Senate Amendments to House Bill No. 106

TO THE CLERK OF THE HOUSE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE SENATE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

32 SECTION 1. Section 14, Chapter 42, Laws of 2020, is amended 33 as follows:

34 Section 14. It is the intention of the Legislature that all 35 funds held by the Inmate Welfare Fund be placed in a treasury fund 36 effective July 1, 2020. Of the amounts appropriated in Section 2, 37 an amount not exceeding * * * <u>Six Million Dollars (\$6,000,000.00)</u> 38 shall be available for expenditure in the Inmate Welfare Fund. 39 **SECTION 2.** Section 8, Chapter 92, Laws of 2020, is amended

Section 8. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, Nine Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$900,000.00) may be used to purchase accumulated compensatory time incurred before *** * *** <u>June 30, 2021</u>, by employees whose activities are deemed essential to agency operations for responding to COVID-19.

46 **SECTION 3.** Section 35, Chapter 102, Laws of 2020, is amended 47 as follows:

Section 35. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, * * *
Three Million Two Hundred Forty Thousand Dollars (\$3,240,000.00)
may be used to purchase accumulated compensatory time incurred
before * * * June 30, 2021, by employees * * * who are activated
under emergency orders in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

53 SECTION 4. Section 18, Chapter 106, Laws of 2020, is amended 54 as follows:

55 Section 18. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions 56 of Section 2, Fifty-nine Million Six Hundred Eighty-seven Thousand 57 Five Hundred Forty-five Dollars (\$59,687,545.00), or so much 58 thereof, shall be derived out of any money in the State Treasury 59 to the credit of the Gulf Coast Restoration Fund, as created in 60 Section 57-119-1, Mississippi Code of 1972. From and after July 1, 2016, the expenses (1) 362 of the following enumerated state agencies shall be defrayed by 363 appropriation of the Legislature from the State General Fund: the 364 State Fire Marshal, the State Fire Academy (not including the 365 State Fire Academy Workforce Program Fund), the Office of 366 Secretary of State (not including the Preneed Contracts Loss 367 Recovery Fund), the Mississippi Public Service Commission, the Mississippi Department of Information Technology Services, (not 368 369 including the Mississippi Department of Information Technology 370 Services Revolving Fund), the State Personnel Board, the 371 Mississippi Department of Insurance (not including the Municipal 372 Fire Protection Fund, Section 83-1-37, the County Volunteer Fire 373 Department Fund, Section 83-1-39, and the Mississippi Propane Education and Research Fund, Section 75-57-119), the Mississippi 374 375 Law Enforcement Officers' Minimum Standards Board, the Mississippi 376 Gaming Commission, the Mississippi Department of Revenue - License 377 Tag, the Office of the State Public Defender, the Mississippi 378 Workers' Compensation Commission (not including the Second Injury 379 Trust Fund) and the Office of Attorney General. Beginning July 1, 380 2016, any fees, assessments or other revenues charged for the 381 support of the above-named state agencies shall be deposited into 382 the State General Fund, and any special fund or depository 383 established within the State Treasury for the deposit of such 384 fees, assessments or revenues shall be abolished and the balance H. B. 106

385 transferred to the State General Fund. Expenses heretofore drawn 386 from such special funds or other depositories shall be drawn from 387 the agencies General Fund Account.

388 (2) Beginning with the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016, the 389 amount to be appropriated annually from the State General Fund for 390 the support of each of the above-named state agencies shall not 391 exceed the amount appropriated for such purpose in the preceding 392 fiscal year, plus any increases in or additional fees, assessments 393 or other charges authorized by act of the Legislature for the 394 succeeding fiscal year.

395 (3) The provisions of this section shall not apply to any396 trust fund account that is maintained by any above-named agency.

397 (4) The provisions of this section shall not prohibit any of
 398 the above-named agencies from maintaining clearing accounts in
 399 approved depositories.

400 (5) The provisions of this section shall not apply to any
401 trust fund accounts maintained by the Public Employees' Retirement
402 System and protected under Section 272A of the Mississippi
403 Constitution of 1890.

404 **SECTION 8.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 405 and after its passage.
