HOUSE BILL NO. 769

1 AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE COVID-19 MISSISSIPPI LOCAL PROVIDER 2 INNOVATION GRANT PROGRAM TO BE ADMINISTERED BY THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH; TO PROVIDE THAT THE PROGRAM AND ANY GRANT 3 AWARDED UNDER THE PROGRAM SHALL BE FOR THE PURPOSE OF 5 STRENGTHENING AND IMPROVING THE HEALTH CARE SYSTEM AND INCREASING 6 ACCESS TO HEALTH CARE SERVICES PROVIDERS TO HELP COMMUNITIES 7 ACHIEVE AND MAINTAIN OPTIMAL HEALTH BY PROVIDING TRANSITIONAL 8 ASSISTANCE TO PROVIDERS; TO SPECIFY THE INFORMATION THAT 9 APPLICANTS FOR GRANTS MUST SUBMIT TO THE DEPARTMENT; TO PROVIDE THAT APPLICANTS ARE LIMITED TO ONE APPLICATION PER BUSINESS ENTITY 10 11 AND SUBSIDIARIES OF THE ENTITY ARE NOT ELIGIBLE TO SUBMIT SEPARATE 12 APPLICATIONS; TO PROVIDE THE MAXIMUM AMOUNT OF A GRANT THAT MAY BE 13 AWARDED TO AN APPLICANT; TO PROVIDE THAT THE PROGRAM SHALL BE FUNDED BY APPROPRIATION OF THE LEGISLATURE FROM THE CORONAVIRUS 14 15 STATE FISCAL RECOVERY FUND; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

- 17 SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section, the following terms 18 shall be defined as provided in this subsection:
- (a) "Local health care provider" or "provider" means a 19

- 27 "Transitional assistance" means any assistance (b)
- related to changing a provider's current health care delivery 28
- 29 model to a model more appropriate for the community that the
- 30 provider serves, including, but not limited to:
- Conducting a market study of health care 31 (i)
- 32 services needed and provided in the community;
- 33 (ii) Acquiring and implementing new technological
- tools and infrastructure, including, but not limited to, 34
- telemedicine delivery methods, development of health information 35
- 36 exchange platforms to electronically share medical records,
- 37 electronic health record optimization, purchasing connected
- devices, upgrading digital devices, improving broadband 38

- 41 (iii) Supporting the implementation of population
- 42 health management.
- 43 (2) There is established the COVID-19 Mississippi Local
- Provider Innovation Grant Program to be administered by the State 44
- 45 Department of Health. The program and any grant awarded under the
- program shall be for the purpose of strengthening and improving 46
- 47 the health care system and increasing access to health care
- services providers to help communities achieve and maintain 48
- optimal health by providing transitional assistance to providers. 49

- 50 The department may award an innovation grant to a local health
- 51 care provider that applies in accordance with this section.
- 52 (3) Eligible local health care providers shall provide the
- 53 following information to the department in their application for a
- 54 grant:
- 55 (a) A description of the location or locations for
- 56 which the grant monies will be expended, including the name and
- 57 locations of where the provider administers health care services;
- 58 (b) A statement of the amount of grant monies
- 59 requested;
- 60 (c) A description of the needs of the provider, the
- 61 transitional assistance for which the grant monies will be
- 62 expended and how such transitional assistance will meet the stated
- 63 needs;
- (d) Evidence that the provider has played an active
- 65 role in the community to combat the spread of COVID-19, including,
- 66 but not limited to, testing, vaccination and antibody treatment;
- 67 and
- (e) Any other information that the department deems
- 69 necessary to administer this section.
- 70 (4) Applicants are limited to one (1) application per
- 71 business entity as determined by the applicant's business filing
- 72 status with the Secretary of State. Subsidiaries of the entity
- 73 are not eligible to submit separate applications. Health systems

- 74 that affiliate, own or control multiple clinics are only eligible
- 75 to submit to one (1) application under the parent entity.
- 76 The department shall determine the amount of the grant to be
- 77 awarded to each applicant based on the factors detailed in the
- 78 application, with the maximum amount of a grant that may be
- 79 awarded to an applicant being Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars
- 80 (\$250,000.00).
- 81 (5) The COVID-19 Mississippi Local Provider Innovation Grant
- 82 Program created under this section shall be funded by
- 83 appropriation of the Legislature from the Coronavirus State Fiscal
- 84 Recovery Fund, not to exceed a total of Fifty-five Million Dollars
- (\$55,000,000.00) for the program.
- 86 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 87 and after July 1, 2022.
