## Senate Amendments to House Bill No. 1396

## TO THE CLERK OF THE HOUSE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE SENATE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

## AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State General
7	Funds not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of defraying the
8	expenses of the Mississippi Public Service Commission for the

12	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the special fund in
13	the State Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi Public Service
14	Commission which is comprised of special source funds collected by

16	defraying the expenses of the commission for the fiscal year
17	beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022

174	shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to	
175	the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are	
176	made without competitive bids.	

177	SECTION 10. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
178	Public Service Commission shall compile the amount of time that is
179	expended on each regulated entity during Fiscal Year 2021. On or
180	before August 1, 2021, the Public Service Commission shall report
181	these findings to the House of Representatives' Public Utilities
182	Committee.

SECTION 11. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.

189 **SECTION 12.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 190 and after July 1, 2021, and shall stand repealed June 29, 2021.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:
