House Amendments to Senate Bill No. 2917

TO THE SECRETARY OF THE SENATE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE HOUSE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

7	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
8	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any funds in the State
9	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of
10	defraying the expenses of the Mississippi Emergency Management
11	Agency in accordance with the provisions of Section 33-15-1 et
12	seq., Mississippi Code of 1972, for the fiscal year beginning
13	July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022\$ 3,699,931.00.
14	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
15	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the special
16	fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi
17	Emergency Management Agency which is comprised of special source
18	funds collected by or otherwise available to the agency, for the
19	support and maintenance of the agency for the fiscal year
20	beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022

22	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2,

29 With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's 30 responsibility to make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2023 do not 31 32 exceed Fiscal Year 2022 funds appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2022 33 34 budget by the Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by 35 the Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall 36 determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all 37 appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this 38 act. Absent a special situation or circumstance approved by the 39 State Personnel Board, or unless otherwise authorized by this act, 40 no state agency shall take any action to promote or otherwise award salary increases through reallocation or realignment. 41 Ιf 42 the State Personnel Board determines a special situation or 43 circumstance exists and approves an action, then the agency and 44 the State Personnel Board shall provide a monthly report of each 45 action approved by the State Personnel Board to the chairmen of the Accountability, Efficiency and Transparency Committees of the 46 47 Senate and House of Representatives and the chairmen of the Appropriations Committees of the Senate and House of 48 49 Representatives. 50 head to ensure that no single personnel action increases this 51 projected annual cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2022 appropriations 52 for "Personal Services" when annualized, with the exception of 53 escalated funds and the award of benchmarks. If, at the time the 54 agency takes any action to change "Personal Services," the State 55 Personnel Board determines that the agency has taken an action 56 which would cause the agency to exceed this projected annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2022 "Personal Services" appropriated level, 57 58 when annualized, then only those actions which reduce the 59 projected annual cost and/or the appropriation requirement will be 60 processed by the State Personnel Board until such time as the requirements of this provision are met. 61

62 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or 63 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 64 65 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 66 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The 67 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 68 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 69 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 70 appropriated level.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.

79 SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 80 Director of the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency may, upon the request of a local public emergency management organization in 81 82 an area which has suffered a natural disaster, supply equipment to 83 rural water associations to enable their continued operation when 84 the local emergency management organization determines that such 85 private entities provide services essential to the welfare of the 86 community.

87 SECTION 5. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 88 Director of the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency shall 89 provide enhanced training to local governments, supervisors, 90 mayors, civil defense groups and municipal associations in 91 disaster management.

92 **SECTION 6.** In addition to all other sums herein 93 appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be 94 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 95 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the Mississippi 96 Emergency Management Agency for the purpose of defraying certain 97 administrative expenses and the state share of the cost of 98 disaster assistance programs, including, but not being limited to, public assistance programs, individual and family grant programs, 99

100 and mitigation programs, for the fiscal year beginning

101 July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022.....\$ 585,056.00.

SECTION 7. In addition to all other sums herein

103 appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be 104 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 105 Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi Emergency Management 106 Agency Fund Nos. 3725, 3728, 372U, 3729, 37AH, 6820174300, and 107 58202 for the purpose of defraying certain administrative expenses 108 and the state and federal share of the cost of disaster assistance programs, including, but not being limited to, public assistance 109 110 programs, individual and family grant programs, and mitigation 111 programs, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021, and ending 112 June 30, 2022.....\$ 628,551,214.00.

113 SECTION 8. The funds appropriated under the provisions of 114 Sections 6 and 7 of this act are provided to defray certain 115 administrative expenses and the state and federal share of the 116 cost of disaster assistance programs, including public assistance 117 programs, individual and family grant programs, and mitigation 118 programs resulting from, but not being limited to, the following:

152 SECTION 9. None of the funds appropriated in Section 6 shall 153 be used to establish a special reserve fund in the State Treasury 154 for disaster relief except as provided for in Section 33-15-307, 155 Mississippi Code of 1972.

156 SECTION 10. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 157 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2023 shall be submitted to 158 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of 159 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided 160 during the Fiscal Year 2022 budget request process.

SECTION 11. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted performance measures provided below:

A reporting of the degree to which the performance targets set above have been or are being achieved shall be provided in the agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee for Fiscal Year 2023.

SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 190 191 Executive Director of the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency 192 shall have authority to transfer not more than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) from any general or special fund 193 194 treasury fund and major object budget category to another special or general fund treasury fund and major object budget category 195 196 accordingly under the control of the Mississippi Emergency 197 Management Agency. The purpose of this authority is to more 198 efficiently use available cash reserves. It is further the 199 intention of the Legislature that the Executive Director of the 200 Mississippi Emergency Management Agency shall submit written 201 justification for the transfer to the Legislative Budget Office 202 and the Department of Finance and Administration on or before the

203 fifteenth of the month prior to the effective date of the 204 transfer.

SECTION 13. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency shall submit a notification and summary of all state support funding on all disasters that require general funds or state support special funds to the Legislative Budget Office.

210 SECTION 14. It is the intention of the Legislature that from 211 any funds appropriated in this act, the agency shall maintain a minimum of nine (9) Area Coordinators to provide daily assistance 212 213 to local jurisdictions with emergency management activities as 214 well as to provide quicker response to incidents and/or disasters. 215 In addition, it is the intent of the Legislature that these Area 216 Coordinators shall reside in or within fifty (50) miles of their 217 assigned districts.

218 SECTION 15. It is the intention of the Legislature that 219 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the 220 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 221 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, 222 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind 223 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to 224 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are 225 made without competitive bids.

SECTION 16. The expenditure of the funds appropriated by this act shall be under the direction of the Governor and shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the proper fund or S. B. 2917 PAGE 9 funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law. **SECTION 17.** This act shall take effect and be in force from

and after July 1, 2021, and shall stand repealed from and after June 29, 2021.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

1 AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO DEFRAY THE EXPENSES OF THE 2 MISSISSIPPI EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY, AND FOR THE PURPOSE OF 3 ESTABLISHING A DISASTER RELIEF RESERVE FUND AND DEFRAYING THE 4 COSTS RELATED TO CERTAIN DISASTER ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS FOR FISCAL 5 YEAR 2022.
