SENATE BILL NO. 2917 (As Sent to Governor)

1 AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO DEFRAY THE EXPENSES OF THE 2 MISSISSIPPI EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY, AND FOR THE PURPOSE OF 3 ESTABLISHING A DISASTER RELIEF RESERVE FUND AND DEFRAYING THE COSTS RELATED TO CERTAIN DISASTER ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS FOR FISCAL 4 5 YEAR 2022. 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 7 8 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any funds in the State

- 9 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of
- 10 defraying the expenses of the Mississippi Emergency Management
- 11 Agency in accordance with the provisions of Section 33-15-1 et
- 12 seq., Mississippi Code of 1972, for the fiscal year beginning
- 13 July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022...... \$ 3,960,661.00.
- 14 **SECTION 2.** The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
- 15 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the special
- 16 fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi
- 17 Emergency Management Agency which is comprised of special source
- 18 funds collected by or otherwise available to the agency, for the

19	support and maintenance of the agency for the fiscal year
20	beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022
21	\$ 36,258,572.00.
22	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2,
23	the following positions are authorized:
24	AUTHORIZED POSITIONS:
25	Permanent: Full Time 123
26	Part Time 0
27	Time-Limited: Full Time 71
28	Part Time 0
29	With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
30	responsibility to make certain that funds required to be
31	appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2023 do not
32	exceed Fiscal Year 2022 funds appropriated for that purpose unless
33	programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2022
34	budget by the Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by
35	the Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall
36	determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all
37	appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this
38	act. Absent a special situation or circumstance approved by the
39	State Personnel Board, or unless otherwise authorized by this act,
40	no state agency shall take any action to promote or otherwise
41	award salary increases through reallocation or realignment. If
42	the State Personnel Board determines a special situation or
43	circumstance exists and approves an action, then the agency and

- 44 the State Personnel Board shall provide a monthly report of each
- 45 action approved by the State Personnel Board to the Chairmen of
- 46 the Accountability, Efficiency and Transparency Committees of the
- 47 Senate and House of Representatives and the Chairmen of the
- 48 Appropriations Committees of the Senate and House of
- 49 Representatives. It shall be the responsibility of the agency
- 50 head to ensure that no single personnel action increases this
- 51 projected annual cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2022 appropriations
- 52 for "Personal Services" when annualized, with the exception of
- 53 escalated funds and the award of benchmarks. If, at the time the
- 54 agency takes any action to change "Personal Services," the State
- 55 Personnel Board determines that the agency has taken an action
- 56 which would cause the agency to exceed this projected annual cost
- 57 or the Fiscal Year 2022 "Personal Services" appropriated level,
- 58 when annualized, then only those actions which reduce the
- 59 projected annual cost and/or the appropriation requirement will be
- 60 processed by the State Personnel Board until such time as the
- 61 requirements of this provision are met.
- Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 63 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or
- 64 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
- 65 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
- 66 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
- 67 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
- 68 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions

- 69 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 70 appropriated level.
- No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 72 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
- 73 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
- 74 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
- 76 violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating
- 77 to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
- 78 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
- 79 Funds have been appropriated herein for the purpose of
- 80 implementation and funding Project SEC2 of the Colonel Guy Groff
- 81 State Variable Compensation Plan beginning January 1, 2022, and
- 82 ending June 30, 2022. It shall be the agency's responsibility to
- 83 make certain that each person, excluding executive directors,
- 84 agency heads, and elected judges, shall receive no more than a
- 85 three percent (3%) annual increase in salary which shall not
- 86 exceed the market rate established by the State Personnel Board
- 87 pursuant to the Colonel Guy Groff State Variable Compensation Plan
- 88 for each classification.
- 89 **SECTION 4.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 90 Director of the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency may, upon
- 91 the request of a local public emergency management organization in
- 92 an area which has suffered a natural disaster, supply equipment to
- 93 rural water associations to enable their continued operation when

