## COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 821

1	AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 41-59-3, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO
2	DEFINE NONTRANSPORT EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES; TO AMEND SECTION
3	41-59-35, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE THE STATE
4	DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND MISSISSIPPI INSURANCE DEPARTMENT TO
5	DEVELOP A COORDINATED ENTITY TO PROVIDE A STATEWIDE SYSTEM OF
6	NONTRANSPORT EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
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7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

- 8 **SECTION 1.** Section 41-59-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 9 amended as follows:
- 10 41-59-3. As used in this chapter, unless the context
- 11 otherwise requires, the term:
- 12 (a) "Ambulance" means any privately or publicly owned
- 13 land or air vehicle that is especially designed, constructed,
- 14 modified or equipped to be used, maintained and operated upon the
- 15 streets, highways or airways of this state to assist persons who
- 16 are sick, injured, wounded, or otherwise incapacitated or

- 17 helpless;
- 18 (b) "Permit" means an authorization issued for an
- 19 ambulance vehicle and/or a special use EMS vehicle as meeting the
- 20 standards adopted under this chapter;

21 (0	<b>C)</b>	"License"	means	an	authorization	to	anv	person,
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- 22 firm, corporation, or governmental division or agency to provide
- 23 ambulance services in the State of Mississippi;
- 24 (d) "Emergency medical technician" means an individual
- 25 who possesses a valid emergency medical technician's certificate
- 26 issued under the provisions of this chapter or who has a privilege
- 27 to practice under the Emergency Medical Services Personnel
- 28 Licensure Interstate Compact;
- (e) "Certificate" means official acknowledgment that an
- 30 individual has successfully completed (i) the recommended basic
- 31 emergency medical technician training course referred to in this
- 32 chapter which entitles that individual to perform the functions
- 33 and duties of an emergency medical technician, or (ii) the
- 34 recommended medical first responder training course referred to in
- 35 this chapter which entitles that individual to perform the
- 36 functions and duties of a medical first responder;
- 37 (f) "Board" means the State Board of Health;
- 38 (g) "Department" means the State Department of Health,
- 39 Division of Emergency Medical Services;
- 40 (h) "Executive officer" means the Executive Officer of
- 41 the State Board of Health, or his designated representative;
- 42 (i) "First responder" means a person who uses a limited
- 43 amount of equipment to perform the initial assessment of and
- 44 intervention with sick, wounded or otherwise incapacitated
- 45 persons;

46	(j) "Medical first responder" means a person who uses a
47	limited amount of equipment to perform the initial assessment of
48	and intervention with sick, wounded or otherwise incapacitated
49	persons who (i) is trained to assist other EMS personnel by
50	successfully completing, and remaining current in refresher
51	training in accordance with, an approved "First Responder:
52	National Standard Curriculum" training program, as developed and
53	promulgated by the United States Department of Transportation;
54	(ii) is nationally registered as a first responder by the National
55	Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians; and (iii) is certified
56	as a medical first responder by the State Department of Health,

- (k) "Invalid vehicle" means any privately or publicly owned land or air vehicle that is maintained, operated and used only to transport persons routinely who are convalescent or otherwise nonambulatory and do not require the service of an emergency medical technician while in transit;
- (1) "Special use EMS vehicle" means any privately or
  publicly owned land, water or air emergency vehicle used to
  support the provision of emergency medical services. These
  vehicles shall not be used routinely to transport patients;
- 67 (m) "Trauma care system" or "trauma system" means a
  68 formally organized arrangement of health care resources that has
  69 been designated by the department by which major trauma victims
  70 are triaged, transported to and treated at trauma care facilities;

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- 71 (n) "Trauma care facility" or "trauma center" means a
- 72 hospital located in the State of Mississippi or a Level I trauma
- 73 care facility or center located in a state contiguous to the State
- 74 of Mississippi that has been designated by the department to
- 75 perform specified trauma care services within a trauma care system
- 76 pursuant to standards adopted by the department;
- 77 (o) "Trauma registry" means a collection of data on
- 78 patients who receive hospital care for certain types of injuries.
- 79 Such data are primarily designed to ensure quality trauma care and
- 80 outcomes in individual institutions and trauma systems, but have
- 81 the secondary purpose of providing useful data for the
- 82 surveillance of injury morbidity and mortality;
- (p) "Emergency medical condition" means a medical
- 84 condition manifesting itself by acute symptoms of sufficient
- 85 severity, including severe pain, psychiatric disturbances and/or
- 86 symptoms of substance abuse, such that a prudent layperson who
- 87 possesses an average knowledge of health and medicine could
- 88 reasonably expect the absence of immediate medical attention to
- 89 result in placing the health of the individual (or, with respect
- 90 to a pregnant woman, the health of the woman or her unborn child)
- 91 in serious jeopardy, serious impairment to bodily functions, or
- 92 serious dysfunction of any bodily organ or part;
- 93 (q) "Emergency medical call" means a situation that is
- 94 presumptively classified at time of dispatch to have a high index
- 95 of probability that an emergency medical condition or other

