SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 53

- 1 A RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING THE CLINTON 2 CHRISTIAN ACADEMY "WARRIORS" AND "LADY WARRIORS" BASKETBALL TEAMS 3 AND HEAD COACHES JOSH ZEITZ AND ERICA McCASKILL FOR MAKING HISTORY 4 WITH THE BOYS AND GIRLS MIDSOUTH ASSOCIATION OF INDEPENDENT 5 SCHOOLS CLASS 3A STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS.
- 6 WHEREAS, winning a championship is impressive. Sweeping the
- 7 Girls and Boys State Championships is even more spectacular.
- 8 However, winning both championships without a gym is monumental.
- Clinton Christian Academy (CCA), this year's MAIS Class 3A State 9
- 10 Champions, has done just that; and
- 11 WHEREAS, this year, both teams made history by bringing home
- 12 the school's first State Basketball Championships. It was
- particularly special because of the bond that has formed between 13
- them. Clinton Christian Academy has broken ground to build a new 14
- 15 state-of-the-art athletic and performing arts center this year;
- 16 but, during basketball season, the gym was not completed. That
- 17 meant that CCA had no court to call home. Although it is not the
- first season the school has been in this predicament, COVID made 18
- 19 this year much more challenging. Clinton United Methodist Church

- 20 allowed them to use their gym for workouts, but that meant late
- 21 after school practices. The athletes would head home at the final
- 22 bell to complete their schoolwork, then gather at the church for
- 23 practice. The Lady Warriors began at 6:00 p.m. The boys started
- 24 at 8:30 p.m., once the girls finished. It was usually 10:00 p.m.
- 25 before practice was done. They played their only four "home"
- 26 games this season at the Sunnybrook Christian Home, while the rest
- 27 of the season was spent on the road. It was not a schedule for
- 28 the faint at heart, but the Warrior family preserved; and
- 29 WHEREAS, Coach Josh Zeitz is in his sixth year at Clinton
- 30 Christian Academy. He joined the staff in 2015 as head of the
- 31 boys basketball program and assistant with the baseball and
- 32 softball programs. Three years later, he took over as head coach
- 33 of the softball team, quiding them to back-to-back State
- 34 Championships. Then, he took over the coaching responsibilities
- 35 of the Lady Warriors Basketball Team, and the girls played for the
- 36 State Championship for the first time in the history of the
- 37 thirteen-year-old school; and
- 38 WHEREAS, the Warriors began the season favored to make a run
- 39 deep into the playoffs. The young group has played for four South
- 40 State Championships in the last five years and returned several
- 41 experienced players. Six members of their original nine-man
- 42 roster have been a part of Zeitz's program since the seventh
- 43 grade. They are led by sophomore, K.J. Sykes. The point guard is
- 44 a four-year starter who averaged 19 points, six assists, four

- 45 rebounds and four 4 steals per game this season. Transfer
- 46 students, Trey Alexander from Clinton High School and Jayy
- 47 Whitehead were key players on both ends of the floor. Another big
- 48 offensive push came from senior, Devin Collins, who made 75
- 49 three-pointers during the season. The team went undefeated in 3A,
- 50 finishing the regular season 29-6; and
- 51 WHEREAS, the Lady Warriors had a slightly more difficult
- 52 road. They started the season 5-9, and COVID concerns caused them
- 53 to lose five games over the Christmas break. However, with five
- of the seven girls as members of the school's championship
- 55 softball team, they knew how to win. A key late-season run landed
- 56 them back into the State Championship Game with a regular season
- 57 finish 20-10. The team's balance makes them hard to defend. The
- 58 team is led by Coach Zeitz's daughter, Hanna, a senior point quard
- 59 who had 94 assists this season. However, scoring could come from
- 60 nearly any place on the court. Shooting guard, Maddie Weeks, led
- 61 the defensive effort and made 35 shots from outside the arc. Iris
- 62 Farve, who earned offensive MVP honors for the district, averaged
- 63 10 points and seven rebounds. Sophomore, Rilee Evans took home
- 64 the district MVP honors after leading the scoring for most of the
- 65 year. Those three got offensive help in the State Championship
- 66 from senior Grace Murray, who put up 20 points and snagged 11
- 67 rebounds. Callie Abraham and Audrey Bryson also provided vital
- 68 help from the bench; and

- 69 WHEREAS, Zeitz became only the second coach in MAIS history
- 70 to win both the girls and boys State Basketball Championships in
- 71 the same year; and
- 72 WHEREAS, the Warriors 2021 Championship Roster: Parker
- 73 Price, Brandon Birks, Jayy Whitehead, Collin Stepp, K.J. Sykes,
- 74 Jamar Guy, Devin Brown, Trey Alexander, Keiwon Rodgers, Bobby
- 75 Gibson, Noah Phillips, Jeremy Spiller, Grey Craft, Devin Collins,
- 76 Bray Farve, Head Coach Erica McCaskill; and Head Coach Josh Zeitz;

- 82 Bruner; and Head Coach Josh Zeitz; and

- 84 special teams who have brought honor to their school, their
- 85 community and to the State of Mississippi:

- 87 MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby commend and congratulate the
- 88 Clinton Christian Academy "Warriors" and "Lady Warriors"
- 89 Basketball Teams and Coaches Josh Zeitz and Erica McCaskill for
- 90 making history with one Boys and Girls Midsouth Association of
- 91 Independent Schools Class 3A State Championship and extend to the
- 92 team, coaches, parents and sponsors our best wishes for future
- 93 success.
