## HOUSE BILL NO. 153

1	AN ACT TO REQUIRE EACH SCHOOL IN EVERY SCHOOL DISTRICT TO
2	HAVE AN EPINEPHRINE AUTO-INJECTOR AND AN AUTOMATED EXTERNAL
3	DEFIBRILLATOR (AED) IN EACH EDUCATIONAL BUILDING, CENTRAL
4	ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICE AND CAFETERIA, STORED IN A SECURE AND EASILY
5	ACCESSIBLE LOCATION WITHIN EACH RESPECTIVE BUILDING; TO DEFINE THE
6	TERMS USED IN THIS ACT; TO REQUIRE EACH LOCAL SCHOOL BOARD TO
7	ADOPT AND IMPLEMENT A POLICY REGARDING THE MAINTENANCE, STORAGE,
8	ADMINISTRATION AND DISPOSAL OF EPINEPHRINE AUTO-INJECTORS, AND THE
9	MAINTENANCE, STORAGE, TESTING AND USE OF AEDS; TO PRESCRIBE THE
10	MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS OF THE POLICY; TO PROVIDE THAT ONLY LICENSED
11	MEDICAL PROFESSIONALS OR SCHOOL PERSONNEL TRAINED BY LICENSED
12	MEDICAL PROFESSIONALS SHALL BE AUTHORIZED TO ADMINISTER
13	EPINEPHRINE AUTO-INJECTORS OR USE AN AED FOR A PERSON IN EMERGENCY
14	ANAPHYLAXIS OR CARDIAC ARREST; TO REQUIRE THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF
15	HEALTH, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC
16	EDUCATION, TO ESTABLISH GUIDELINES FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF POLICIES
17	BY LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICTS; TO REQUIRE THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF
18	HEALTH TO ADOPT RULES REGARDING THE MAINTENANCE, STORAGE,
19	ADMINISTRATION AND DISPOSAL OF AN EPINEPHRINE AUTO-INJECTOR, AND
20	THE MAINTENANCE, STORAGE, TESTING AND USE OF AEDS IN PUBLIC
21	SCHOOLS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
23	<b>SECTION 1.</b> As used in this act, the following terms shall
24	have the meanings ascribed in this section, unless context clearly
25	requires otherwise:

(a) "Anaphylaxis" means a sudden, severe and

potentially life-threatening allergic reaction that occurs when a

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- "Automated external defibrillator" or "AED" means a 29 (b)
- portable electronic device that automatically diagnoses the 30
- life-threatening cardiac arrhythmias of ventricular fibrillation 31
- 32 (VF) and pulseless ventricular tachycardia, and is able to treat
- 33 them through defibrillation, the application of electricity which
- stops the arrhythmia, allowing the heart to reestablish an 34
- 35 effective rhythm.
- 36 "Epinephrine auto-injector" means a disposable (C)
- 37 medical drug delivery device that contains a premeasured single
- 38 dose of epinephrine that is intended to be used to treat
- 39 anaphylaxis.
- "Licensed medical professional" means a physician, 40 (d)
- physician assistant, advanced practice nurse, registered nurse or 41
- 42 school nurse who is appropriately licensed by the State of
- 43 Mississippi and is designated by a the local school board
- 44 institution to oversee the district's epinephrine administration,
- CPR instruction, automated external defibrillator (AED) usage and 45
- 46 training program.
- 47 "Public postsecondary educational institution" (e)
- 48 means:
- 49 (i) A four-year institution of higher learning
- under the management and control of the Board of Trustees of State 50
- 51 Institutions of Higher Learning; and

52 (	ii)	A two-year	educational	institution	under	the
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- 53 jurisdiction of the Mississippi Community College Board.
- (f) "School" means a public elementary or secondary
- 55 educational facility under the control of a local school board,
- 56 and all the instructional and subsidiary buildings situated on the
- 57 same campus, off-campus teaching locations and regional centers
- 58 under the jurisdiction of the school board.
- 59 (g) "School personnel" means an individual who is a
- 60 faculty or staff member of the local school district.
- (h) "Trained designee" means a member of the school
- 62 personnel trained by a licensed medical professional in the
- 63 emergency administration of epinephrine via an auto-injector
- 64 mechanism, administration of CPR and use of an automated external
- 65 defibrillator (AED).
- 66 **SECTION 2.** All public school districts shall comply with all
- 67 provisions of this act. Each school in every school district
- 68 shall have, in each educational building, central administrative
- 69 office and cafeteria, an epinephrine auto-injector and an AED,
- 70 which is stored in a secure and easily accessible location within
- 71 each respective building to be used by a licensed medical
- 72 professional or trained designee for use in the event of an
- 73 emergency anaphylactic reaction or cardiac arrest.
- 74 **SECTION 3.** (1) Each school district shall adopt and
- 75 implement a policy regarding the maintenance, storage,
- 76 administration and disposal of epinephrine auto-injectors, and the