96	situation exists that requires medical intervention as soon as
97	possible to reduce the seriousness of the situation, or when the
98	exact circumstances are unknown, but the nature of the request is
99	suggestive of a true emergency where a patient may be at risk;

- (r) "Emergency response" means responding immediately at the basic life support or advanced life support level of service to an emergency medical call. An immediate response is one in which the ambulance supplier begins as quickly as possible to take the steps necessary to respond to the call;
- 105 (s) "Emergency mode" means an ambulance or special use
  106 EMS vehicle operating with emergency lights and warning siren (or
  107 warning siren and air horn) while engaged in an emergency medical
  108 call.
  - (t) "Nontransport emergency medical services" (NTEMS)

    means the provision of initial assessment and medical intervention

    with sick, wounded or otherwise incapacitated persons, performed

    by a medically trained person or team of persons, prior to the

    availability of and intervention by an ambulance service. NTEMS

    are typically rendered at the location of first contact with a

    patient, and do not include transportation and care during transit

    to a medical facility, NTEMS providers are "EMS personnel" as

    referenced in the provisions of Chapters 59 and 60, Title 41 upon

    meeting the training and certification requirements for emergency

    medical technicians.

- 122 41-59-35. (1) An emergency medical technician certificate 123 so issued shall be valid for a period not exceeding two (2) years 124 from the date of issuance and may be renewed upon payment of a 125 renewal fee to be fixed by the board, which shall be paid to the 126 board, provided that the holder meets the qualifications set forth in this Chapter 59 and Chapter 60 and rules and regulations 127 128 promulgated by the board. Any increase in the fee charged by the 129 board under this subsection shall be in accordance with the provisions of Section 41-3-65. 130
- 131 (2) The board is authorized to suspend or revoke a

  132 certificate so issued at any time it is determined that the holder

  133 no longer meets the prescribed qualifications.
- 134 It shall be unlawful for any person, corporation or 135 association to, in any manner, represent himself, herself or 136 itself as an Emergency Medical Technician-Basic, Emergency Medical Technician-Advanced, Emergency Medical Technician-Paramedic, 137 138 Emergency Medical Technician-Paramedic Critical Care, or Emergency 139 Medical Services Driver, or use in connection with his or its name 140 the words or letters of EMT, emt, paramedic, critical care 141 paramedic, or any other letters, words, abbreviations or insignia 142 which would indicate or imply that he, she or it is an Emergency Medical Technician-Basic, Emergency Medical Technician-Advanced, 143 Emergency Medical Technician-Paramedic, Emergency Medical 144

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- 146 Driver, unless certified in accordance with Chapters 59 and 60 of
- 147 this title and in accordance with the rules and regulations
- 148 promulgated by the board; or a person who has a privilege to
- 149 practice under the Emergency Medical Services Personnel Licensure
- 150 Interstate Compact. It shall be unlawful to employ an uncertified
- 151 Emergency Medical Technician-Basic, Emergency Medical
- 152 Technician-Advanced, Emergency Medical Technician-Paramedic, or
- 153 Emergency Medical Technician-Paramedic Critical Care to provide
- 154 basic or advanced life-support services.
- 155 (4) The department may develop, in conjunction with the
- 156 Mississippi Insurance Department, a coordinated entity to provide
- 157 a statewide system of nontransport emergency medical services for
- 158 emergency medical personnel governed by the Division of Emergency
- 159 Medical Services that includes medical control protocols, a
- 160 quality management system, charting platform and data reporting
- 161 system.
- 162 (\* \* \*5) An EMT, EMT-A, EMR, or Paramedic may transport a
- 163 police dog injured in the line of duty to a veterinary clinic,
- 164 hospital emergency department or similar facility if there are no
- 165 persons requiring medical attention or transport at that time.
- 166 For the purposes of this subsection, "police dog" means a dog
- 167 owned or used by a law enforcement department or agency in the
- 168 course of the department or agency's work, including a search and
- 169 rescue dog, service dog, accelerant detection canine, or other dog

- 170 that is in use by a county, municipal, or state law enforcement
- 171 agency.
- 172 (\* \* \*6) Any Emergency Medical Technician-Basic, Emergency
- 173 Medical Technician-Advanced, Emergency Medical
- 174 Technician-Paramedic, Emergency Medical Technician-Paramedic
- 175 Critical Care, or Emergency Medical Services Driver who violates
- 176 or fails to comply with these statutes or the rules and
- 177 regulations promulgated by the board under these statutes shall be
- 178 subject, after due notice and hearing, to an administrative fine
- not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00).
- 180 **SECTION 3.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 181 and after July 1, 2022, and shall stand repealed from and after
- 182 June 30, 2022.
