## Senate Amendments to House Bill No. 1401

#### TO THE CLERK OF THE HOUSE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE SENATE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

### AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State General
7	Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of defraying the
8	expenses of the State Department of Health for the fiscal year
9	beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022

11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in any special fund in
13	the State Treasury to the credit of the State Department of Health
14	which is comprised of special source funds collected by or
15	otherwise available to the department, for the purpose of
16	defraying the expenses of the department for the fiscal year
17	beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022
18	\$ 395,576,435.00.
19	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
20	Sections 1 and 2, Five Hundred Twenty-six Thousand One Hundred Two
21	Dollars (\$526,102.00) shall be derived from the State General Fund
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- 22 and Nine Million One Hundred Seventy-eight Thousand Seven Hundred
- 23 Eighty-three Dollars (\$9,178,783.00) shall be derived from the
- 24 Health Care Expendable Fund, created in Section 43-13-407,
- 25 Mississippi Code of 1972, for the support and maintenance of the
- 26 State Department of Health. The funds provided in this section
- 27 shall be allocated as follows:
- 28 Maternal and Child Health Care
- 29 Program.....\$ 1,242,943.00
- 30 Early Intervention Program and/or Child Therapeutic
- 31 Services.....\$ 188,661.00
- 32 Health Department Programs.....\$ 8,273,281.00
- 33 **SECTION 4.** Of the funds appropriated in this act,
- 34 Twenty-eight Million Dollars (\$28,000,000.00) is allocated to the
- 35 Trauma Care System. Of the General Fund court assessments
- 36 provided in Section 1, Seven Million Twenty-three Thousand One
- 37 Hundred Ninety-seven Dollars (\$7,023,197.00) shall be allocated
- 38 for Trauma Care Systems and One Million Eight Hundred Five
- 39 Thousand Eight Hundred Fifty-nine Dollars (\$1,805,859.00) shall be
- 40 allocated for Emergency Medical Services. All additional funds
- 41 are appropriated in Section 2. The State Department of Health may
- 42 transfer a portion of Trauma Care System funds to the Division of
- 43 Medicaid for the development and implementation of an enhanced
- 44 reimbursement fee program related to trauma care and services,
- 45 used to match federal funds, under a cooperative agreement between
- 46 the State Department of Health and the Division of Medicaid.

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         It is the intention of the Legislature that none of the funds
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    authorized herein for the Trauma Care System shall be expended to
    the benefit of any hospital located outside the boundaries of the
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    State of Mississippi, unless otherwise excepted in this paragraph.
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    Funds shall be expended by the Mississippi Department of Health
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    for distribution to the Regional Medical Center or Le Bonheur
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    Children's Hospital at Memphis, located in Memphis, Tennessee, or
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    the University of South Alabama Medical Center located in Mobile,
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    Alabama, or the Joseph M. Still Burn Centers, Inc., located in
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    Augusta, Georgia, or the Joseph M. Still Burn and Reconstruction
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    Center at Merit Health Central or any affiliates or any other
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    Level 1 Trauma Center, or Tertiary Pediatric Trauma Center that
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    participates in the Mississippi Trauma Care System, as determined
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    by the Mississippi Department of Health.
         SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, Twenty
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    Million Dollars ($20,000,000.00) shall be derived from the Tobacco
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    Control Program Fund, created in Section 41-113-11, Mississippi
    Code of 1972, and shall be allocated as follows:

98 **SECTION 7.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 99 this act, the following positions are authorized:

With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's responsibility to make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2023 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2022 funds appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2022 budget by the Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this act. Absent a special situation or circumstance approved by the State Personnel Board, or unless otherwise authorized by this act, no state agency shall take any action to promote or otherwise award salary increases through reallocation or realignment. Ιf the State Personnel Board determines a special situation or circumstance exists and approves an action, then the agency and the State Personnel Board shall provide a monthly report of each action approved by the State Personnel Board to the chairmen of the Accountability, Efficiency and Transparency Committees of the Senate and House of Representatives and the chairmen of the

124 Appropriations Committees of the Senate and House of

125 Representatives. It shall be the responsibility of the agency

126 head to ensure that no single personnel action increases this

127 projected annual cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2022 appropriations

128 for "Personal Services" when annualized, with the exception of

129 escalated funds and the award of benchmarks. If, at the time the

130 agency takes any action to change "Personal Services," the State

131 Personnel Board determines that the agency has taken an action

132 which would cause the agency to exceed this projected annual cost

133 or the Fiscal Year 2022 "Personal Services" appropriated level,

134 when annualized, then only those actions which reduce the

projected annual cost and/or the appropriation requirement will be 135

processed by the State Personnel Board until such time as the

137 requirements of this provision are met.

138 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with

139 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law or

allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 140

141 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written

142 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration.

