## COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 567

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 63-3-519, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO REVISE THE POPULATION THRESHOLD FOR MUNICIPAL LAW ENFORCEMENT 3 OFFICERS TO USE RADAR SPEED DETECTION EOUIPMENT UPON THE PUBLIC STREETS OF THE MUNICIPALITY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 SECTION 1. Section 63-3-519, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 6 7 amended as follows: 63-3-519. It shall be unlawful for any person or peace 8 9 officer or law enforcement agency, except the Mississippi Highway 10 Safety Patrol, to purchase or use or allow to be used any type of radar speed detection equipment upon any public street, road or 11 12 highway of this state. However, such equipment may be used: (a) By municipal law enforcement officers within a 13 14 municipality having a population of two thousand (2,000) or more according to the latest or a previous federal census upon the 15 public streets of the municipality, but in no case where the 16 17 latest federal census population for the municipality is less than one thousand five hundred (1,500); 18

within the confines of any campus wherein more than two thousand
(2,000) students are enrolled;

(c) By municipal law enforcement officers in any
municipality having a population in excess of fifteen thousand
(15,000) according to the latest federal census on federally
designated highways lying within the corporate limits.

The Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol shall be immediately notified by municipal law enforcement of any road blockages or emergencies occurring on any federally designated limited-access highways lying within the corporate limits.

30 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 31 and after July 1, 2022.
