HOUSE BILL NO. 679

- 1 AN ACT TO CREATE THE "MISSISSIPPI PILL PRESS ACT OF 2022"; TO 2 PROHIBIT ANY PERSON FROM UNAUTHORIZED POSSESSION AND TRANSFER OF 3 PILL PRESSES AND SIMILAR DEVICES; TO REQUIRE THAT ALL PILL PRESSES OR SIMILAR DEVICES THAT MAY BE USED TO MANUFACTURE A CONTROLLED 5 SUBSTANCE OR COUNTERFEIT CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE BE REGISTERED WITH 6 THE STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY; TO PROVIDE PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS 7 OF THIS ACT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 9 SECTION 1. This act shall be known and referred to as the
- 10 "Mississippi Pill Press Act of 2022."
- 11 SECTION 2. (1) Except as authorized by this article, it is
- 12 unlawful for any person knowingly or intentionally, unless
- 13 authorized by the State Board of Pharmacy, or other lawful
- 14 authority:
- 15 (a) To sell, barter, transfer, manufacture, distribute
- 16 or possess a pill press, tableting machine, encapsulating machine,
- 17 or gelatin capsule, or any equipment, which may be used to
- 18 manufacture a controlled substance, knowing, intending, or having
- reasonable cause to believe, that it will be used to manufacture a 19
- 20 controlled substance or counterfeit controlled substance.

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21 (b) To create, sell, barter, transfer, distribu

- 22 possess with intent to create, sell, barter, transfer, distribute
- 23 or dispense, a pill press, tableting machine, encapsulating
- 24 machine, or gelatin capsule, or any equipment, which may be used
- 25 to manufacture a controlled substance, knowing, intending, or

- 29 (2) All pill presses, tableting machines, encapsulating
- 30 machines or similar equipment which may be used to manufacture a

- 33 (3) Any person who violates this act shall, upon conviction,
