SENATE BILL NO. 2602

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 83-34-4, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 DIVERT A CERTAIN AMOUNT OF THE NONADMITTED INSURER POLICY FEE TO 3 FUND THE RURAL FIRE TRUCK AND SUPPLEMENTAL FUND, AND TO PROVIDE FUNDS TO THE FIRE MARSHAL'S OFFICE FOR FIRE APPARATUS GRANTS AND 5 FIRE PROTECTION GRANTS; TO AMEND SECTION 17-23-1, MISSISSIPPI CODE 6 OF 1972, TO ALLOW USED FIRE TRUCKS THAT ARE LESS THAN FIVE YEARS 7 OLD TO BE PURCHASED UNDER THE RURAL FIRE TRUCK ACQUISITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 8 9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 10 **SECTION 1.** Section 83-34-4, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 11 12 83-34-4. (1) Nonadmitted insurers shall not be assessable insurers of the association. All surplus lines insurance 13 14 producers placing insurance through nonadmitted insurers shall collect from the insured and remit to the association a 15 16 nonadmitted policy fee on all premiums for all insurance written by such surplus lines insurance producer for a policy from a 17 nonadmitted insurer for any and all risks in this state, except 18 19 that policies or portions thereof that cover residential 20 earthquake risks or residential flood risks that are not written

through the National Flood Insurance Program shall be exempt from

- 22 the nonadmitted policy fee. By procuring or selling insurance on
- 23 property in this state from a nonadmitted insurer, each surplus
- 24 lines insurance producer placing insurance through a nonadmitted
- 25 insurer agrees to be bound by the provisions of this chapter and
- 26 to collect and remit the nonadmitted policy fee provided for
- 27 herein.
- 28 (2) The nonadmitted policy fee shall be a percentage of the
- 29 total policy premium but the nonadmitted policy fee shall not be
- 30 considered premium and is not subject to premium taxes or
- 31 commissions. However, failure to pay the nonadmitted policy fee
- 32 shall be treated the same as failure to pay premium. "Total
- 33 policy premium" includes taxes and commissions.
- 34 (3) The nonadmitted policy fee percentage shall be three
- 35 percent (3%).
- 36 (4) Within twenty (20) days of the end of the quarter,
- 37 surplus lines insurance producers placing insurance through
- 38 nonadmitted insurers shall remit directly to the association all
- 39 nonadmitted policy fees collected in the preceding quarter. In
- 40 addition to the nonadmitted policy fee provided for herein,
- 41 surplus lines insurance producers placing insurance through
- 42 nonadmitted insurers shall collect and remit excess deficit
- 43 surcharges as provided by this chapter. Surplus lines insurance
- 44 producers placing insurance through nonadmitted insurers may
- 45 designate another surplus lines insurance producer that actually

- procured the insurance from the nonadmitted carrier to collect and remit the nonadmitted policy fees.
- 48 (5) Each insured in this state who directly procures or
 49 renews insurance with a nonadmitted insurer on properties, risks
 50 or exposures located or to be performed, in whole or in part, in
 51 this state, other than insurance procured through a surplus lines
 52 licensee, shall be subject to the nonadmitted policy fee which
 53 shall be paid by the insured according to the procedures provided

for premium taxes in Section 83-21-17(5).

55 Monies derived from the nonadmitted policy fee collected 56 under this section may be used by the association, in addition to 57 any uses provided for in Section 83-34-3(4), for education, public 58 outreach, training of building officials and other programs 59 targeted to reduce the number of policies within the association; however, beginning on July 1, 2018, and ending on June 30, 2019, 60 61 before any fees are remitted to the association, One Million Five 62 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,500,000.00) shall be diverted and deposited into the Capital Expense Fund, and Four Million Five 63 64 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$4,500,000.00) shall be diverted and 65 deposited into the Rural Fire Truck Fund or Supplementary Rural 66 Fire Truck Fund. Further, beginning July 1, 2019, and ending on 67 June 30, 2020, before any fees are remitted to the association, Three Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$3,500,000.00) shall 68 be diverted and deposited into the Rural Fire Truck Fund or 69

