9	SECTION 1. (1) There is created the Mississippi Warrants
10	Task Force. The purpose of the task force is to study: how

13	occurred when executing warrants in the state, and the
14	geographical locations of such executions and injuries occurred.
15	(2) The Mississippi Warrants Task Force shall be composed of

46 (f) Make recommendations regarding procedures for knock
47 and announce warrants to the Speaker of the Mississippi House of
48 Representatives and the Lieutenant Governor by October 1, 2021.

49 (4) The members of the task force shall serve at the will 50 and pleasure of their respective appointing authorities. A 51 majority of the members of the task force shall constitute a 52 quorum for the transaction of business.

(5) (a) The task force shall hold its first meeting no
later than fifteen (15) days after July 1, 2021. At its first
meeting, the task force shall adopt rules for transacting its
business and keeping records.

57 The task force shall meet and conduct business at (b) 58 least once a month. All meetings of the task force and any 59 committees of the task force will be open to the public, with 60 opportunities for public comment provided on a regular basis. Notice of all meetings shall be given as provided in the Open 61 62 Meetings Act, Section 25-41-1 et seq. and appropriate notice also 63 shall be given to all persons so requesting of the date, time and 64 place of each meeting.

(c) The task force is assigned to the Mississippi
Department of Public Safety for administrative purposes only, and
the department shall designate staff to assist the task force.

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68 (6) Members of the task force who are not state officials or 69 state employees may be compensated at the per diem rate authorized by Section 25-3-69 and may be reimbursed in accordance with 70 Section 25-3-41 for mileage and actual expenses incurred in the 71 72 performance of their duties. If legislative members are appointed 73 to the task force, they will be paid from the contingent expense funds of their respective houses in the same manner as provided 74 75 for committee meetings when the Legislature is not in session. 76 However, legislative members will not be paid per diem or expenses 77 for attending meetings of the task force while the Legislature is 78 in session. No task force member may incur per diem, travel or 79 other expenses unless previously authorized by vote, at a meeting 80 of the task force, which action must be recorded in the official minutes of the meeting. Nonlegislative members may be paid from 81 82 any funds made available to the task force for that purpose.

83 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 84 and after July 1, 2021, and shall stand repealed on June 30, 2021.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:
