HOUSE BILL NO. 192

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 27-19-53, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO REVISE THE REQUIREMENT FOR CERTAIN LICENSE PLATES FOR DISABLED 3 VETERANS FROM ONE HUNDRED PERCENT PERMANENT SERVICE-CONNECTED 4 DISABILITY TO SEVENTY-FIVE PERCENT PERMANENT SERVICE-CONNECTED 5 DISABILITY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

7 SECTION 1. Section 27-19-53, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

8 amended as follows:

9 27-19-53. (1) (a) (i) Any legal resident of the State of 10 Mississippi who is a veteran of service in the Armed Forces of the 11 United States, and who is rated as having **\* \* \*** seventy-five 12 percent (75%) permanent service-connected disability by the Veterans' Administration is privileged to purchase annually under 13 this subsection two (2) motor vehicle license plates or tags in 14 15 his or her county of legal residence, for the sum of One Dollar 16 (\$1.00) in total cost for each plate or tag, regardless of make or 17 model of motor vehicle. The registration year of such motor vehicle shall commence the first day of the month in which 18

21 (ii) Any legal resident of the State of 22 Mississippi who is a veteran of service in the Armed Forces of the 23 United States, and who is rated as having \* \* \* seventy-five 24 percent (75%) permanent service-connected disability by the 25 Veterans' Administration is privileged to purchase annually under 26 this subsection one (1) motorcycle license plate or tag in his or 27 her county of legal residence, for the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) 28 in total cost for each plate or tag. The registration year of 29 such motorcycle shall commence the first day of the month in which 30 application for registration is made, as provided in Section 31 27-19-31.

32 (b) Not more than two (2) such motor vehicle license 33 plates or tags shall be issued under this subsection to each such 34 qualified veteran. Not more than one (1) such motorcycle license 35 plate or tag shall be issued under this subsection to each such 36 qualified veteran.

37 (c) This section pertains only to taxes or plates for38 private passenger motor vehicles or pickup trucks or motorcycles.

39 (d) Proof of ownership of a particular motor vehicle or
40 motorcycle for which a license plate or tag is requested must be
41 shown at time of application for such plate or tag.

42 (e) Vehicles and motorcycles owned by such veterans are 43 exempt under this subsection from all ad valorem and privilege

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44 taxes; however, the surviving spouse of a deceased person who was 45 issued a license plate or tag under this subsection shall be entitled to apply for or retain a license tag issued under this 46 subsection and may continue annually to renew registration for two 47 48 (2) motor vehicle license plates or tags and one (1) motorcycle 49 license plate or tag under this subsection for as long as the spouse remains unmarried. In addition, if a deceased person who 50 51 was eligible to be issued a license plate or tag under this 52 subsection did not apply for or was not issued a license plate or 53 taq, the surviving spouse of such deceased person shall be 54 entitled to apply for and be issued a license plate or tag under 55 this subsection and may continue annually to renew registration 56 for two (2) motor vehicle license plates or tags and one (1) 57 motorcycle license tag or plate under this subsection for as long 58 as the spouse remains unmarried. At the time of application or 59 renewal registration, a surviving spouse who desires to retain a 60 distinctive plate or tag issued under this subsection shall file 61 with the county tax collector a sworn statement that the spouse is 62 unmarried. Any such vehicle or motorcycle when so registered shall be exempt from all ad valorem and privilege taxes. 63

64 (2) Any person who is entitled to obtain license tags under
65 subsection (1) of this section may be issued one (1) additional
66 such license tag for any other vehicle registered in his or her
67 name upon payment of the road and bridge privilege taxes, ad

70 (3) The Department of Revenue is directed to furnish each 71 veteran obtaining a license tag under this section an emblem, 72 which the veteran shall attach securely to the tag, showing that 73 the tag was issued to a disabled American veteran.

74 (4) A license issued under this section shall not be75 transferable to any other person.

(5) Any person evading or violating any of the provisions of this section, or attempting to secure benefits under this section to which he is not entitled, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be fined not less than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisoned in the county jail for not less than ninety (90) days, or both.

82 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 83 and after July 1, 2022.
