## Adopted COMMITTEE AMENDMENT NO 1 PROPOSED TO

## House Bill No. 550

## **BY: Committee**

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

- SECTION 1. Section 45-33-43, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

- 12 45-33-43. At the time a person surrenders a driver's license
- 13 from another jurisdiction or makes an application for a driver's
- 14 license, temporary driving permit, \* \* \* commercial driver's
- 15 license or identification card issued under Section 45-35-3, the
- 16 department shall provide the applicant with written information on
- 17 the registration requirements of this chapter and shall require
- 18 written acknowledgment by the applicant of receipt of the
- 19 notification.



- SECTION 2. Section 63-1-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 21 amended as follows:
- 22 63-1-5. (1) (a) No person shall drive or operate a motor
- 23 vehicle or an autocycle as defined in Section 63-3-103 upon the
- 24 highways of the State of Mississippi without first securing an
- 25 operator's license to drive on the highways of the state, unless
- 26 specifically exempted by Section 63-1-7.
- 27 (b) The types of operator's licenses are:
- 28 (i) Class R;
- 29 (ii) Class D;
- 30 (iii) Class A, B or C commercial license governed
- 31 by Article 5 of this chapter; and
- 32 \* \* \*
- 33 (\* \* \*iv) Interlock-restricted license as
- 34 prescribed in Section 63-11-31.
- 35 (2) (a) Every person who makes application for an original
- 36 license or a renewal license to operate any single vehicle with a
- 37 gross weight rating of less than twenty-six thousand one (26,001)
- 38 pounds or any vehicle towing a vehicle with a gross vehicle weight
- 39 rating not in excess of ten thousand (10,000) pounds other than
- 40 vehicles included in Class C, vehicles which require a special
- 41 endorsement, or to operate a vehicle as a common carrier by motor
- 42 vehicle, taxicab, passenger coach, dray, contract carrier or
- 43 private commercial carrier as defined in Section 27-19-3, other
- 44 than those vehicles for which a Class A, B or C license is

- 45 required under Article 5 of this chapter, may, in lieu of the
- 46 Class R regular driver's license, apply for and obtain a Class D
- 47 driver's license. The fee for the issuance of a Class D driver's
- 48 license shall be as set forth in Section 63-1-43 and the Class D
- 49 license shall be valid for the term prescribed in Section 63-1-47.
- 50 Except as required under Article 5 of this chapter, no driver of a
- 51 pickup truck shall be required to have a Class D or a commercial
- 52 license regardless of the purpose for which the pickup truck is
- 53 used.
- 54 (b) Persons operating vehicles listed in paragraph (a)
- of this subsection for private purposes or in emergencies need not
- 56 obtain a Class D license.
- 57 (3) An interlock-restricted license allows a person to drive
- 58 only a motor vehicle equipped with an iginition-interlock device.
- 59 (4) A person who violates this section is guilty of a

- 61 for not less than two (2) days nor more than six (6) months, by a

- SECTION 3. Section 63-1-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

- 68 (a) To any person under the age of eighteen (18) years
- 69 except as provided in this article.

- 70 (b) To any person whose license to operate a motor 71 vehicle on the highways of Mississippi has been previously revoked 72 or suspended by this state or any other state or territory of the 73 United States or the District of Columbia, if the revocation or 74 suspension period has not expired.
- 75 (c) To any person who is an habitual drunkard or who is 76 addicted to the use of other narcotic drugs.
- 77 (d) To any person who would not be able by reason of
  78 physical or mental disability to operate a motor vehicle on the
  79 highways with safety. However, persons who have one (1) arm or
  80 leg, or have arms or legs deformed, and are driving a car provided
  81 with mechanical devices whereby the person is able to drive in a
  82 safe manner over the highways, if otherwise qualified, shall
  83 receive an operator's license the same as other persons.
- 85 (e) To any person as an operator who has previously 86 been adjudged to be afflicted with and suffering from any mental 87 disability and who has not at time of application been restored to

- 188 license issued pursuant to this article shall be signed and
- 189 verified before a person authorized to administer oaths by both
- 190 the father and mother of the applicant, if both are living and
- 191 have custody of him, or in the event neither parent is living then
- 192 by the person or quardian having such custody or by an employer of
- 193 him, or in the event there is no quardian or employer then by any