143 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written

144 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions

145 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the

146 appropriated level.

147 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be

148 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are

149	being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
150	act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
151	None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
152	violation of Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating
153	to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
154	interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
155	SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
156	State Department of Health shall maintain complete accounting and
157	personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds
158	appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the
159	same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year
160	2021. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the
161	agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2023 shall be submitted to
162	the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of
163	detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided
164	during the Fiscal Year 2022 budget request process.
165	SECTION 9. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
166	Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of

236	SECTION 10. It is the intention of the Legislature that with
237	the funds provided herein, the State Department of Health may
238	provide and administer without charge, Hepatitis B vaccinations to
239	Emergency Medical Services (EMS) personnel who are in need of such
240	vaccinations through job related exposure.
241	SECTION 11. In addition to all other sums heretofore
242	appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be
243	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury
244	to the credit of the Local Governments and Rural Water Systems
245	Emergency Loan Fund, and the Local Governments and Rural Water
246	System Improvements Revolving Loan Fund as authorized in Chapter
247	521, Laws of 1995, to the State Department of Health for the
248	purpose of defraying the expenses of the Local Governments and
249	Rural Water Systems Improvements Board, for the fiscal year
250	beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022
251	\$ 34.342.704.00.

SECTION 12. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, One
Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) shall come from the Department of
Human Services, Child Care Development Fund or other appropriate
special funds for the purpose of child care licensure. These
funds are to be transferred to the State Department of Health no
later than July 31, 2021. The State Department of Health shall

258 make a complete accounting of the uses of these funds to the

259 Department of Human Services.

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- SECTION 13. It is the intention of the Legislature that the State Department of Health shall expend not more than Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) of the funds appropriated herein for providing the oil known as "Lorenzo's Oil" for the treatment of the genetic disorder adrenoleukodystrophy (ALD), to children and Mississippi residents over the age of twenty-one (21) who have the genetic disorder adrenoleukodystrophy and for whom Medicaid does not reimburse the cost of providing the oil. The department may also provide needed pathology and biannual MRI exams.
- SECTION 14. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, Seven
  Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$700,000.00) are provided for the
  purpose of purchasing AIDS drugs and other necessary AIDS related
  medical services.
- SECTION 15. Of the funds appropriated herein, Twenty-one
  Thousand Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$21,250.00) shall be provided
  to the Southern AIDS Commission, Inc., for the purpose of
  providing technical assistance, and providing for the expansion of
  education on causes and prevention of HIV/AIDS, and providing

278 delivery services to persons infected with HIV. The Southern AIDS

279 Commission, Inc., shall report by February 1, 2022, to the Board

280 of Health and the Chairmen of the House and Senate Public Health

281 Committees the status of the project and all services provided.

282 **SECTION 16.** Of the funds appropriated herein, Twenty-one

283 Thousand Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$21,250.00) shall be provided

to the North Mississippi Health Care Foundation Restricted Fund,

285 for the purpose of providing technical assistance, providing for

286 the expansion of education on causes and prevention of HIV/AIDS,

287 and providing delivery services to persons infected with HIV. The

288 North Mississippi Health Care Foundation shall report by February

289 1, 2022, to the Board of Health and the Chairmen of the House and

290 Senate Public Health Committees the status of the project and all

291 services provided.

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292 **SECTION 17.** Of the funds appropriated herein, Eight Thousand

Five Hundred Dollars (\$8,500.00) shall be provided to the AIDS

294 Services Coalition, Inc., for the purpose of providing housing

295 assistance, outreach, prevention services and supportive services

296 to persons infected with HIV. The AIDS Service Coalition, Inc.,

297 shall report by February 1, 2022, to the Board of Health and the

298 Chairmen of the House and Senate Public Health Committees the

299 status of the project and all services provided.

300 **SECTION 18.** Of the funds appropriated herein, the amounts of

301 Ninety-four Thousand Three Hundred Thirty Dollars (\$94,330.00)

shall be allocated to the T.K. Martin Center at Mississippi State

University and Ninety-four Thousand Three Hundred Thirty Dollars

304 (\$94,330.00) shall be allocated to the Regional Rehabilitation 305 Center in Tupelo for the Early Intervention Program and/or Child 306 Therapeutic Services.

307 **SECTION 19.** Of the funds appropriated herein, Two Hundred 308 Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) is provided for the Breast and 309 Cervical Cancer Program.

In addition to all other funds heretofore SECTION 20. appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi Burn Care Fund which is comprised of special source funds collected by or otherwise available to the department, for the purpose of funding reimbursement for uncompensated medical care to Mississippi burn victims through the trauma care system at in-state burn facilities including the Joseph M. Still Burn and Reconstruction Center at Merit Health Central or for uncompensated aero medical transportation to out-of-state qualified United States Burn Care facilities, and such other provisions necessary to provide burn care for Mississippi residents, including reimbursement for travel, lodgings, meals and other reasonable travel-related expenses incurred by burn victims, family members and/or caregivers, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022.. .....\$ 1,000,000.00.