- 77 maintenance, storage, testing and use of automated external
- 78 defibrillators (AEDs), on the institution's campus.
- 79 The adopted policy must provide:
- That licensed medical professionals or school 80 (a)
- 81 personnel under the guidance of a licensed medical professional
- 82 who are authorized and trained may administer an epinephrine
- auto-injector to or use an AED, when the designee in good faith 83
- 84 believes that an individual is reasonably believed to be
- 85 experiencing anaphylaxis or severe cardiac arrest on the school
- 86 premises;
- 87 That licensed medical professionals or school (b)
- personnel under the quidance of a licensed medical professional 88
- 89 who are authorized and trained may administer an epinephrine
- 90 auto-injector to a person who is reasonably believed to be
- 91 experiencing anaphylaxis, or use an AED on a person who is
- 92 reasonably believed to be experiencing severe cardiac arrest at an
- 93 off-campus event or while in transit to or from an off-campus
- event sponsored by the school district; 94
- 95 Permit a trained designee to carry in a secure but
- 96 easily accessible location a supply of epinephrine auto-injectors
- 97 that is prescribed under a standing protocol from a licensed
- 98 physician;
- 99 That the licensed medical professional shall have (d)
- responsibility for training designees in the: 100

101	(i) Administration of epinephrine via an
102	auto-injector mechanism;
103	(ii) Distributing prescribed epinephrine
104	auto-injectors to trained designees; and
105	(iii) Proper administration of CPR and use of an
106	AED; and
107	(e) That a physician, physician assistant, advanced
108	practice nurse, registered nurse or school nurse who is
109	appropriately licensed by the State of Mississippi shall be
110	designated to serve as the licensed medical professional,
111	authorized to:
112	(i) Establish and administer a standardized
113	training protocol for the emergency administration of epinephrine
114	CPR and use of an AED by trained designees;
115	(ii) Ensure that trained designees have
116	satisfactorily completed the training protocol;
117	(iii) Obtain a supply of epinephrine
118	auto-injectors under a standing protocol from a licensed
119	physician; and
120	(iv) Control distribution to trained designees of
121	epinephrine auto-injectors.
122	(3) To become a trained designee, an individual must:

(a) Be eighteen (18) years of age or older;

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124	(b)	Have, o	r reasonably	expect	to have,	responsibility
125	for students	and other	persons as	a result	of the	individual's
126	occupational	or volunte	eer status;	and		

- (c) Have satisfactorily completed a standardized training protocol established and administered by a licensed medical professional in accordance with guidelines developed by the State Department of Health, in consultation with the State Superintendent of Public Education, in accordance with Section 4 of this act.
- 133 SECTION 4. The State Department of Health, in consultation 134 with the State Superintendent of Public Education, shall establish guidelines for the development of a policy by local school 135 136 districts for the emergency administration of epinephrine to 137 students, school personnel and other persons for anaphylaxis, the 138 administration of CPR and the emergency use of an AED on a 139 student, school personnel or other person in cardiac arrest when a 140 medical professional is not available. The quidelines shall address issues including, but not be limited to, the 141 142 responsibilities of the school district, the licensed medical 143 professional and the trained designee for the emergency 144 administration of epinephrine, administration of CPR and use of an 145 The department shall disseminate the quidelines to the superintendent of each public school district. 146
- 147 <u>SECTION 5.</u> (1) The State Department of Health shall adopt 148 rules regarding the maintenance, storage, administration and

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- 150 storage, testing and use of AEDs in schools subject to a policy
- 151 adopted under Section 3 of this act. The rules must establish:
- 152 (a) The number of epinephrine auto-injectors and AEDs
- 153 available at each school;
- 154 (b) The process to be used by each school district to
- 155 check the inventory of epinephrine auto-injectors and AEDs at
- 156 regular intervals for expiration and replacement and, in the case
- 157 of AEDs, testing; and
- 158 (c) The amount of training required for personnel or
- 159 volunteers to administer an epinephrine auto-injector, administer
- 160 CPR or use an AED.
- 161 (2) No licensed medical professional, trained designee, or
- 162 physician providing a prescription under a standing protocol for
- 163 epinephrine in accordance with this act, shall be held liable for
- 164 any good faith act or omission committed in accordance with the
- 165 provisions of this act. Good faith shall not include willful
- 166 misconduct, gross negligence or recklessness.
- 167 **SECTION 6.** Nothing in this act shall be construed to:
- 168 (a) Permit a trained designee to perform the duties or
- 169 fill the position of a licensed medical professional;
- (b) Prohibit the administration of an epinephrine
- 171 auto-injector mechanism by a person acting pursuant to a lawful
- 172 prescription, administration of CPR or use of an AED; or



(c) Prevent a licensed and qualified member of a health
care profession from administering an epinephrine auto-injector
mechanism, administering CPR or using an AED if the duties are
consistent with the accepted standards of the member's profession.
SECTION 7. This act shall take effect and be in force from
and after July 1, 2022.

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
