HOUSE BILL NO. 255

- 1 AN ACT TO CREATE CERTAIN PROTECTIONS FOR FUNERAL PROCESSIONS; 2 TO ENACT DEFINITIONS; TO PRESCRIBE REGULATIONS; TO REQUIRE CERTAIN 3 SAFETY MEASURES; TO PRESCRIBE A PENALTY FOR FAILURE TO YIELD THE RIGHT-OF-WAY TO A VEHICLE IN A FUNERAL PROCESSION; AND FOR RELATED 5 PURPOSES.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6
- 7 SECTION 1. (1) For the purposes of this section, the
- 8 following words shall have the meanings ascribed herein unless the
- 9 context clearly requires otherwise:
- 10 (a) "Funeral procession" means two (2) or more vehicles
- accompanying the body of a deceased person, or traveling to the 11
- church, chapel or other location at which the funeral service is 12
- to be held, in the daylight hours, including a funeral lead 13
- 14 vehicle or a funeral escort vehicle.
- 15 "Funeral lead vehicle" means any authorized law
- 16 enforcement or nonlaw enforcement motor vehicle properly equipped
- 17 pursuant to subsection (2) of this section or a funeral escort
- vehicle being used to lead and facilitate the movement of a 18

- 19 funeral procession. A funeral hearse may serve as a funeral lead
- 20 vehicle.
- 21 (c) "Funeral escort vehicle" means any motor vehicle
- 22 that is properly equipped pursuant to subsection (2) of this
- 23 section and which escorts a funeral procession.
- 24 (2) (a) All nonlaw enforcement funeral escort vehicles and
- 25 funeral lead vehicles other than a hearse shall be equipped with
- 26 at least one (1) lighted circulation lamp exhibiting an amber
- 27 light or lens visible under normal atmospheric conditions for a
- 28 distance of five hundred (500) feet from the front of the vehicle.
- 29 Flashing amber lights may be used only when such vehicles are used
- 30 in a funeral procession.
- 31 (b) Any law enforcement funeral escort vehicle may be
- 32 equipped with red, blue or amber flashing lights which meet the
- 33 criteria established in paragraph (a).
- 34 (3) (a) Regardless of any traffic control device or
- 35 right-of-way provisions prescribed by state or local ordinance,
- 36 pedestrians and operators of all vehicles, except as stated in
- 37 paragraph (c), shall yield the right-of-way to any vehicle which
- 38 is part of a funeral procession being led by a funeral escort
- 39 vehicle or a funeral lead vehicle.
- 40 (b) When the funeral lead vehicle lawfully enters an
- 41 intersection, either by reason of a traffic control device or at
- 42 the direction of law enforcement personnel, the remaining vehicles
- 43 in the funeral procession may follow through the intersection

- 44 regardless of any traffic control devices or right-of-way
- 45 provisions prescribed by state or local law.
- Funeral processions shall have the right-of-way at 46 (C)
- intersections regardless of traffic control devices, subject to 47
- 48 the following conditions and exceptions:
- 49 (i) Operators of vehicles in a funeral procession
- shall yield the right-of-way to an approaching emergency vehicle 50
- 51 giving an audible or visible signal.
- 52 (ii) Operators of vehicles in a funeral procession
- 53 shall yield the right-of-way when directed to do so by a police
- 54 officer.
- 55 Operators of vehicles in a funeral (iii)
- 56 procession must exercise due care when participating in a funeral
- 57 procession.
- All vehicles comprising a funeral procession shall 58 (a)
- 59 follow the preceding vehicle in the funeral procession as closely
- 60 as is practical and safe.
- Any ordinance, law or regulation stating that motor 61
- 62 vehicles shall be operated to allow sufficient space enabling any
- 63 other vehicle to enter and occupy such space without danger shall
- 64 not be applicable to vehicles in a funeral procession.
- 65 Each vehicle which is part of a funeral procession
- shall have its headlights, either high or low beam, and tail 66
- 67 lights lighted and may also use the flashing hazard lights if the
- 68 vehicle is so equipped.

69	(5) Any person who fails to yield the right-of-way to a
70	vehicle which is a part of a funeral procession as required in
71	subsection (3)(a) of this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor
72	and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined in an amount not to
73	exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00).

74 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 75 and after July 1, 2022.