SECTION 21. Of the funds appropriated in Section 20, the Mississippi Department of Health may provide upon mutual agreement Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) for the Mississippi

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- 330 Firefighters Memorial Burn Association. These funds are to be
- 331 used for monetary support of Mississippi burn victims for travel
- 332 and other expenses to the Joseph M. Still Burn Center in Georgia,
- 333 or the Joseph M. Still Burn and Reconstruction Center at Merit
- 334 Health Central.
- 335 **SECTION 22.** It is the intention of the Legislature that
- 336 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
- 337 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
- 338 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
- 339 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
- 340 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
- 341 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
- 342 made without competitive bids.
- 343 **SECTION 23.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 344 Mississippi Department of Health shall implement same day service
- 345 to receive birth and death certificates.
- 346 **SECTION 24.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 347 Mississippi State Department of Health shall provide the Joint
- 348 Legislative Budget Committee a report of all grants received by
- 349 September 15, 2021. This notification will consist of the name of
- 350 the grant and agency or nonprofit making the award, the award
- amount, and a short list of goals to be achieved.
- 352 **SECTION 25.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 353 Mississippi State Department of Health shall be the fiscal agent
- 354 in all allowable grants awarded.

355 SECTION 26. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, Seven Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$700,000.00) shall come from the 356 357 Department of Education for the purpose of maintenance of effort 358 for the Early Intervention Program. These funds are to be 359 transferred to the State Department of Health no later than 360 December 31, 2021. The State Department of Health shall make a 361 complete accounting of the uses of these funds to the Department 362 of Education.

SECTION 27. The Mississippi Department of Health is authorized to obtain a line of credit through the State Treasurer from the Working Cash-Stabilization Fund or any other special source funds maintained in the State Treasury in an amount not exceeding Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000.00) to fund shortfalls which, from time to time, may occur due to insufficient working cash spent in anticipation of receiving federal reimbursement. The length of indebtedness under this provision shall not carry past the end of the quarter following the loan origination. Loan proceeds shall be received by the State Treasurer and shall be placed in a Mississippi Department of Health designated special fund account. The division may pledge as security for such interim financing future funds that will be received by the division. Any such loans shall be repaid from the first available funds received by the department in the manner of and subject to the same terms provided in this section.

379 **SECTION 28.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with

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381 Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency

382 shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their

383 appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally

384 or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for

385 actions contrary to this provision.

386 **SECTION 29.** With the funds appropriated herein, it is the

387 intention of the Legislature that the Mississippi Department of

388 Health is authorized to set the compensation of all nurse PINs,

389 Epidemiologists and Disease Intervention Specialist Series based

390 on the education and experience of the incumbent not to exceed the

391 end salary as established by the State Personnel Board.

392 **SECTION 30.** It is the intent of the Legislature that the

Chairman of the Board of Health may appoint an official

394 replacement or representative with voting privileges to the

395 Advisory Board of the Office of Mississippi Physician Workforce.

396 **SECTION 31.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the

397 State Health Officer shall have the authority to transfer cash

398 from one special fund treasury fund to another special fund

treasury fund under the control of the Department of Health. It

400 is further the intention of the Legislature that the State Health

401 Officer shall submit written justification for the transfer to the

402 Legislative Budget Office and the Department of Finance and

403 Administration on or before the fifteenth of the month prior to

404 the effective date of the transfer.

405 **SECTION 32.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, it is

406 the intention of the Legislature that Eight Hundred Fifty-nine

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- Thousand Nine Hundred Three Dollars (\$859,903.00) shall be allocated to the Domestic Violence program that is supported from
- 409 General Fund court assessments.
- 410 **SECTION 33.** It is the intent of the Legislature that the
- 411 Mississippi State Department of Health shall have authority to
- 412 escalate the various budgets in both funds and positions, with the
- 413 approval of the State Fiscal Officer, from any special funds
- 414 collected or available for HIV medical or support services,
- 415 clinical quality management, and administrative expenses not to
- 416 exceed Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00), to the agency for
- 417 expenditure. Upon such approval, the Mississippi State Department
- 418 of Health may expend such funds in the manner authorized by law.
- The Executive Director of the Mississippi State Department of
- 420 Health shall submit to the Department of Finance and
- 421 Administration a certified statement providing a detailed
- 422 explanation for any escalation, including a justification for the
- 423 establishment of any new positions or reclassification of existing
- 424 positions.
- 425 **SECTION 34.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
- 426 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
- 427 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
- 428 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
- 429 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
- 430 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
- 431 **SECTION 35.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 432 and after July 1, 2021, and shall stand repealed June 29, 2021.