- other responsible person who is willing to assume the obligation imposed under Section 63-1-25 upon a person signing the
- 196 application of a minor.
- 197 **SECTION 7.** Section 63-1-35, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 198 amended as follows:
- 199 63-1-35. (1) The Commissioner of Public Safety shall
- 200 prescribe the form of license issued pursuant to this article
- 201 which shall, among other features, include a driver's license
- 202 number assigned by the Department of Public Safety. A licensee
- 203 shall list his social security number with the department which
- 204 shall cross reference the social security number with the driver's
- 205 license number for purposes of identification. Additionally, each
- 206 license shall bear a full-face color photograph of the licensee in
- 207 such form that the license and the photograph cannot be separated.
- 208 The photograph shall be taken so that one (1) exposure will
- 209 photograph the applicant and the application simultaneously on the
- 210 same film. The department shall use a process in the issuance of
- 211 a license with a color photograph that shall prevent as nearly as
- 212 possible any alteration, counterfeiting, duplication,
- 213 reproduction, forging or modification of the license or the
- 214 superimposition of a photograph without ready detection. The
- 215 photograph shall be replaced by the department at the time of
- 216 renewal. Drivers' licenses, including photographs appearing
- 217 thereon, may be renewed by electronic means according to rules and



- regulations promulgated by the commissioner in conformity to Section 27-104-33.
- issued pursuant to this article to licensees who are not United

  States citizens and who do not possess a social security number

  issued by the United States government. The license of such

  persons shall include a number and/or other identifying features.
- 225 (3) Any new, renewal or duplicate driver's license,
  226 temporary driving permit \* \* \* or commercial driver's license
  227 issued to a person required to register as a sex offender pursuant
  228 to Section 45-33-25 shall bear a designation identifying the
  229 licensee or permittee as a sex offender.
  - (4) The commissioner is authorized to provide the new, renewal or duplicate driver's license, temporary driving permit \* \* \* or commercial driver's license to any honorably discharged veteran as defined in Title 38 of the United States Code, and such license or permit shall exhibit the letters "Vet" or any other mark identifying the person as a veteran. The veteran requesting the "Vet" designation shall present his DD-214 or equivalent document that includes a notation from the State Veterans Affairs Board that the applicant is a veteran.
  - (5) Not later than July 1, 2021, the commissioner shall develop and implement a driver's license or driving permit in electronic format as an additional option for license or permit holders. Acceptable electronic formats include display of

- 345 (c) The commissioner shall suspend the driver's
- 346 license \* \* \* or regular learner's permit of a student under
- 347 eighteen (18) years of age who has been reported by the Department
- 348 of Education as required by Section 63-1-10.1, and shall give
- 349 notice of the suspension to the licensee as provided in Section
- 350 63-1-52(4). A school superintendent or designee may request that
- 351 the driver's license \* \* \* or regular learner's permit that has
- 352 been suspended under the provisions of this subsection be
- 353 reinstated after the student has successfully completed nine (9)
- 354 weeks of school attendance without an unlawful absence.
- 355 (4) (a) Any original or renewal license issued under this
- 356 chapter to a person who is not a United States citizen shall
- 357 expire four (4) years from the date of issuance or on the
- 358 expiration date of the applicant's authorized stay in the United
- 359 States, whichever is the lesser period of time, and may be
- 360 renewed, if the person is otherwise qualified to renew the
- 361 license, within thirty (30) days of expiration. The fee for any
- 362 such license and for renewal shall be as prescribed in Section
- 363 63-1-43.
- 364 (b) Any applicant for an original or renewal license
- 365 under this subsection (4) must present valid documentary evidence
- 366 documenting that the applicant:
- 367 (i) Is a citizen or national of the United States;

- 369 or temporary residence in the United States;
- 370 (iii) Has conditional permanent residence status
- 371 in the United States;
- 372 (iv) Has an approved application for asylum in the

- 375 (v) Has a valid, unexpired nonimmigrant visa or
- 376 nonimmigrant visa status for entry into or lawful presence in the
- 377 United States;
- 378 (vi) Has a pending application for asylum in the
- 379 United States;
- 380 (vii) Has a pending or approved application for
- 381 temporary protected status in the United States;
- 382 (viii) Has approved deferred-action status;
- 383 (ix) Has a pending application for adjustment of
- 384 status to that of an alien lawfully admitted for permanent
- 385 residence in the United States or conditional permanent resident
- 386 status in the United States; or
- 387 (x) Has a valid employment authorization card
- 388 issued by the United States Department of Homeland Security.
- 389 (5) For any driver's license issued under this chapter, the
- 390 Department of Public Safety shall send an email and text message
- 391 notification of an upcoming driver's license expiration date to
- 392 the known emails and phone numbers authorized by license holders



- for such notices not less than thirty (30) days before the expiration date of that license.
- 395 **SECTION 10.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 396 and after its passage.

## Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 45-33-43, 63-1-5, 63-1-9, 63-1-10.1, 63-1-23, 63-1-35, 63-1-43 AND 63-1-47, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO DELETE ALL REFERENCES TO AN INTERMEDIATE DRIVER'S LICENSE; TO AMEND SECTION 63-1-21, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE A REGULAR LICENSE HOLDER UNDER THE AGE OF 18 TO DRIVE UNSUPERVISED AT ANY TIME DIRECTLY TO OR FROM AN EDUCATIONAL, RECREATIONAL OR EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITY WITH PARENTAL APPROVAL; TO CONFORM TO THE PRECEDING SECTIONS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
