COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 127

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 63-1-216, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972,
 TO PROHIBIT ANY PERSON FROM DRIVING A COMMERCIAL MOTOR VEHICLE IF
 CONVICTED OF ANY CRIME UNDER THE MISSISSIPPI HUMAN TRAFFICKING ACT
 OR ANY FELONY INVOLVING A SEVERE FORM OF TRAFFICKING IN PERSONS AS
 DEFINED BY FEDERAL LAW; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 7 **SECTION 1.** Section 63-1-216, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 8 amended as follows:
- 9 63-1-216. (1) (a) A person shall be disqualified from
- 10 driving a commercial motor vehicle for a period of one (1) year if
- 11 the person's license or permit to drive has been administratively
- 12 suspended under Section 63-11-23 or the person has been convicted
- 13 of a first violation of:
- (i) Operating, attempting to operate, or being in
- 15 actual physical control of a commercial motor vehicle on a highway
- 16 with an alcohol concentration of four one-hundredths percent
- 17 (0.04%) or more, or under the influence as provided in Section
- 18 63-11-30;

19	(ii)	Failure	to	stop	and	render	aid	as	required

- 20 under the laws of this state in the event of a motor vehicle
- 21 accident resulting in the death or personal injury of another;
- 22 (iii) Using a motor vehicle in the commission of
- 23 any offense under state or federal law that is punishable by
- 24 imprisonment for a term exceeding one (1) year;
- 25 (iv) Refusal to submit to a test to determine the
- 26 operator's alcohol concentration, as provided in Title 63, Chapter
- 27 11, Mississippi Code of 1972;
- (v) Operating, attempting to operate, or being in
- 29 actual physical control of a motor vehicle on a highway with an
- 30 alcohol concentration of eight one-hundredths percent (0.08%) or
- 31 more, or under the influence of intoxicating liquor or other
- 32 substance, as provided in Section 63-11-30;
- (vi) Operating, attempting to operate, or being in
- 34 actual physical control of a motor vehicle on a highway when the
- 35 person is under the influence of any other drug or under the
- 36 combined influence of alcohol and any other drug to a degree which
- 37 renders the person incapable of driving safely as provided in
- 38 Section 63-11-30;
- 39 (vii) Operating or attempting to operate a
- 40 commercial motor vehicle while the license is revoked, suspended,
- 41 cancelled, or disqualified;
- 42 (viii) Operating a commercial motor vehicle in a
- 43 negligent manner resulting in a fatal injury.

- (b) A person shall be disqualified from driving a

 commercial motor vehicle for three (3) years if convicted of a

 violation listed in subsection (1) of this section, if the

 violation occurred while transporting a hazardous material

 required to be placarded.
- (c) A person shall be disqualified from driving a

 commercial motor vehicle for life if convicted of two (2) or more

 violations or a combination of them listed in subsection (1) of

 this section arising from two (2) or more separate occurrences.
- 53 (d) A person shall be disqualified from driving a 54 commercial motor vehicle for a period of sixty (60) days if 55 convicted of two (2) serious traffic violations, or one hundred 56 twenty (120) days if convicted of three (3) serious traffic 57 violations, arising from separate incidents occurring within a three-year period. A disqualification for three (3) serious 58 59 traffic violations must be imposed consecutively to any other 60 previous period of disqualification.
- 61 A person shall be disqualified from driving a commercial motor vehicle for life if the person uses a motor 62 63 vehicle in the commission of any offense under state or federal 64 law that is punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one 65 (1) year involving the manufacture, distribution, or dispensing of 66 a regulated drug, or possession with intent to manufacture, 67 distribute, or dispense a regulated drug and for which the person was convicted. 68

