5	AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 23-15-627, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO REVISE THE APPLICATION FOR AN ABSENTEE ELECTOR'S BALLOT; TO AMEND SECTION 23-15-713, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE ELECTORS TO VOTE ABSENTEE DUE TO A CONCERN OF EXPOSURE TO COVID-19 PANDEMIC; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
7	SECTION 1. Section 23-15-627, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
8	amended as follows:
9	23-15-627. Any elector described in Section 23-15-713 may
10	request an absentee ballot application and vote in person at the
11	office of the registrar in the county in which he or she resides.
12	The registrar shall be responsible for furnishing an absentee
13	ballot application form to any elector authorized to receive an
14	absentee ballot. Except as otherwise provided in Section
15	23-15-625, absentee ballot applications shall be furnished to a
16	person only upon the oral or written request of the elector who
17	seeks to vote by absentee ballot; however, the parent, child,
18	spouse, sibling, legal guardian, those empowered with a power of
19	attorney for that elector's affairs or agent of the elector, who

- 20 is designated in writing and witnessed by a resident of this state
- 21 who shall write his or her physical address on such designation,
- 22 may orally request an absentee ballot application on behalf of the
- 23 elector. The written designation shall be valid for one (1) year
- 24 after the date of the designation. An absentee ballot application
- 25 must have the seal of the circuit or municipal clerk affixed to it
- 26 and be initialed by the registrar or his or her deputy in order to
- 27 be used to obtain an absentee ballot. A reproduction of an
- 28 absentee ballot application shall not be valid unless it is a
- 29 reproduction provided by the office of the registrar of the
- 30 jurisdiction in which the election is being held and which
- 31 contains the seal and initials required by this section. Such
- 32 application shall be substantially in the following form:
- 33 "OFFICIAL APPLICATION FOR ABSENTEE ELECTOR'S BALLOT
- I, , duly qualified and registered in the Precinct
- 35 of the County of, * * * State of Mississippi, coming
- 36 within the purview of the definition 'ABSENT ELECTOR' will be
- 37 absent from the county of my residence on election day, or unable
- 38 to vote in person because (check appropriate reason):
- 39 () (PRESIDENTIAL APPLICANT ONLY:) I am currently a
- 40 resident of Mississippi or have moved therefrom within thirty (30)
- 41 days of the coming presidential election.
- 42 () I am an enlisted or commissioned member, male or female,
- 43 of any component of the United States Armed Forces and am a
- 44 citizen of Mississippi, or a spouse or dependent of such a member.

- 45 () I am a member of the Merchant Marine or the American Red 46 Cross and am a citizen of Mississippi or \underline{a} spouse or dependent of 47 such a member.
- 48 () I am a disabled war veteran who is a patient in any 49 hospital and am a citizen of Mississippi or \underline{a} spouse or dependent 50 of such a veteran.
- () I am a civilian attached to and serving outside of the
 United States with any branch of the United States Armed Forces or
 with the Merchant Marine or American Red Cross, and am a citizen
 of Mississippi or a spouse or dependent of such a civilian.
- () I am a trained or certified emergency response provider
 deployed during any state of emergency declared by the President
 of the United States or Governor of any state within the United
 States and am a citizen of Mississippi or a spouse or dependent of
 such an emergency response provider.
- () I am a citizen of Mississippi temporarily residing
 outside the territorial limits of the United States and the
 District of Columbia.
- () I am a student, teacher or administrator at a college,
 university, junior or community college, high, junior high,
 elementary or grade school, whose studies or employment at such
 institution necessitates my absence from the county of my voting
 residence or <u>a</u> spouse or dependent of such <u>a</u> student, teacher or
 administrator who maintains a common domicile outside the county

