SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 2.1

- 1 A RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING APRIL 19-25, 2021, AS "NATIVE PLANT 2 APPRECIATION WEEK" IN MISSISSIPPI AND COMMENDING THE EFFORTS OF 3 THE AUDUBON DELTA REGION OF THE NATIONAL AUDUBON SOCIETY TO RAISE
- AWARENESS OF THE USE OF NATIVE PLANTS IN OUR STATE.
- 5 WHEREAS, native plants are an important part of the State of
- Mississippi's identity, natural heritage and history; and 6
- 7 WHEREAS, native plants provide important aesthetic, economic
- and ecological contributions that make Mississippi a special place 8
- 9 to live; and
- 10 WHEREAS, the Pascagoula River Audubon Center in Moss Point
- and the Strawberry Plains Audubon Center in Holly Springs are part 11
- 12 of the Audubon Delta Region with Louisiana and Arkansas.
- 13 Mississippi is two of 42 communities nationwide to be home to a
- 14 National Audubon Society Education Center; and
- WHEREAS, in the past 15 years, the Audubon Society has held 15
- successful native plant sales and has been awarded a large grant 16
- 17 from Chemours for education in the use of native plants in the
- 18 landscape. PRAC and SPAC has introduced the use of native plants
- 19 in the landscape to residents both in their respective

- 20 communities, along the Mississippi Gulf Coast, and bordering in
- 21 states; and
- 22 WHEREAS, in an effort to raise awareness, PRAC and SPAC have
- 23 incorporated the native plants at city buildings, and placed signs
- 24 at homes whose landscaping includes native plants; and
- 25 WHEREAS, native plants support many species of birds and many
- 26 of those species of birds are found to be breeding within the
- 27 State of Mississippi. Preserving native plant ecosystems is
- 28 critical for the protection of birds, fish and other wildlife, as
- 29 well as water quality in the State of Mississippi; and
- 30 WHEREAS, the Pascagoula River Audubon Chapter and SPAC of
- 31 National Audubon Society, as well as other local organizations and
- 32 businesses, continuously work to expand the market for
- 33 Mississippi's native plants; and
- 34 WHEREAS, by cultivating plants native to Mississippi's
- 35 habitat, we honor our natural heritage, sustain the beauty and
- 36 benefits of our environmental resources, and preserve a natural
- 37 link to wildland areas, both past and present:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
- 39 MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby recognize the week of April 19-25,
- 40 2021, as "Native Plant Appreciation Week" in Mississippi and urge
- 41 all citizens to join in appreciating, enjoying and celebrating our
- 42 floral diversity by taking advantage of the opportunities this
- 43 week to learn more about our native plants, their habitats, and
- 44 how to protect them, encouraging others to take a native plant

- 45 walk, visit a natural area or become involved in a restoration
- 46 project as we join together to celebrate this precious heritage.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution be presented to
- 48 the Pascagoula River Audubon Center, the Holly Springs Strawberry
- 49 Plains Center, forwarded to the Mississippi Museum of Natural
- 50 History and made available to the Capitol Press Corps.