- (f) A person who is disqualified from driving a

 commercial motor vehicle shall surrender the person's Mississippi

 commercial driver's license no later than the effective date of

 the disqualification. Upon receipt of the person's commercial

 driver's license, that person, if otherwise eligible, may apply

 for a non-CDL, and upon payment of sufficient fees receive the

 driver's license.
- (g) The commissioner shall adopt rules establishing
 quidelines, including conditions, under which a disqualification
 for life under this section, except for a disqualification issued
 pursuant to paragraph (e) of this subsection, may be reduced to a
 period of not less than ten (10) years.
- 81 (h) A person shall be disqualified from driving a
 82 commercial motor vehicle for a period of sixty (60) days if the
 83 driver is convicted of a first violation of a railroad-highway
 84 grade crossing violation.
- (i) A person shall be disqualified from driving a

 commercial motor vehicle for a period of one hundred twenty (120)

 days if, during any three-year period, the driver is convicted of

 a second railroad-highway grade crossing violation in a separate

 incident.
- 90 (j) A person shall be disqualified from driving a 91 commercial motor vehicle for a period of one (1) year if, during 92 any three-year period, the driver is convicted of a third or

- 93 subsequent railroad-highway grade crossing violation in separate
- 94 incidents.
- 95 (k) A person who is simultaneously subject to a
- 96 disqualification issued by the administrator of the Federal Motor
- 97 Carrier Safety Administration pursuant to 49 CFR, Part 383.52 and
- 98 a disqualification under any other provision of this section shall
- 99 serve those disqualification periods concurrently.
- 100 (2) (a) A person's privilege to operate a commercial motor
- 101 vehicle in the State of Mississippi shall be suspended for one (1)
- 102 year, if:
- 103 (i) The person is convicted of a first violation
- 104 of operating, attempting to operate or being in actual physical
- 105 control of a commercial motor vehicle on a highway with an alcohol
- 106 concentration of four one-hundredths percent (0.04%) or more, or
- 107 under the influence, as provided in Section 63-11-30; and
- 108 (ii) The person's commercial driver's license is
- 109 issued by a state or country that does not issue commercial
- 110 driver's licenses and disqualify persons in accordance with 49
- 111 CFR, Parts 383 and 384.
- 112 (b) A person's privilege to operate a commercial motor
- 113 vehicle in the State of Mississippi shall be suspended for three
- 114 (3) years if the person is convicted of violating subsection (1)
- of this section, and the violation occurred while the person was
- 116 transporting a hazardous material required to be placarded.

- 117 A person's privilege to operate a commercial motor 118 vehicle in the State of Mississippi shall be suspended for life if the person is convicted a second time of violating subsection (1) 119 of this section, and both convictions arise out of separate 120 121 occurrences.
- 122 (d) A person's privilege to operate a commercial motor 123 vehicle in the State of Mississippi shall be suspended for sixty (60) days if the person is convicted of two (2) serious traffic 124 125 violations, or for one hundred twenty (120) days if the person is convicted of three (3) serious traffic violations, arising from 126 127 separate incidents occurring within a three-year period.
 - A person's privilege to operate a commercial motor vehicle in the State of Mississippi shall be suspended for life if the person uses a commercial motor vehicle in the commission of any offense under state or federal law that is punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one (1) year, involving the manufacture, distribution, or dispensing of a regulated drug, or possession with intent to manufacture, distribute, or dispense a regulated drug, and for which the person was convicted.
- 136 In addition to the reasons specified in this (f)137 section for suspension of the commercial driver's license, the 138 commissioner shall be authorized to suspend the commercial 139 driver's license of any person for being out of compliance with an order for support, as defined in Section 93-11-153. The procedure 140 for suspension of a commercial driver's license for being out of 141

142	compliance with an order for support, and the procedure for the
143	reissuance or reinstatement of a commercial driver's license
144	suspended for that purpose, and the payment of any fees for the
145	reissuance or reinstatement of a commercial driver's license
146	suspended for that purpose, shall be governed by Section 93-11-157
147	or 93-11-163, as the case may be. If there is any conflict
148	between any provision of Section 93-11-157 or 93-11-163 and any
149	provision of this article, the provisions of Section 93-11-157 or
150	93-11-163, as the case may be, shall control.
151	(3) A person shall be disqualified from driving a commercial
152	motor vehicle for life if the person is convicted of any crime
153	under the Mississippi Human Trafficking Act in Sections 97-3-54 et
154	seq. or any felony involving a severe form of trafficking in
155	persons, as defined by 22 USC 7102(11).

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from

and after July 1, 2022.