Supplementary Rural Fire Truck Fund. Further, beginning on July

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- 71 1, 2021, and ending on June 30, 2022, before any fees are remitted
- 72 to the association, Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00) shall be
- 73 diverted and deposited into the Rural Fire Truck Fund or
- 74 Supplementary Rural Fire Truck Fund to be used only for the
- 75 purchase of fire trucks that are less than five (5) years old, and
- 76 One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) shall be diverted and paid to
- 77 the State Fire Marshal's Office to be used only for fire apparatus
- 78 grants and fire protection grants; on or before November 1, 2022,
- 79 the State Fire Marshal shall file a report with the Lieutenant
- 80 Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the
- Chairmen of the Senate and House Insurance Committees providing in 81
- 82 detail how such funds were expended.
- 83 This section shall stand repealed from and after July 1,
- 84 2022.
- SECTION 2. Section 17-23-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 85
- 86 amended as follows:
- 87 17-23-1. (1) There is established the Rural Fire Truck
- Acquisition Assistance Program to be administered by the 88
- 89 Department of Insurance for the purpose of assisting counties and
- 90 municipalities in the acquisition of fire trucks.
- 91 There is created in the State Treasury a special fund to
- 92 be designated as the "Rural Fire Truck Fund." The Legislature may
- 93 appropriate that amount necessary to fulfill the obligations
- 94 created under this section by the Department of Insurance, from
- the State General Fund to such special fund, which sum shall be 95

96 added to the remainder of the money transferred on July 1, 1995, 97 and during the 1996 Regular Session to the Rural Fire Truck Fund. Unexpended amounts remaining in the fund at the end of a fiscal 98 99 year shall not lapse into the State General Fund, and any interest earned on amounts in the fund shall be deposited to the credit of 100 101 the fund. Unobligated amounts remaining in the Rural Fire Truck 102 Fund, Fund No. 3507, or in any fund created for funds appropriated 103 or otherwise made available for this program, may be used as 104 matching funds by any county with remaining eligibility as provided herein. It is the intent of the Legislature that the 105 106 Department of Insurance continue to accept applications from the 107 counties for fire trucks as provided in subsection (3) of this

(3) (a) A county that meets the requirements provided herein may receive an amount not to exceed Eight Hundred Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$830,000.00) as provided in subparagraphs (i), (ii), (iii), (iv), (v), (vi), (vii), (viii), (ix), (x), (xi), (xii) and (xiii) of this paragraph, and such amount shall be divided as follows: an amount of not more than Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) per fire truck for the first six (6) trucks and not more than Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000.00) per fire truck for the seventh, eighth, ninth, tenth and eleventh trucks, and not more than Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00) per fire truck for the twelfth and thirteenth truck. Monies distributed under this chapter shall be expended only for the purchase of new

- 122 and such trucks must meet the National Fire Protection Association

- 124 (i) Any county that has not applied for a fire
- 125 truck under this section is eligible to submit applications for
- 126 thirteen (13) fire trucks as follows: six (6) fire trucks at not
- more than Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) per truck and five
- 128 (5) fire trucks at not more than Seventy Thousand Dollars
- 129 (\$70,000.00) per truck, and two (2) fire trucks at not more than
- 130 Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00) per truck or a total of Eight
- 131 Hundred Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$830,000.00).
- 132 (ii) Any county that has received one (1) fire
- 133 truck under this section is eligible to submit applications for
- 134 twelve (12) fire trucks as follows: five (5) fire trucks at not
- more than Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) per truck and five
- 136 (5) fire trucks at not more than Seventy Thousand Dollars
- 137 (\$70,000.00) per truck, and two (2) fire trucks at not more than
- 138 Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00) per truck or a total of Seven
- 139 Hundred Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$780,000.00).
- 140 (iii) Any county that has received two (2) fire
- 141 trucks under this section is eligible to submit an application for
- 142 eleven (11) fire trucks as follows: four (4) fire trucks at not
- more than Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) per truck and five
- 144 (5) fire trucks at not more than Seventy Thousand Dollars
- 145 (\$70,000.00) per truck, and two (2) fire trucks at not more than

- Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00) per truck or a total of not
 more than Seven Hundred Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$730,000.00).

 (iv) Any county that has received three (3) fire
- 149 trucks under this section is eligible to submit an application for
- 150 ten (10) fire trucks as follows: three (3) fire trucks at not
- 151 more than Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) per truck and five
- 152 (5) fire trucks at not more than Seventy Thousand Dollars
- 153 (\$70,000.00) per truck, and two (2) fire trucks at not more than
- 154 Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00) per truck or a total of not
- more than Six Hundred Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$680,000.00).
- 156 (v) Any county that has received four (4) fire
- 157 trucks under this section is eligible to submit an application for
- 158 nine (9) fire trucks as follows: two (2) fire trucks at not more
- than Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) per truck and five (5)
- 160 fire trucks at not more than Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000.00)
- 161 per truck, and two (2) fire trucks at not more than Ninety
- 162 Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00) per truck or a total of not more
- 163 than Six Hundred Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$630,000.00).
- 164 (vi) Any county that has received five (5) fire
- 165 trucks under this section is eligible to submit an application for
- 166 eight (8) fire trucks as follows: one (1) fire truck at not more
- 167 than Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) per truck and five (5)
- 168 fire trucks at not more than Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000.00)
- 169 per truck, and two (2) fire trucks at not more than Ninety

