HOUSE BILL NO. 51

AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE SCHOOL BOARD OF EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT 2 AND ALL CHARTER SCHOOLS TO ADOPT A POLICY REQUIRING ALL EMPLOYEES TO RECEIVE AN ANNUAL IMMUNIZATION AGAINST INFLUENZA; TO AUTHORIZE SCHOOL EMPLOYEES TO REQUEST A MEDICAL EXEMPTION TO THE VACCINATION 5 REQUIREMENT FROM THE STATE BOARD OF HEALTH; TO PROHIBIT EXEMPTIONS 6 BASED ON RELIGIOUS, PHILOSOPHICAL OR CONSCIENTIOUS REASONS; TO 7 REQUIRE THE STATE BOARD OF HEALTH TO ADOPT SIMILAR RULES AND 8 REGULATIONS REQUIRING ALL PRIVATE SCHOOL EMPLOYEES TO RECEIVE AN 9 ANNUAL IMMUNIZATION AGAINST INFLUENZA; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 11 SECTION 1. (1) Beginning in the 2022-2023 school year, the 12 school board of each local school district and the governing board of each charter school shall adopt a policy requiring all 13 14 employees, both licensed and nonlicensed, to receive an annual 15 immunization against influenza. Except as otherwise provided in subsection (2), the policy must require each employee to submit a 16 17 certificate of vaccination documenting compliance with the 18 immunization requirement to the superintendent of the school 19 district or, in the case of a charter school, the person so designated by the governing board to receive the certificates 20

before December 1 of each year.

24	which must be in writing and supported by written documentation
25	from a duly licensed physician in the state. If granted a medical
26	exemption, the employee must submit a certificate of medical
27	exemption issued by the State Department of Health to the

- 39 (3) An exemption from the immunization requirement of this 40 section may not be granted for religious, philosophical or 41 conscientious reasons.
- 42 (4) The school board of each local school district and the 43 governing board of each charter school shall take such steps as 44 may be necessary to assure implementation of the requirements of 45 this section.

- 46 SECTION 2. (1)The State Board of Health shall adopt rules 47 and regulations that require all private school employees, both licensed and nonlicensed, to receive an annual immunization 48 against influenza beginning in the 2022-2023 school year. Except 49 50 as otherwise provided in subsection (2), the rules and regulations 51 must require each employee to submit a certificate of vaccination 52 documenting compliance with the immunization requirement to the head of the school before December 1 of each year. 53
- 54 An employee may request a medical exemption from the 55 influenza vaccination requirement from the State Board of Health, 56 which must be in writing and supported by written documentation 57 from a duly licensed physician in the state. If granted a medical 58 exemption, the employee must submit a certificate of medical 59 exemption issued by the State Department of Health to the head of the school before December 1. Any exemption that is authorized 60 61 under this subsection must expire no later than one (1) year from 62 the date on which the physician signed documentation supporting the exemption. Employees granted a medical exemption who are not 63 64 immunized must be excluded from school and all school-related 65 activities until the threat of influenza in the community is no 66 longer present or the employee's presence is no longer a threat to 67 the safety and welfare of students or other adults in the school.
- 68 (3) An exemption from the immunization requirement of this 69 section may not be granted for religious, philosophical or 70 conscientious reasons.

- 71 (4) The governing board of each private school shall take
- 72 such steps as may be necessary to assure implementation of the
- 73 requirements of this section.
- 74 (5) For the purposes of this section, the term "private
- 75 school" does not include a legitimate home instruction program, as
- 76 defined under Section 37-13-91.
- 77 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 78 and after July 1, 2022.
