HOUSE BILL NO. 26

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-19-10, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972,
 TO RESTRICT AWARDS GIVEN UNDER THE SCHOOL RECOGNITION PROGRAM TO
 TEACHERS AND LICENSED STAFF; TO REQUIRE THE STATE BOARD OF
 EDUCATION TO ADOPT RULES FOR THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE PROGRAM; TO
 REQUIRE THE RULES TO INCLUDE PROVISIONS REQUIRING A SCHOOL
 DISTRICT TO POST NOTICE ON ITS WEBSITE OF THE AMOUNT OF AND
 REASONS FOR EACH AWARD RECEIVED BY A SCHOOL WITHIN THE DISTRICT;
 TO REQUIRE THE RULES TO BE PROVIDED TO THE CHAIRS OF THE SENATE
 AND HOUSE EDUCATION COMMITTEES; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- SECTION 1. Section 37-19-10, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 12 amended as follows:
- 37-19-10. (1) The Legislature finds that there is a need
- 14 for a performance incentive program for outstanding teachers and
- 15 licensed staff in highly productive schools.
- 16 (2) Beginning with the 2016-2017 school year, the School
- 17 Recognition Program is created to provide financial awards to
- 18 public schools that:
- 19 (a) Sustain high performance by earning a school
- 20 accountability rating of "A", which shall be funded at One Hundred
- 21 Dollars (\$100.00) per pupil in average daily attendance;

22 (b') Sustain 1	hiah 1	performance	bv	earning	а	school

- 23 accountability rating of "B" $_{\underline{\prime}}$ which shall be funded at
- 24 Seventy-five Dollars (\$75.00) per pupil in average daily
- 25 attendance; or
- 26 (c) Demonstrate exemplary performance by improving at
- 27 least one (1) letter grade, which shall be funded at One Hundred
- 28 Dollars (\$100.00) per pupil in average daily attendance.
- 29 (3) All public schools, including charter schools, earning
- 30 the appropriate school rating are eligible to participate in the
- 31 program.
- 32 (4) School recognition awards must be used for nonrecurring
- 33 salary supplements to the teachers and licensed staff employed in
- 34 the school receiving the financial award. Any nonrecurring salary
- 35 supplements paid to teachers and licensed staff shall be
- 36 prospective, shall be paid over the remainder of the year, and
- 37 shall not be considered part of the local supplement. For
- 38 contracted individuals, there shall be an amendment to the
- 39 existing contract.
- 40 (5) School recognition awards shall not be used for
- 41 administrators.
- 42 (6) The State Board of Education shall adopt, and the State
- 43 Department of Education shall implement, rules and regulations for
- 44 the administration of the School Recognition Program. In addition
- 45 to other necessary matters associated with the administration of
- 46 the program, the rules must include provisions requiring each

- 47 <u>school district to post on its website and on the individual</u>
- 48 website, if any, of each school within the district which has
- 49 received an award, the total dollar value of the award and the
- 50 reason or reasons for which that school received the award funds.
- 51 The reasons may include the school's accountability rating or any
- 52 other qualifying criterion that resulted in an award. For
- information purposes, the department shall furnish copies of these
- 54 rules to the chairs of the Education Committees of the Senate and
- 55 House of Representatives.
- 56 (7) There is * * * created in the State Treasury * * * the
- 57 School Recognition Program Fund, which shall be used by the State
- 58 Department of Education, depending on the availability of funds as
- 59 appropriated, to provide financial awards to schools under this
- 60 section. It shall be the duty of the State Department of
- 61 Education to file with the State Treasurer and the State Fiscal
- 62 Officer such data and information as may be required to enable
- 63 the * * * State Treasurer and State Fiscal Officer to distribute
- 64 the School Recognition Program Funds by electronic funds transfer
- 65 to the several school districts at the time required and provided
- 66 under the provisions of this section. Such data and
- 67 information * * * shall show in detail the amount of funds to
- 68 which each school district is entitled from the School Recognition
- 69 Program Fund. Such data and information * * * may be revised from
- 70 time to time as necessitated by law. At the time provided by law,
- 71 the State Treasurer and the State Fiscal Officer shall distribute

72	to the several school districts the amounts to which they are
73	entitled from the School Recognition Program Fund as provided by
74	this section. Such distribution shall be made by electronic funds
75	transfer to the depositories of the several school districts
76	designated in writing to the State Treasurer based upon the data
77	and information supplied by the State Department of Education for
78	such distribution. In such instances, the State Treasurer shall
79	submit a request for an electronic funds transfer to the State
80	Fiscal Officer, which shall set forth the purpose, amount and
81	payees, and shall be in such form as may be approved by the State
82	Fiscal Officer so as to provide the necessary information as would
83	be required for a requisition and issuance of a warrant. A copy
84	of the record of * * * \underline{the} electronic funds transfers shall be
85	transmitted by the school district depositories to the Treasurer,
86	who shall file duplicates with the State Fiscal Officer. The
87	Treasurer and State Fiscal Officer shall jointly promulgate
88	regulations for the utilization of electronic funds transfers to
89	school districts from the School Recognition Program Fund.
90	(* * $*8$) It is the intent of the Legislature to develop a
91	plan to reward high-performing teachers in schools with an
92	accountability rating of "C," "D" and "F" by July 1, 2016.
93	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
94	and after July 1, 2022.
