HOUSE BILL NO. 765

1 AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF 2 HEALTH FOR THE PURPOSE OF FUNDING PHYSICIAN RESIDENCY TRAINING 3 PROGRAMS CREATED THROUGH THE OFFICE OF MISSISSIPPI PHYSICIAN WORKFORCE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2023. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 5 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much of it as may be 6 7 necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the 8 9 State Department of Health for the purpose of funding physician 10 residency training programs created through the Office of Mississippi Physician Workforce, as provided in Section 2 of this 11 12 act, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023.....\$ 20,000,000.00. 13 14 SECTION 2. (1) The funds appropriated in Section 1 of this act shall be administered through the State Department of Health 15 and the University of Mississippi Medical Center, and the State 16 17 Health Officer shall consult with the Director of the Office of Mississippi Workforce regarding which facilities or sites will 18 receive funds for physician residency training programs and the 19 H. - 20 manner in which the funds will be provided to the facilities or
- 21 sites.
- 22 (2) The facilities or sites may expend the funds that they
- 23 receive for transitioning their current health care delivery model
- 24 to a model more appropriate for the community that the facilities
- 25 serve, as well as upgrading the quality of their training
- 26 programs, by doing any or all of the following:
- 27 (a) Acquiring and implementing new technological tools
- 28 and infrastructure, including, but not limited to, telemedicine
- 29 delivery methods, electronic health record optimization,
- 30 purchasing connected devices, upgrading digital devices, public
- 31 health reporting, and implementing online or mobile patient
- 32 appointment management applications; and
- 33 (b) Supporting the implementation of population health
- 34 management.
- 35 **SECTION 3.** (1) As used in this section and Section 4 of
- 36 this act, the term "department" means the State Department of
- 37 Health.
- 38 (2) The department shall not disburse any funds appropriated
- 39 under this act to any recipient without first: (a) making an
- 40 individualized determination that the reimbursement sought is, in
- 41 the department's independent judgment, for necessary expenditures
- 42 eligible under Section 602 of the federal Social Security Act as
- 43 added by Section 9901 of the federal American Rescue Plan Act of
- 44 2021 (ARPA) and its implementing quidelines, quidance, rules,

- 45 regulations and/or other criteria, as may be amended or
- 46 supplemented from time to time, by the United States Department of
- 47 the Treasury; and (b) determining that the recipient has not
- 48 received and will not receive reimbursement for the expense in
- 49 question from any source of funds, including insurance proceeds,
- 50 other than those funds provided under Section 602 of the federal
- 51 Social Security Act as added by Section 9901 of ARPA. In
- 52 addition, the department shall ensure that all funds appropriated
- 53 under this act are disbursed in compliance with the Single Audit
- 54 Act (31 USC Sections 7501-7507) and the related provisions of the
- 55 Uniform Guidance, 2 CFR Section 200.303 regarding internal
- 56 controls, Sections 200.330 through 200.332 regarding sub-recipient
- 57 monitoring and management, and subpart F regarding audit
- 58 requirements.
- 59 **SECTION 4.** (1) As a condition of receiving and expending
- 60 the funds appropriated to the department under this act, the
- 61 department shall certify to the Department of Finance and
- 62 Administration that each expenditure of the funds appropriated to
- 63 the department under this act complies with the guidelines,
- 64 guidance, rules, regulations and/or other criteria, as may be
- 65 amended from time to time, of the United States Department of the
- 66 Treasury regarding the use of monies from the Coronavirus State
- 67 Fiscal Recovery Fund established by the American Rescue Plan Act
- 68 of 2021.

69	(2) If the Office of Inspector General of the United States
70	Department of the Treasury, or the Office of Inspector General of
71	any other federal agency having oversight over the use of monies
72	from the Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund established by the
73	American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (a) determines that the
74	department or recipient has expended or otherwise used any of the
75	funds appropriated to the department under this act for any
76	purpose that is not in compliance with the guidelines, guidance,
77	rules, regulations and/or other criteria, as may be amended from
78	time to time, of the United States Department of the Treasury
79	regarding the use of monies from the Coronavirus State Fiscal
80	Recovery Fund established by the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021,
81	and (b) the State of Mississippi is required to repay the federal
82	government for any of those funds that the Office of the Inspector
83	General determined were expended or otherwise used improperly by
84	the department or recipient, then the department or recipient that
85	expended or otherwise used those funds improperly shall be
86	required to pay the amount of those funds to the State of
87	Mississippi for repayment to the federal government.
88	SECTION 5. The money appropriated by this act shall be paid
89	by the State Treasurer out of any money in the Coronavirus State
90	Fiscal Recovery Fund not otherwise appropriated, upon warrants

issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal Officer

shall issue his or her warrants upon requisitions signed by the

proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law.

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94 **SECTION 6.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 95 and after July 1, 2022.
