THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE HOUSE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

7 SECTION 1. - 103 Provided further, it is the intention of the Legislature, in
- 104 the event budget reductions are imposed on the Gulf Coast Research
- Laboratory by the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of 105
- 106 Higher Learning, as a result of the Governor ordering budget
- 107 reductions under the provisions of Section 27-104-13 or 31-17-123,
- Mississippi Code of 1972, the same percent reduction will be 108
- 109 applied to those state funds identified in this section for Sea

- 111 It is the intent of the Legislature that no general funds
- authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal 112

- 116 After the Mississippi State Chemical Laboratory has provided
- 117 the maximum amount of services which may be provided free of

- 120 services from the funds appropriated under the provisions of
- 121 Sections 1 and 2 if any charges for such services previously
- 122 provided are more than ninety (90) days past due. After all such
- 123 delinquent charges have been paid by a client, the laboratory may
- 124 provide additional services to the client.

136 **SECTION 5.** None of the funds appropriated by this act shall

137 be expended for any purpose that is not actually required or

138 necessary for performing any of the powers or duties of the Board

139 of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning, or any of

140 the powers or duties of any institution under the jurisdiction of

141 the board of trustees, that are authorized by the Mississippi

142 Constitution of 1890, state or federal law, or rules or

143 regulations that implement state or federal law.

144 **SECTION 6.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the

145 budget requests of the individual institutes, laboratories and

146 programs consolidated in this bill for Fiscal Year 2023 shall be

147 submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format

148 and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail

149 provided during the Fiscal Year 2022 budget request process.

150 **SECTION 7.** The Board of Trustees of State Institutions of

151 Higher Learning shall report yearly to the Legislature any

- institution not in compliance with Section 97-11-51, Mississippi
- 153 Code of 1972, which prohibits deficit spending.
- 154 **SECTION 8.** Any funds appropriated pursuant to this act and
- 155 paid as a fee to or deposited in a financial institution shall be
- 156 in compliance with Section 109 of the Constitution of the State of
- 157 Mississippi and Section 25-4-105, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 158 **SECTION 9.** It is the intention of the Legislature that
- 159 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
- 160 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
- 161 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
- 162 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
- 163 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
- 164 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
- 165 made without competitive bids.
- SECTION 10. None of the funds appropriated and/or authorized
- 167 for expenditure under this act shall be used for research in which
- 168 a human embryo is killed or destroyed.
- 169 **SECTION 11.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 170 funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with
- 171 Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency
- 172 shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their
- 173 appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally
- 174 or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for
- 175 actions contrary to this provision.
- 176 **SECTION 12.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
- 177 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the

- credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.

 SECTION 13. This act shall take effect and be in force from
 and after July 1, 2021, and shall stand repealed from and after

 - AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF STATE INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING FOR SUPPORT OF THE EIGHT UNIVERSITIES' DESIGNATED INSTITUTES, LABORATORIES AND PROGRAMS FOR WHICH THEY ARE RESPONSIBLE AND THE EXECUTIVE OFFICE OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2022; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
