House Amendments to Senate Bill No. 2927

TO THE SECRETARY OF THE SENATE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE HOUSE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury
7	to the credit of the Office of State Aid Road Construction Fund,
8	for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the Office of State
9	Aid Road Construction of the Mississippi Department of
10	Transportation for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021, and
11	ending June 30, 2022\$ 195,410,848.00.
12	SECTION 2. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
13	this act, the following positions are authorized:

15	Permanent: Full Time 52
16	Part Time 0
17	Time-Limited: Full Time

19	With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
20	responsibility to make certain that funds required to be
21	appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2023 do not
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    exceed Fiscal Year 2022 funds appropriated for that purpose unless
    programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2022
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    budget by the Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by
    the Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall
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    determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all
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    appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this
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    act. Absent a special situation or circumstance approved by the
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    State Personnel Board, or unless otherwise authorized by this act,
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    no state agency shall take any action to promote or otherwise
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    award salary increases through reallocation or realignment.
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    the State Personnel Board determines a special situation or
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    circumstance exists and approves an action, then the agency and
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    the State Personnel Board shall provide a monthly report of each
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    action approved by the State Personnel Board to the chairmen of
    the Accountability, Efficiency and Transparency Committees of the
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    Senate and House of Representatives and the chairmen of the
    Appropriations Committees of the Senate and House of
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    Representatives. It shall be the responsibility of the agency
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    head to ensure that no single personnel action increases this
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    projected annual cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2022 appropriations
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    for "Personal Services" when annualized, with the exception of
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    escalated funds and the award of benchmarks. If, at the time the
    agency takes any action to change "Personal Services," the State
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    Personnel Board determines that the agency has taken an action
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    which would cause the agency to exceed this projected annual cost
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    or the Fiscal Year 2022 "Personal Services" appropriated level,
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- 48 when annualized, then only those actions which reduce the
- 49 projected annual cost and/or the appropriation requirement will be
- 50 processed by the State Personnel Board until such time as the
- 51 requirements of this provision are met.
- Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 53 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or
- 54 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
- 55 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
- 56 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
- 57 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
- 58 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
- 59 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
- 60 appropriated level.
- No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 62 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
- 63 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
- 64 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
- 66 violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating
- 67 to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
- 68 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
- 69 **SECTION 3.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, it is the
- 70 intention of the Legislature that an amount not to exceed Five
- 71 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) is authorized to be
- 72 expended from funds received from the Mississippi Development
- 73 Authority as reimbursements for actual expenses incurred by the

- 74 Office of State Aid Road Construction for administering and
- 75 providing engineering services to political subdivisions as
- 76 authorized under Section 65-4-15, Mississippi Code of 1972. Any
- 77 such funds shall be deposited into the Office of State Aid Roads
- 78 Administrative Fund for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021,
- 79 and ending June 30, 2022.
- SECTION 4. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, it is the
- 81 intention of the Legislature that an amount not to exceed Thirty
- 82 Million Dollars (\$30,000,000.00) is authorized to be expended for
- 83 the purpose of replacement of structurally deficient bridges on
- 84 the Local System Bridge Program (LSBP).
- 85 **SECTION 5.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 86 Office of State Aid Road Construction shall maintain complete
- 87 accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all
- 88 funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be
- 89 in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal
- 90 Year 2021. It is further the intention of the Legislature that
- 91 the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2023 shall be
- 92 submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format
- 93 and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail
- 94 provided during the Fiscal Year 2022 budget request process.
- 95 **SECTION 6.** In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
- 96 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
- 97 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
- 98 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
- 99 intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,

150	SECTION 7. With the funds appropriated in this	act, the

151 Office of State Aid Road Construction shall notify members of the

152 Mississippi Senate and House of Representatives upon the award of

153 projects within their respective districts and at least five (5)

154 days prior to a public ceremony announcing the award of any grant

155 in their district or any public announcement or ceremony regarding

156 the groundbreaking or opening of a facility, roadway or bridge for

157 which the Legislature has made funds available. Any signage

158 regarding any public event or any new facility, roadway or bridge

159 shall include the following language: "Funds were made available

160 for this project by the Mississippi State Legislature." The

161 signage shall further state the four-year legislative term in

162 which the project was funded.

163 **SECTION 8.** It is the intention of the Legislature to

164 authorize the State Aid Engineer to utilize funds available to the

165 Office of State Aid Road Construction, from any source herein

166 appropriated or made available by the counties or any other

167 source, to pay for costs necessary to comply with the National

168 Bridge Inspection Standards and the Federal Highway

169 Administration's requirements for bridge inspections and/or

170 special studies necessary to comply with federal laws. The State

171 Aid Engineer shall follow the same procedures as have heretofore

172 been established by Sections 65-9-9, 65-9-15 and 65-9-17,

173 Mississippi Code of 1972, for payment of such costs. The Office

174 of State Aid Road Construction may accept, budget and expend these

175 funds subject to and in accordance with rules and regulations of

176 the Department of Finance and Administration in a manner

177 consistent with the escalation of federal or state funds.

SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that in the letting of contracts for which the Office of State Aid Road Construction administers and provides engineering services to political subdivisions under the Economic Development Highway Act, bids may be made from the lowest and best bidder after advertising for competitive sealed bids once in a newspaper published or having a circulation in the county or municipality where the contract will be performed, and the date published for the bid opening may be not less than seven (7) working days after the advertisement is published.

whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are made without competitive bids.

SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that the funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for actions contrary to this provision.

203 SECTION 12. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 204 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 205 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 206 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 207 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 208 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 209 SECTION 13. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2021, and shall stand repealed from and after 210 211 June 29, 2021.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE SUPPORT AND
MAINTENANCE OF THE OFFICE OF STATE AID ROAD CONSTRUCTION OF THE
MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FOR FISCAL YEAR 2022.