94	the	local	emergency	management	organization	determines	that	such
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- 95 private entities provide services essential to the welfare of the
- 96 community.
- 97 **SECTION 5.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 98 Director of the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency shall
- 99 provide enhanced training to local governments, supervisors,
- 100 mayors, civil defense groups and municipal associations in
- 101 disaster management.
- 102 **SECTION 6.** In addition to all other sums herein
- 103 appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be
- 104 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
- 105 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the Mississippi
- 106 Emergency Management Agency for the purpose of defraying certain
- 107 administrative expenses and the state share of the cost of
- 108 disaster assistance programs, including, but not being limited to,
- 109 public assistance programs, individual and family grant programs,
- 110 and mitigation programs, for the fiscal year beginning
- 111 July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022.....\$ 585,056.00.
- 112 **SECTION 7.** In addition to all other sums herein
- 113 appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be
- 114 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
- 115 Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi Emergency Management
- 116 Agency Fund Nos. 3725, 3728, 372U, 3729, 37AH, 6820174300, and
- 117 58202 for the purpose of defraying certain administrative expenses
- 118 and the state and federal share of the cost of disaster assistance

171	during the Fiscal Year 2022 budget request process.	
172	SECTION 11. In compliance with the "Mississippi F	Performance
173	Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the i	ntent of
174	the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be	utilized
175	in the most efficient and effective manner possible to	achieve the
176	intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding	authorized,
177	this agency shall make every effort to attain the targe	eted

197	A reporting of the degree to which the performance targets
198	set above have been or are being achieved shall be provided in the
199	agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget
200	Committee for Fiscal Year 2023.
201	SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
202	Executive Director of the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency
203	shall have authority to transfer not more than Five Hundred
204	Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) from any general or special fund
205	treasury fund and major object budget category to another special
206	or general fund treasury fund and major object budget category
207	accordingly under the control of the Mississippi Emergency
208	Management Agency. The purpose of this authority is to more
209	efficiently use available cash reserves. It is further the
210	intention of the Legislature that the Executive Director of the
211	Mississippi Emergency Management Agency shall submit written
212	justification for the transfer to the Legislative Budget Office
213	and the Department of Finance and Administration on or before the
214	fifteenth of the month prior to the effective date of the
215	transfer.
216	SECTION 13. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
217	Mississippi Emergency Management Agency shall submit a
218	notification and summary of all state support funding on all

- 219 disasters that require general funds or state support special 220 funds to the Legislative Budget Office.
- 221 SECTION 14. It is the intention of the Legislature that from 222 any funds appropriated in this act, the agency shall maintain a 223 minimum of nine (9) Area Coordinators to provide daily assistance 224 to local jurisdictions with emergency management activities as 225 well as to provide quicker response to incidents and/or disasters. 226 In addition, it is the intent of the Legislature that these Area 227 Coordinators shall reside in or within fifty (50) miles of their 228 assigned districts.
- 229 SECTION 15. It is the intention of the Legislature that 230 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the 231 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 232 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, 233 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind 234 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to 235 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are made without competitive bids. 236
- SECTION 16. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby reappropriated out of any money in the State Capital Expense Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency for the purpose of reauthorizing the expenditure of State Capital Expense, as authorized in Senate Bill No. 2938, 2020 Regular Session, to

243	provide matching grant funds for Next Generation (NG) 911, for the
244	fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022
245	\$ 240,000.00.
246	Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under the
247	provisions of this section, in no event shall the amount expended
248	exceed the unexpended balance as of June 30, 2021.
249	SECTION 17. Of the funds in Section 2, the following sum, or
250	so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated out of any
251	money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Capital Expense
252	Fund, for the purpose of defraying the expenses for vehicles at
253	the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency for the fiscal year
254	beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022\$ 75,500.00.
255	SECTION 18. The expenditure of the funds appropriated by
256	this act shall be under the direction of the Governor and shall be
257	paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the proper fund or
258	funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State
259	Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal Officer shall issue his
260	warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or
261	officers in the manner provided by law.
262	SECTION 19. This act shall take effect and be in force from

263 and after July 1, 2021.