- 170 Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00) per truck or a total of not more
- 171 than Five Hundred Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$580,000.00).
- 172 (vii) Any county that has received six (6) fire
- 173 trucks under this section is eligible to submit an application for
- 174 seven (7) fire trucks as follows: five (5) fire trucks at not
- more than Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000.00) per truck, and two
- 176 (2) fire trucks at not more than Ninety Thousand Dollars
- 177 (\$90,000.00) per truck or a total of not more than Five Hundred
- 178 Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$530,000.00).
- (viii) Any county that has received seven (7) fire
- 180 trucks under this section is eligible to submit an application for
- 181 six (6) fire trucks as follows: four (4) fire trucks at not more
- 182 than Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000.00) per truck, and two (2)
- fire trucks at not more than Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00)
- 184 per truck or a total of not more than Four Hundred Sixty Thousand
- 185 Dollars (\$460,000.00).
- 186 (ix) Any county that has received eight (8) fire
- 187 trucks under this section is eligible to submit an application for
- 188 five (5) fire trucks as follows: three (3) fire trucks at not
- 189 more than Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000.00) per truck, and two
- 190 (2) fire trucks at not more than Ninety Thousand Dollars

- 191 (\$90,000.00) per truck or a total of not more than Three Hundred
- 192 Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$390,000.00).
- 193 (x) Any county that has received nine (9) fire
- 194 trucks under this section is eligible to submit an application for

- 195 four (4) fire trucks as follows: two (2) fire trucks at not more
- 196 than Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000.00) per truck, and two (2)
- 197 fire trucks at not more than Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00)
- 198 per truck or a total of not more than Three Hundred Twenty
- 199 Thousand Dollars (\$320,000.00).
- 200 (xi) Any county that has received ten (10) fire
- 201 trucks under this section is eligible to submit an application for
- 202 three (3) fire trucks as follows: one (1) fire truck at not more
- 203 than Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000.00) per truck, and two (2)
- fire trucks at not more than Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00)
- 205 per truck or a total of not more than Two Hundred Fifty Thousand
- 206 Dollars (\$250,000.00).
- 207 (xii) Any county that has received eleven (11)
- 208 fire trucks under this section is eligible to submit an
- 209 application for two (2) fire trucks at not more than Ninety
- 210 Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00) per truck.
- 211 (xiii) Any county may apply for two (2) fire
- 212 trucks at not more than Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00) per
- 213 truck as provided in subparagraph (xii), provided that the county
- 214 agrees to forego any previous fire truck under subparagraphs (i)
- 215 through (xi) for which the county has not previously applied, and
- 216 that the county has received approval from the Rural Fire Truck
- 217 Acquisition Assistance Program Committee to apply for and receive
- 218 a truck under subparagraph (xii).

| 219 | (b) The board of supervisors of the county shall submit |
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| 220 | its request for the receipt of monies to the Department of |
| 221 | Insurance. A committee composed of the Commissioner of Insurance, |
| 222 | the State Fire Coordinator, the Director of the Rating Bureau and |
| 223 | the Director of the State Fire Academy shall review the requests |
| 224 | by the boards of supervisors and shall determine whether the |
| 225 | county or municipality for which the board of supervisors has |
| 226 | requested a truck meets the requirements of eligibility under this |
| 227 | chapter. |

- (c) To be eligible to receive monies under this chapter:
- 230 A county or municipality must pledge to set 231 aside or dedicate each year as matching funds, for a period not to 232 extend over ten (10) years, local funds in an amount equal to or 233 not less than one-tenth (1/10) of the amount of monies for which 234 it is requesting distribution from the Rural Fire Truck Fund, 235 which pledged monies may be derived from local ad valorem tax 236 authorized by law or from any other funds available to the county 237 or municipality, except for those funds received by municipalities 238 or counties from the Municipal Fire Protection Fund or the County Volunteer Fire Department Fund, as defined in Sections 83-1-37 and 239 240 83-1-39.
- (ii) A municipality must provide adequate

 documentation of its contract with the county that requires the

 municipality to provide fire protection in rural areas. The term

"rural areas" means any area within the county located outside the boundaries of an incorporated municipality or any incorporated municipality with a population of two thousand five hundred (2,500) or less.

The Department of Insurance shall maintain an (d) accurate record of all monies distributed to counties and municipalities and the number of fire trucks purchased and the cost for each fire truck, such records to be kept separate from other records of the Department of Insurance; notify counties and municipalities of the Rural Fire Truck Acquisition Assistance Program and the requirements for them to become eligible to participate; adopt and promulgate such rules and regulations as may be necessary and desirable to implement the provisions of this chapter; and file with the Legislature a report detailing how monies made available under this chapter were distributed and spent during the preceding portion of the fiscal year in each county and municipality, the number of fire trucks purchased, the counties and municipalities making such purchases, and the cost of each fire truck purchased.