69	of my voting residence with such student, teacher or
70	administrator.
71	() I will be outside the county on election.
72	() I have a temporary or permanent physical disability,
73	which may include, but is not limited to, * * * a concern with
74	exposure to COVID-19 during the year 2020 or 2021. Or, I am
75	caring for a dependent * * * and am concerned with exposing that
76	dependent to COVID-19 beginning with July 8, 2020, and the same
77	being repealed on December 31, * * * $\frac{2021}{}$.
78	() I am sixty-five (65) years of age or older.
79	() I am the parent, spouse or dependent of a person with a
80	temporary or permanent physical disability who is hospitalized
81	outside his or her county of residence or more than fifty (50)
82	miles away from his or her residence, and I will be with such \underline{a}
83	person on election day.
84	() I am a member of the congressional delegation, or \underline{a}
85	spouse or dependent of a member of the congressional delegation.
86	() I am required to be at work on election day during the
87	times <u>at</u> which the polls will be open.
88	I hereby make application for an official ballot, or ballots,
89	to be voted by me at the election to be held in, County
90	, * * * for theelection.
91	Mail 'Absent <u>ee</u> Elector's Ballot' to me at the following
92	address: (if eligible to vote
93	by mail).

94	() Mailed ballots only: I wish to receive an absentee
95	ballot for the runoff election
96	I realize that I can be fined up to Five Thousand Dollars
97	(\$5,000.00) and sentenced up to five (5) years in the Penitentiary
98	for making a false statement in this application and for selling
99	my vote and violating the Mississippi Absentee Voter Law. (This
100	sentence is to be in bold print.)
101	If you are temporarily or permanently disabled, you are not
102	required to have this application notarized or signed by an
103	official authorized to administer oaths for absentee balloting.
104	You are required to sign this application in the proper place and
105	have a person eighteen (18) years of age or older witness your
106	signature and sign this application in the proper place.
107	DO NOT SIGN WITHOUT READING. (This sentence is to be in bold
108	print.)

L35	SECTION 2. Section 23-15-713, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
L36	amended as follows:
L37	23-15-713. For the purpose of this subarticle, any duly
L38	qualified elector may vote as provided in this subarticle if the
L39	elector falls within at least one (1) of the following categories:
L40	(a) Any qualified elector who is a bona fide student,
L41	teacher or administrator at any college, university, junior
L42	college, high, junior high, or elementary grade school whose

- studies or employment at such institution necessitates his or her absence from the county of his or her voting residence on the date of any primary, general or special election, or the spouse and dependents of that student, teacher or administrator if such spouse or dependent(s) maintain a common domicile, outside of the county of his or her voting residence, with such student, teacher or administrator.
- 150 (b) Any qualified elector who is required to be away
 151 from his or her place of residence on any election day due to his
 152 or her employment as an employee of a member of the Mississippi
 153 congressional delegation and the spouse and dependents of such
 154 person if he or she shall be residing with such absentee voter
 155 away from the county of the spouse's voting residence.
- 156 (c) Any qualified elector who is away from his or her 157 county of residence on election day for any reason.
- (d) Any person who has a temporary or permanent

 physical disability and who, because of such disability, is unable

 to vote in person without substantial hardship to himself, herself

 or others, or whose attendance at the voting place could

 reasonably cause danger to himself, herself or others. For
- 163 purposes of this paragraph (d), "temporary physical disability"
- 164 shall include any qualified elector who is under a
- 165 physician-imposed quarantine due to COVID-19 during the year 2020
- 166 or 2021 or is caring for a dependent who is under a

- 167 physician-imposed quarantine due to COVID-19 beginning with July
- 168 8, 2020, and the same being repealed on December 31, \star * 2021.
- 169 (e) The parent, spouse or dependent of a person with a
- 170 temporary or permanent physical disability who is hospitalized
- 171 outside of his or her county of residence or more than fifty (50)
- 172 miles distant from his or her residence, if the parent, spouse or
- 173 dependent will be with such person on election day. For purposes
- 174 of this paragraph (e), "temporary physical disability" shall
- include any qualified elector who is * * * concerned with exposure
- 176 to COVID-19 during the year 2020 or 2021 or is caring for a
- 177 dependent * * * and is * * * concerned with exposing a dependent
- 178 to COVID-19 beginning with July 8, 2020, and the same being
- 179 repealed on December 31, * * * 2021.
- 180 (f) Any person who is sixty-five (65) years of age or
- 181 older.
- 182 (g) Any member of the Mississippi congressional
- 183 delegation absent from Mississippi on election day, and the spouse
- 184 and dependents of such member of the congressional delegation.
- (h) Any qualified elector who will be unable to vote in
- 186 person because he or she is required to be at work on election day
- 187 during the times at which the polls will be open.
- 188 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 189 and after July 1, 2021.
