Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

- 9 **SECTION 1.** Section 77-3-721, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 10 reenacted and amended as follows:
- 11 77-3-721. All fees collected under the provisions of this
- 12 article shall be deposited into a special fund which is created in
- 13 the State Treasury to be expended by the commission for the
- 14 implementation and administration of this article. From and after
- 15 July 1, 2016, the expenses of this agency shall be defrayed by
- 16 appropriation from the State General Fund and all user charges and
- 17 fees authorized under this section shall be deposited into the



- 18 State General Fund as authorized by law and as determined by the
- 19 State Fiscal Officer.
- This section shall stand repealed July 1, * * * 2025.
- SECTION 2. Section 19-5-171, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 22 amended as follows:
- 23 19-5-171. (1) Every resident citizen of the county in which
- 24 is located any district created under Sections 19-5-151 through
- 25 19-5-207, of good reputation, being the owner of land or the
- 26 conductor of a business situated within the district and being
- 27 over twenty-five (25) years of age and of sound mind and judgment,
- 28 shall be eligible to hold the office of commissioner.
- 29 (2) Except as provided in Section 19-5-164(3), each person
- 30 appointed or elected as a commissioner, before entering upon the
- 31 discharge of the duties of the person's office, shall be required
- 32 to execute a bond payable to the State of Mississippi in the penal
- 33 sum of not less than Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00)
- 34 conditioned that the person will faithfully discharge the duties
- 35 of the office. Each bond shall be approved by the clerk of the
- 36 board of supervisors and filed with the clerk.
- 37 (3) Each commissioner shall take and subscribe to an oath of
- 38 office prescribed in Section 268, Mississippi Constitution of
- 39 1890, before the clerk of the board of supervisors that the person
- 40 will faithfully discharge the duties of the office of
- 41 commissioner, which oath shall also be filed with the clerk and
- 42 preserved with the official bond.



- 43 Except as provided in subsection (5), the commissioners 44 so appointed or elected and qualified shall be compensated for their services for each meeting of the board of commissioners 45 attended, either regular or special, at a rate to be fixed by the 46 47 board of supervisors, not to exceed the rate established in 48 Section 25-3-69 for officers of state boards, commissions and agencies, and shall be reimbursed for all expenses necessarily 49 50 incurred in the discharge of their official duties in accordance 51 with Section 25-3-41. However, in no one (1) calendar year shall 52 any commissioner be compensated for more than twenty-four (24) 53 meetings.
- 54 (5) (a) The commissioners of the Hancock County Water and
 55 Sewer District shall be compensated for their services at a rate
 56 up to Eighty-four Dollars (\$84.00) per day for each meeting of the
 57 board of commissioners attended, either regular or special, and
 58 shall be reimbursed for all expenses necessarily incurred in the
 59 discharge of their official duties in accordance with Section
 60 25-3-41.
- (b) The commissioners of the Kiln Utility and Fire

 District of Hancock County shall be compensated for their services

 at a rate up to Eighty-four Dollars (\$84.00) per day for each

 meeting of the board of commissioners attended, either regular or

 special, and shall be reimbursed for all expenses necessarily

 incurred in the discharge of their official duties in accordance

 with Section 25-3-41.

- 68 (c) The commissioners of the Pearlington Water and
- 69 Sewer District of Hancock County shall be compensated for their
- 70 services at a rate up to Eighty-four Dollars (\$84.00) per day for
- 71 each meeting of the board of commissioners attended, either
- 72 regular or special, and shall be reimbursed for all expenses
- 73 necessarily incurred in the discharge of their official duties in
- 74 accordance with Section 25-3-41.
- 75 (d) The commissioners of the Diamondhead Water and
- 76 Sewer District of Hancock County shall be compensated for their
- 77 services at a rate up to the Eighty-four Dollars (\$84.00) per day
- 78 for each meeting of the board of commissioners attended, either
- 79 regular or special, and shall be reimbursed for all expenses
- 80 necessarily incurred in the discharge of their official duties in
- 81 accordance with Section 25-3-41.
- 82 (e) The commissioners of the Hancock County Solid Waste
- 83 Authority shall be compensated for their services at a rate up to
- 84 the Eighty-four Dollars (\$84.00) per day for each meeting of the
- 85 board of commissioners attended, either regular or special, and
- 86 shall be reimbursed for all expenses necessarily incurred in the
- 87 discharge of their official duties in accordance with Section
- 88 25-3-41.

- 90 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 91 and after July 1, 2021.



Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 77-3-721, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972,
TO EXTEND THE REPEAL DATE ON THE DEPOSIT OF FEES TO THE STATE
GENERAL FUND AS MANDATED BY THE MISSISSIPPI TELEPHONE SOLICITATION
ACT; TO AMEND SECTION 19-5-171, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO
DELETE THE PROVISION OF LAW THAT PROVIDES THE COMPENSATION FOR
COMMISSIONERS OF THE STANDARD DEDEAUX WATER DISTRICT; AND FOR
RELATED PURPOSES.
