## SENATE BILL NO. 2908 (As Sent to Governor)

1 2 3	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE SUPPORT AND MAINTENANCE OF THE MISSISSIPPI COOPERATIVE EXTENSION SERVICE FOR FISCAL YEAR 2022.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
7	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and
8	maintenance of the Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service for
9	the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021, and ending
10	June 30, 2022 \$ 29,796,866.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is hereby authorized for expenditure out of any special
13	source funds which are collected by or otherwise become available
14	for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the Mississippi
15	Cooperative Extension Service for the fiscal year beginning
16	July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022 \$ 14,247,456.00.
17	SECTION 3. No general funds authorized to be expended herein
18	shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds

- 19 which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions
- 20 of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- 21 **SECTION 4.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 22 Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service provide programs in the
- 23 emphasis areas of Agriculture, Family and Consumer Education,
- 24 Natural Resources and Environment, 4-H, and Business and Community
- 25 Development in each county.
- SECTION 5. No part of the funds appropriated or authorized
- 27 to be expended hereby shall be spent directly or indirectly for
- 28 payment of attorneys' fees for the services of any attorney who
- 29 was not employed by the Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service
- 30 pursuant to the express authorization of the Board of Trustees of
- 31 State Institutions of Higher Learning prior to performance of such
- 32 legal services.
- 33 **SECTION 6.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 34 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2023 shall be submitted to
- 35 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of
- 36 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided
- 37 during the Fiscal Year 2022 budget request process.
- 38 **SECTION 7.** It is the intention of the Legislature that if
- 39 the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this act are used directly
- 40 or indirectly to match or otherwise secure any federal grants,
- 41 research grants or donations, such special source funds not
- 42 classified as current restricted funds shall be added and
- 43 accounted for under Section 2 of this act. Further, it is the

44	intention of the Legislature that all such aforementioned special
45	source funds be included in all reports and requests for the 2022
46	Regular Session of the Mississippi Legislature.
47	SECTION 8. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, One
48	Million Forty-five Thousand Two Hundred Forty-five Dollars
49	(\$1,045,245.00) shall be derived from the Education Enhancement
50	Fund from funds deposited pursuant to Sections 27-65-75 and
51	27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972.
52	SECTION 9. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
53	Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
54	the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
55	in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
56	intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,
57	this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted
58	performance measures provided below:

86	SECTION 10. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions	
87	of Section 2, Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00), or so much	
88	thereof, shall be derived out of any money in the State Treasury	
89	to the credit of the Capital Expense Fund, as created in Section	
90	27-103-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, and allocated in a manner a	ìS
91	determined by the Treasurer's Office. These funds are provided	
92	for operational expenditures.	

93	SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that
94	whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
95	purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
96	stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
97	quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
98	shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
99	the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
100	made without competitive bids.
101	SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
1 0 0	

funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with

Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency

shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their

appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally

or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for

actions contrary to this provision.

SECTION 13. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law.

SECTION 14. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2021.
